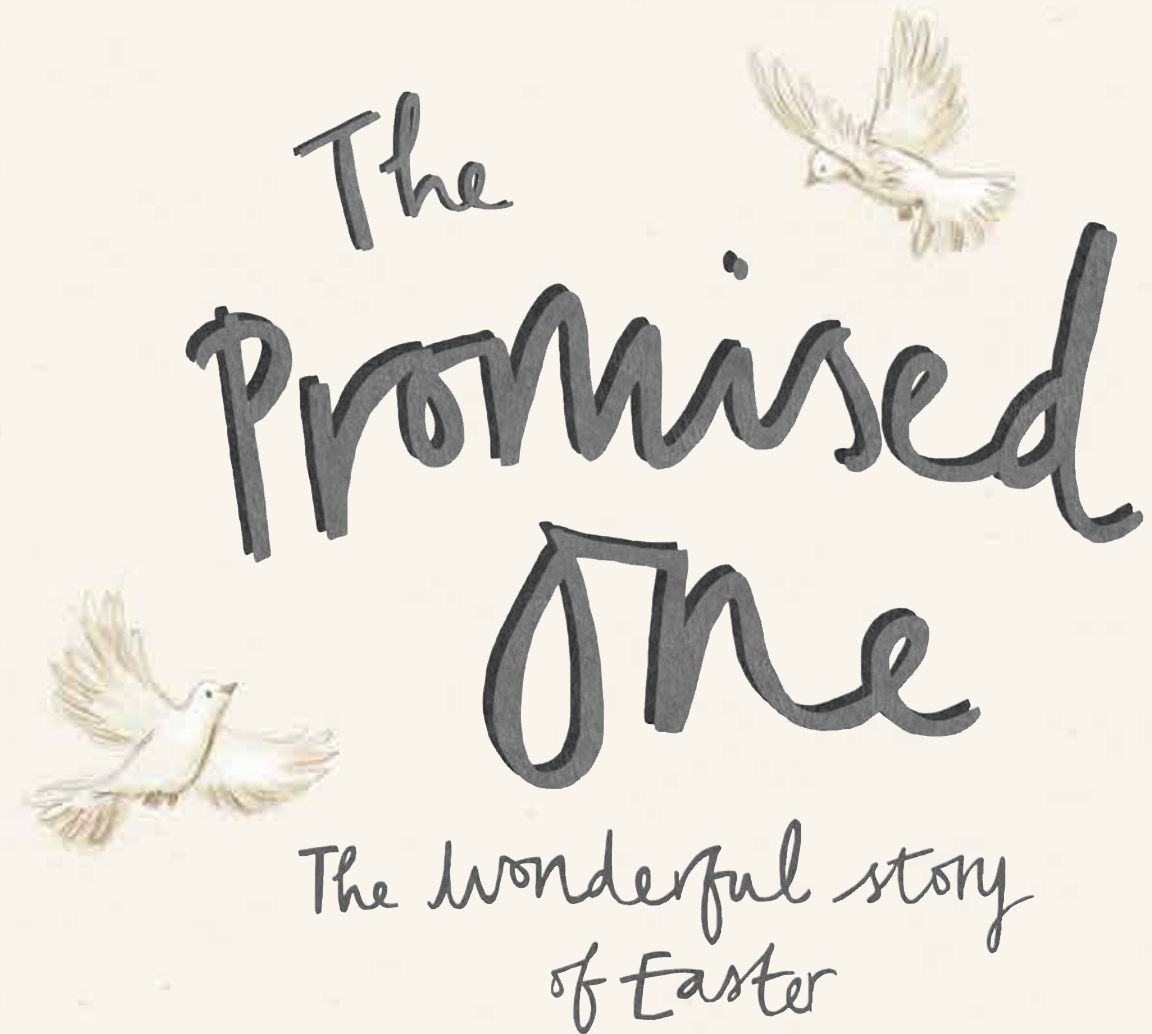

