Ellen had chicken pox. She was covered in spots.

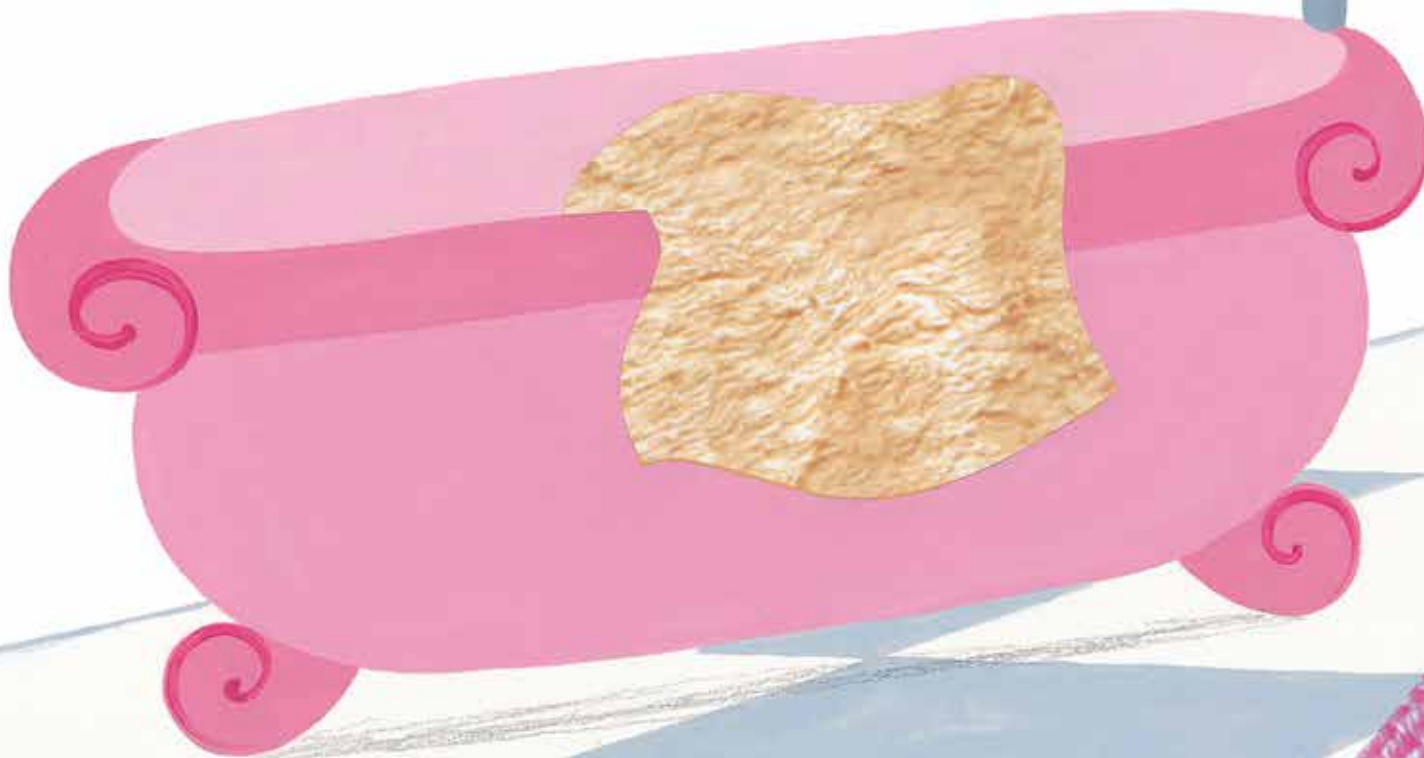
“You mustn’t scratch them!” said Mum.
