





Work backwards around the ring, sticking each hand shape with the fingers covering the palm of the previous hand.

DIAMOND PAPER CHAIN

Use silver and white paper to make your home a paper chain with icepalace glamour.



2 Open out the poper and lay it flat. paper square in half. Leaving a 2cm unout band down the centre, snip 3 straight lines 2cm apart.



Take the two innermost corners and roll them towards each other. Glue the corners to make a tube shape.



Fold a 25 x 25cm silver

following the pattern above.

Turn the paper over Now take the next two corners. roll them towards each other and stick the corners together.



Repeat step 4 until all the corners are glued together.



6 Repeat steps I-5 with silver and white paper to make lots of paper diamonds. Stick or staple them together to form a chain.