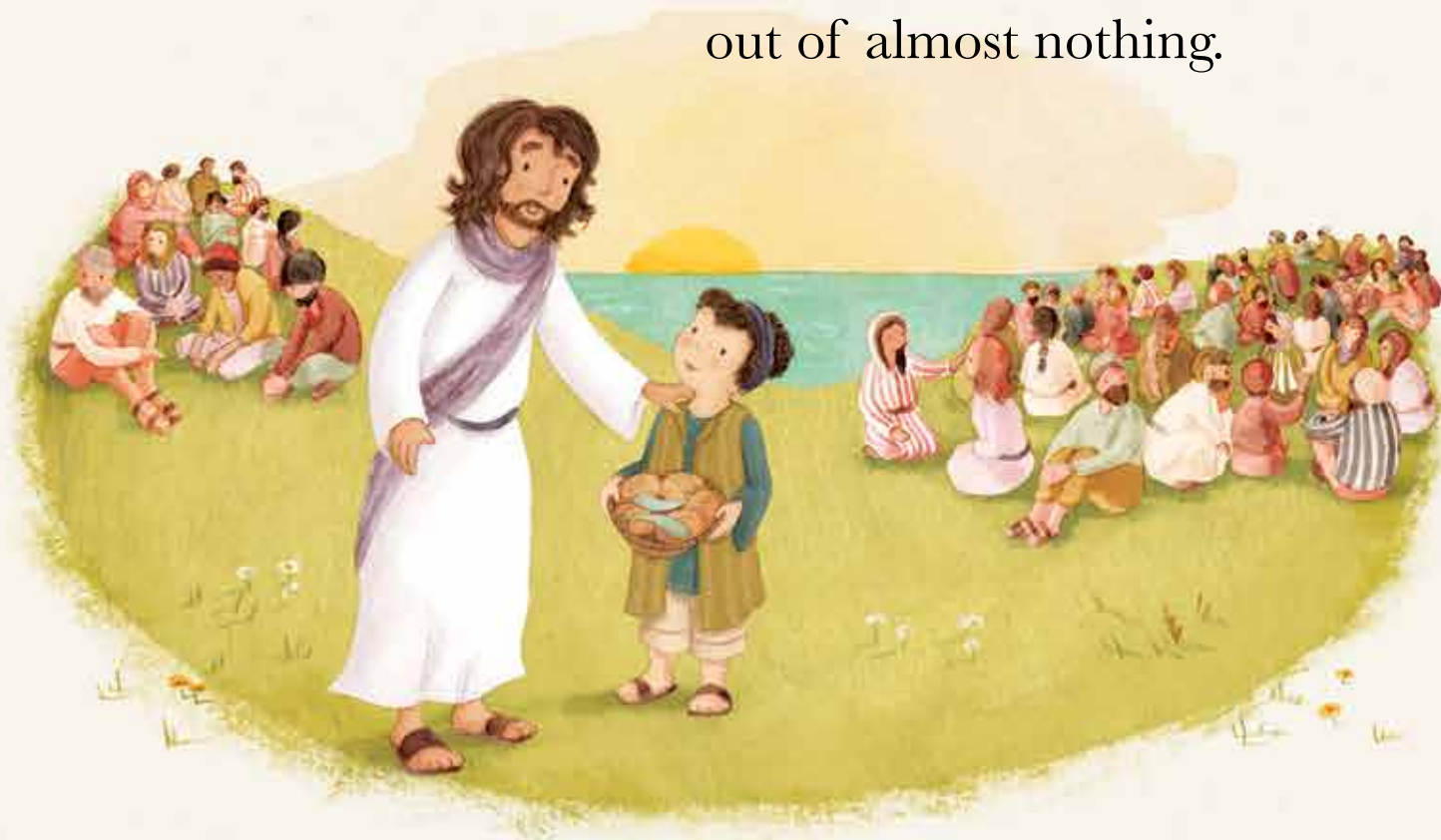

He made sick people well.

