# I spy with my creepy eyes...

1. Mantis shrimp This 30 cm shrimp has better eyesight than any other animal.

#### 2. Giant squid

Most animals' eyes are smaller than oranges. But a giant squid's eye is as big as your head.

#### 3. Dragonfly

Dragonflies section off what they see in a grid. They move around the prey in the same section, then grab it.

### 4. Goat

Goats have rectangular pupils. This means that they can see a panoramic 320 to 340 degrees. So they can almost see behind themselves.

#### 5. Stargazer

This fish buries itself in sand, eyes staring up. When prey passes by, it throws 50 killer volts of electricity from its eyes to stun the prey.

#### 6. Reindeer

As the days grow darker in winter, reindeer eyes change colours from gold to blue. Creepy, Rudolph!

### 7. Scallop

Yuck – scallops have 100 eyes around their shells. Remember that the next time you eat some!


### 8. Tarsier

A tarsier's eyes are each as big as its brain. These enormous eyes make the tarsier an epic hunter – useful, since tarsiers refure to eat vegetables.

### 9. Ogre-faced spider



# parasites that TAKE CONTROL of their hosts

Brine shrimp tapeworm The larva of this tapeworm takes over a brine shrimp's brain, turning the shrimp red and making it swim in groups. This makes it more likely to be eaten by a flamingo.

### Horsehair worm

The larva of this worm takes over a cricket's brain and makes it leap into water. The now-grown worm wriggles free as the cricket drowns!

### Tongue-eating isopod

This parasite eats a fish's tongue – and then becomes the tongue! It feeds on the food that the fish catches.

## Zombie fungus

This fungus invades carpenter ants. It bursts out of the ants' heads, then infects other ants in the colony.

#### Emerald cockroach wasp

This wasp injects chemicals into a cockroach's brain. It steers the roach by the antennae, like they're reins! Then the wasp lays its eggs on the roach. The eggs hatch, and the larvae eat the roach alive. Gross!

### Ladybird parasite

This wasp lays its egg in a ladybird's belly. The larva takes over the ladybird's brain. The ladybird – the perfect zombie bodyguard – protects the larva until it becomes an adult!


