This wasn't any old cat. This was Supercat.

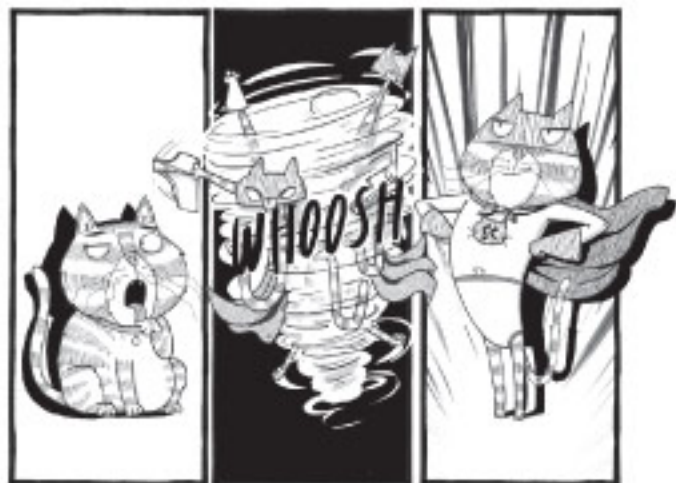
"I wrapped your present with my own fair paws," he said proudly.
