But he preferred –

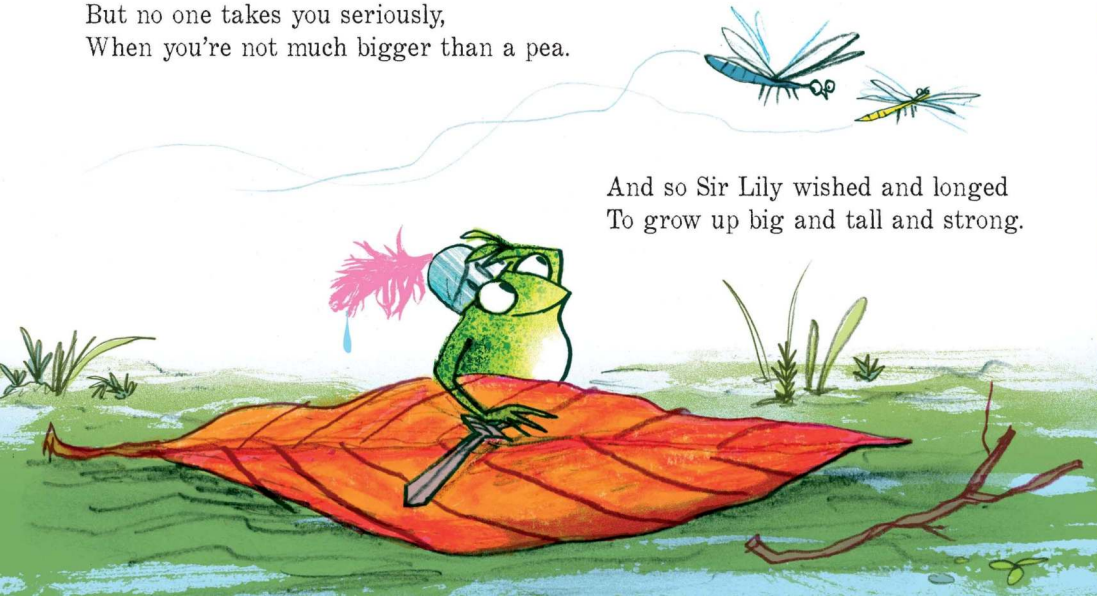
Sir Lilypad!
