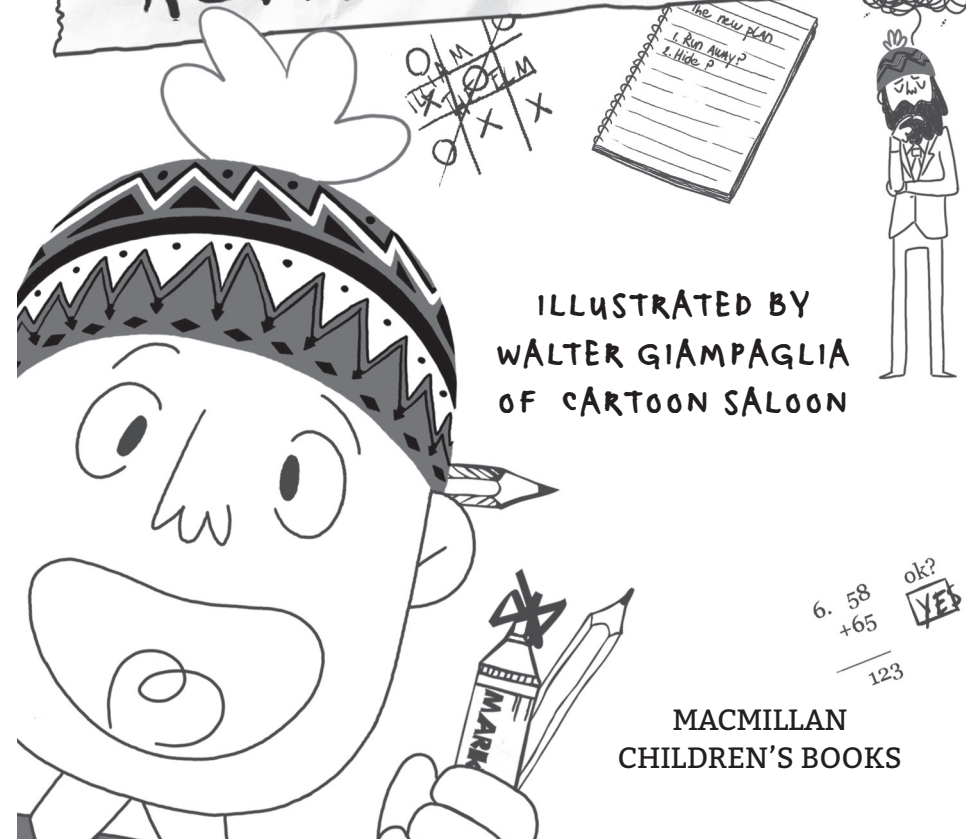

What *doesn't* it do, more like?!



KEEP OUT!

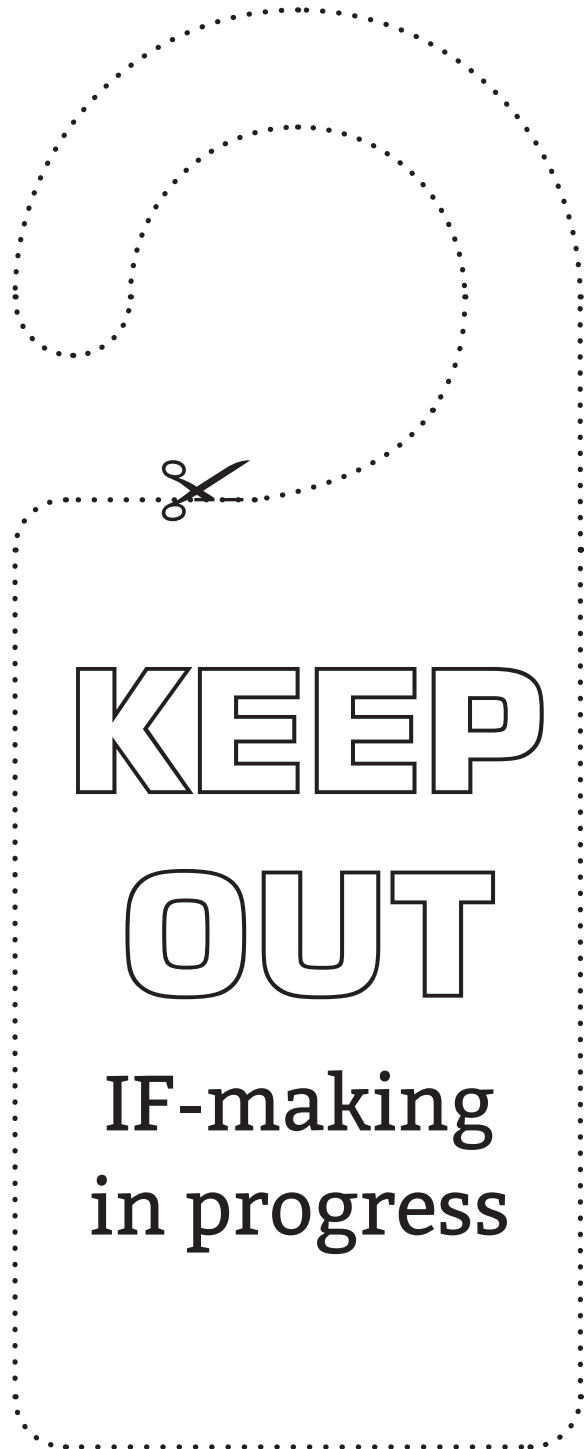


OK, we've got a lot to do and you're going to need to focus. We want no interruptions.

