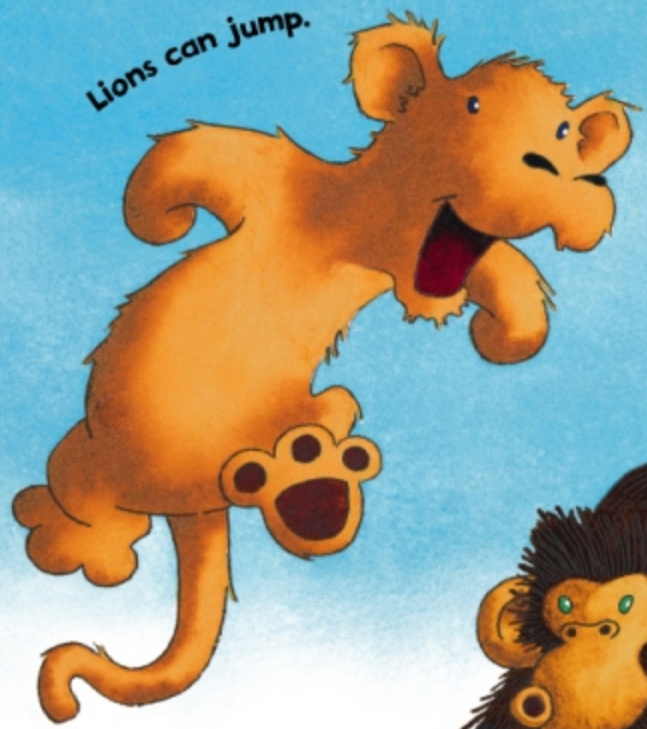

Lions can jump.