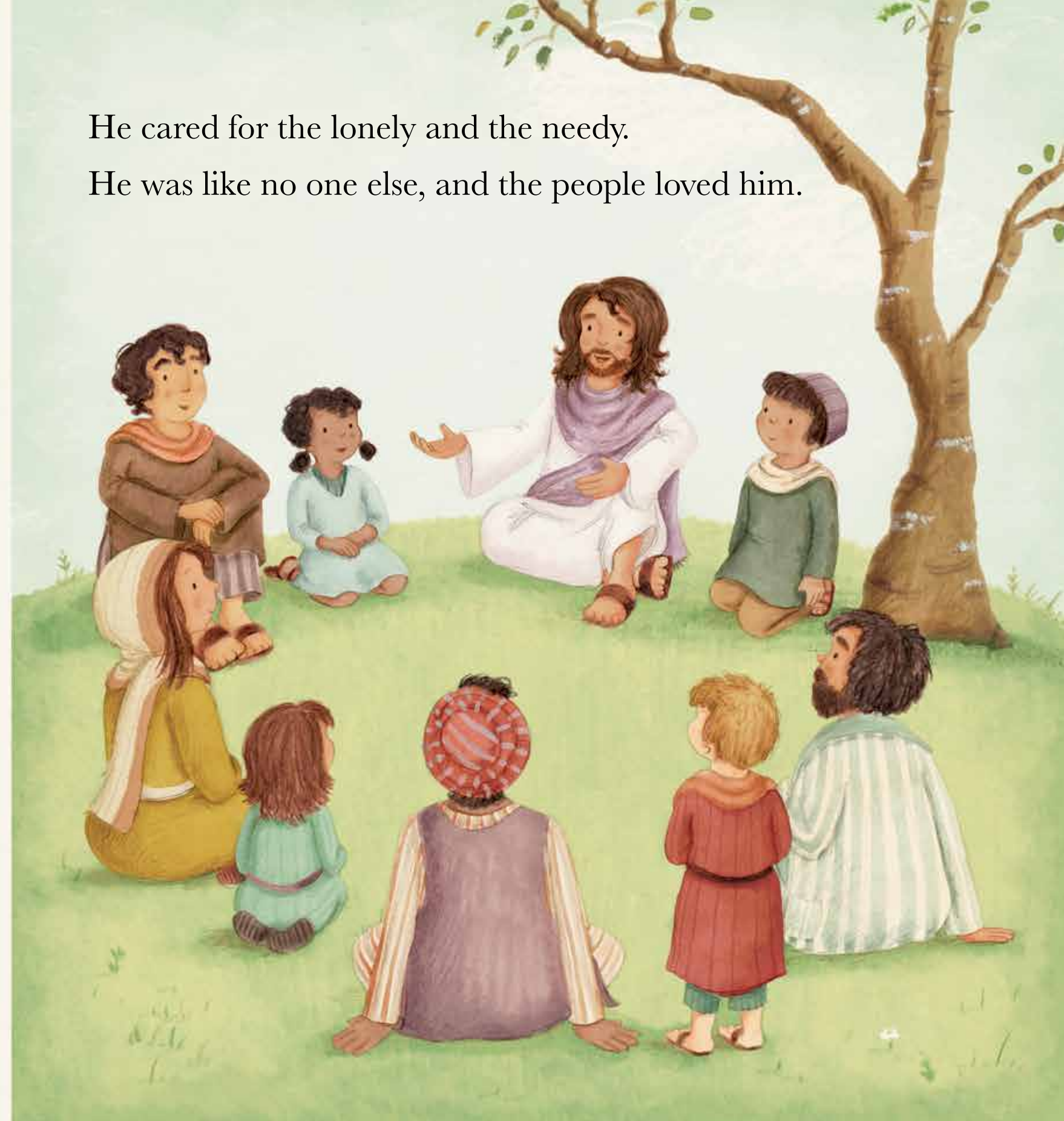


He made food for thousands

“You should be here to meet with God, but you are only here to make money. How dare you turn this special place into an ordinary market!”

