warty toad or slimy frog.



Princess Smartypants was just polishing the scales on Polly, her Pollyopticus (one of her favourite pets), when the castle doorbell rang.


Eric let down the drawbridge and a pretty coach containing three would-be Princesses clattered into the castle courtyard.