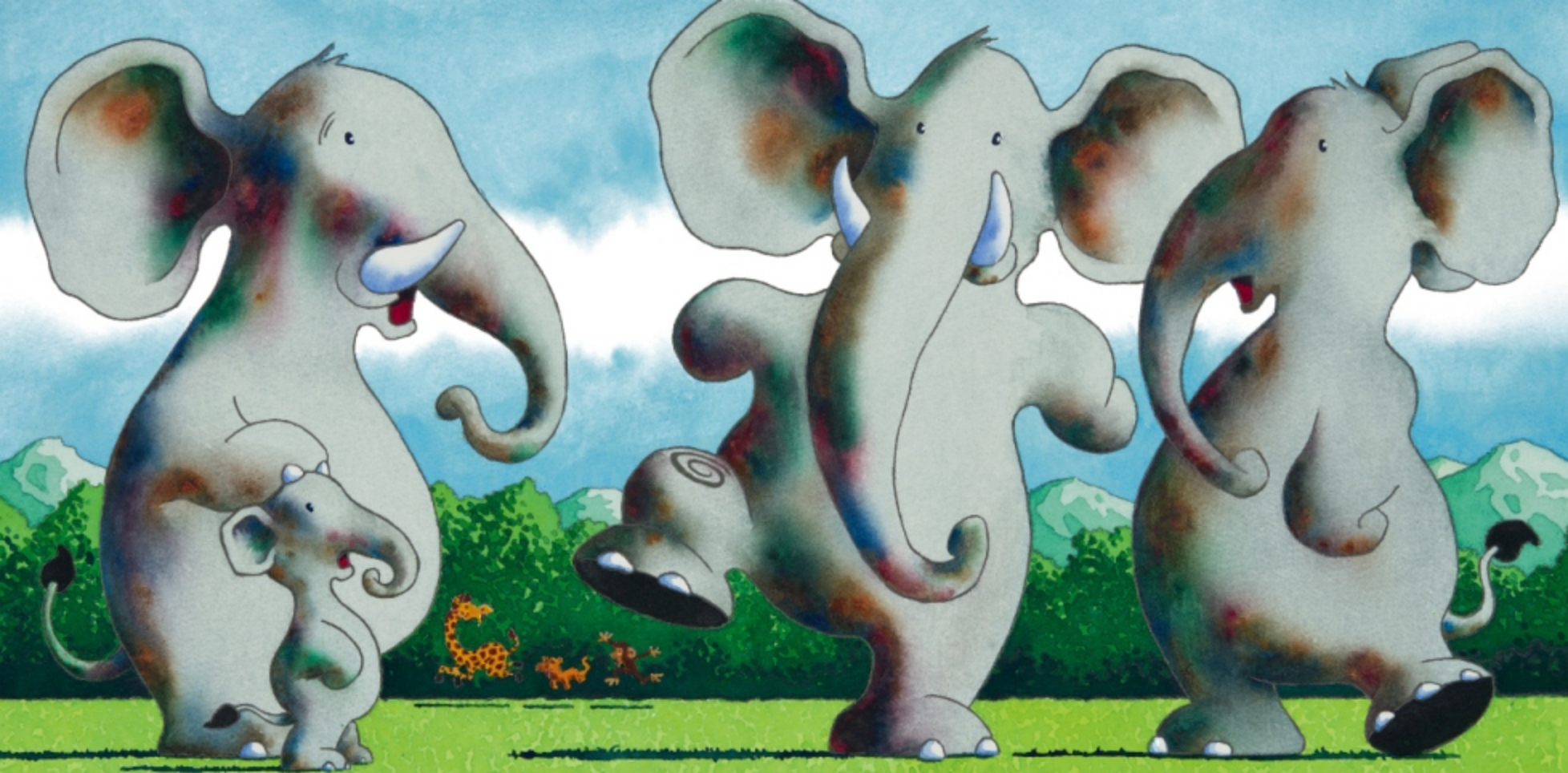


Monkeys can jump.

"Why not?" asked Elephant.

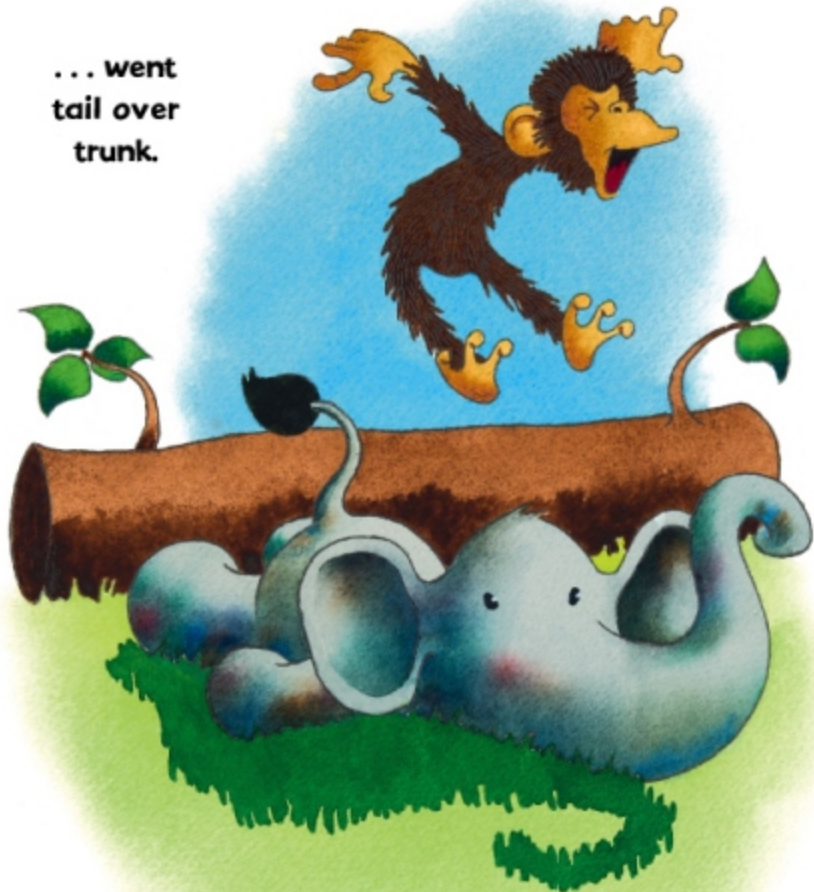
"It's just the way we're made," said his mother.