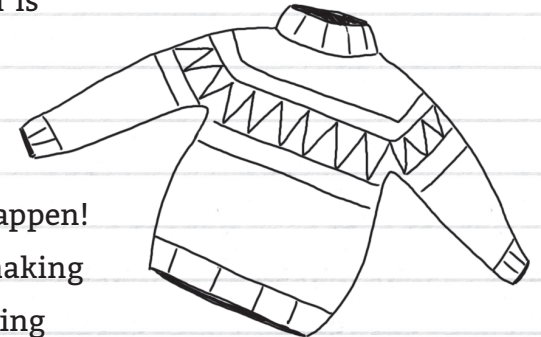
YECTION 1

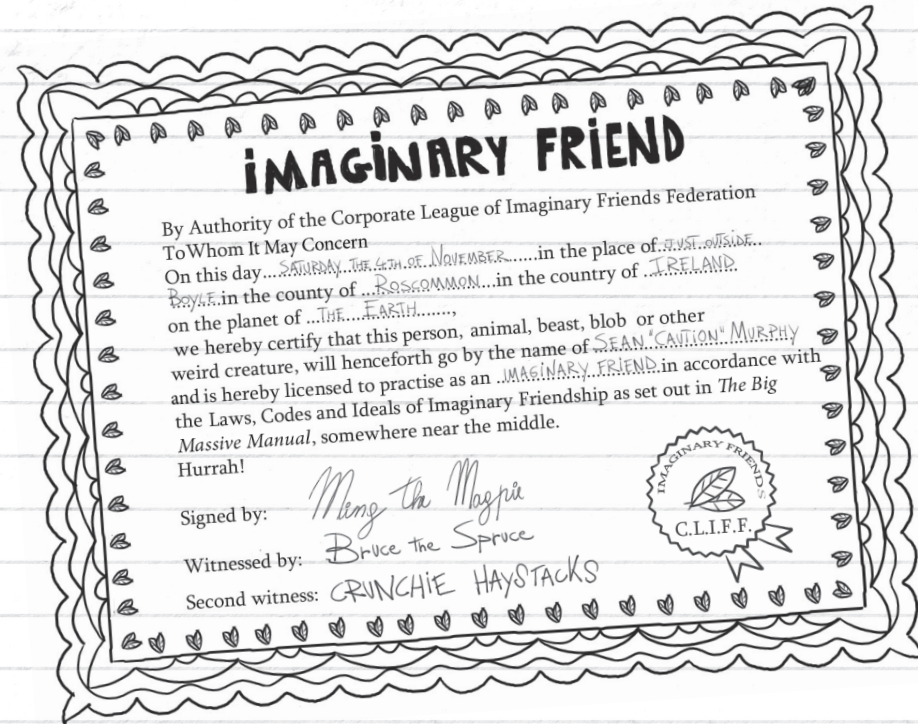
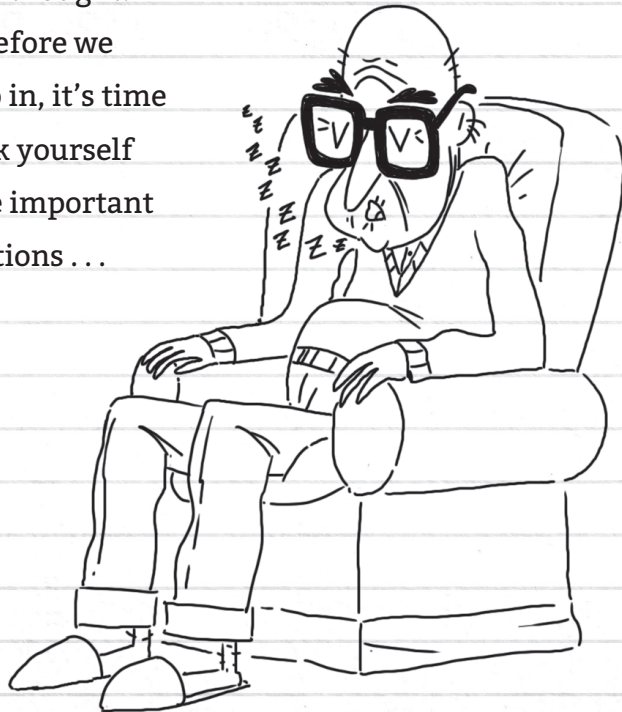
