
# Don't Pick Your Nose, Pinocchio!




























"Pinocchio," he said.

## Next steps

Show the children the cover again. When they first saw it, did they think that they already knew the story? How is this story different from the traditional story? Which bits are the same?

Pinocchio's nose grew longer whenever he told a lie. Ask the children to pretend to be Pinocchio. Then ask them some silly questions that they can 'lie' about. For example, are you an elephant? Do you live on the moon? If they say 'yes', make them pretend that their noses are growing, using the 'Poiiiing!' noise.

The kind-hearted fairy told Pinocchio not to pick his nose. Why did she say that? Is it a bad thing to pick your nose? Ask the children if they ever pick their noses. Mr Cricket tried hard to help Pinocchio to stop picking his nose. What did he do?

What happened when Mr Cricket hopped onto Pinocchio's finger too late? How did Pinocchio get Mr Cricket out of his nose? What did that teach Pinocchio?

Ask the children to draw a picture of Pinocchio's face and help them to cut a slot where the nose should be. Draw a very long nose on another piece of paper, cut it out, push it through the slot and watch Pinocchio's nose grow!
