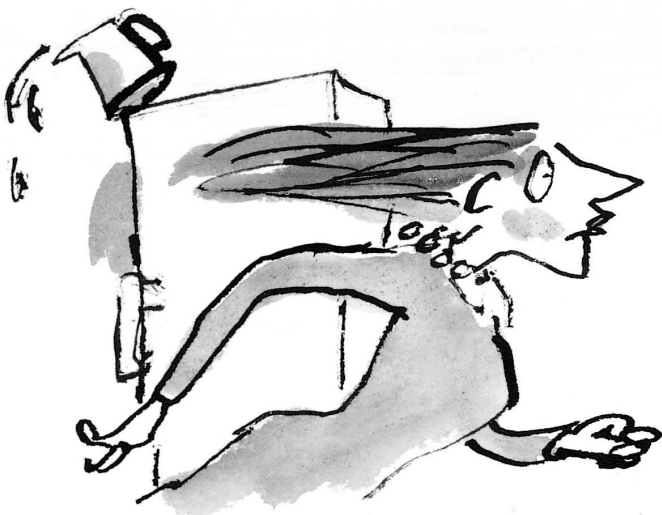
# Chapter One