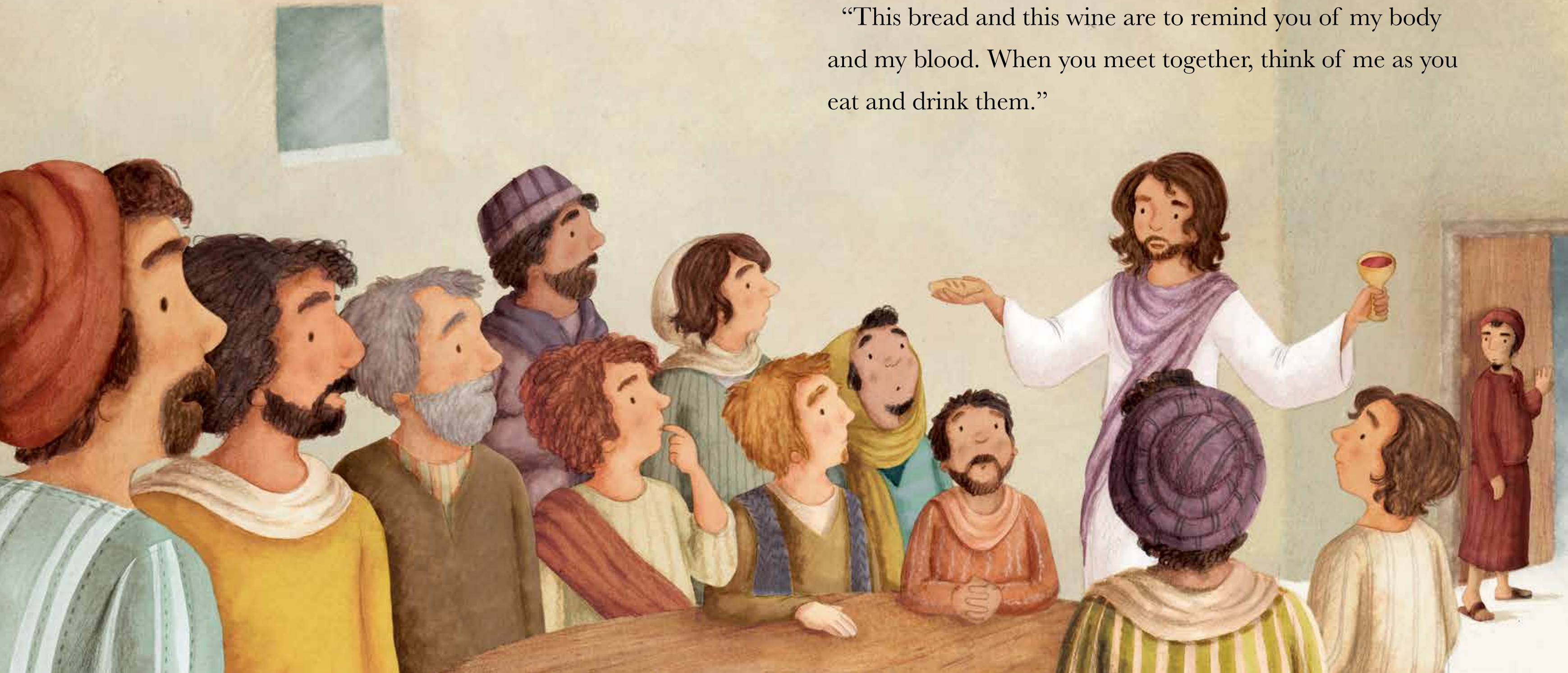
The religious leaders could stand it no longer. Jesus was showing them up! He had to go.



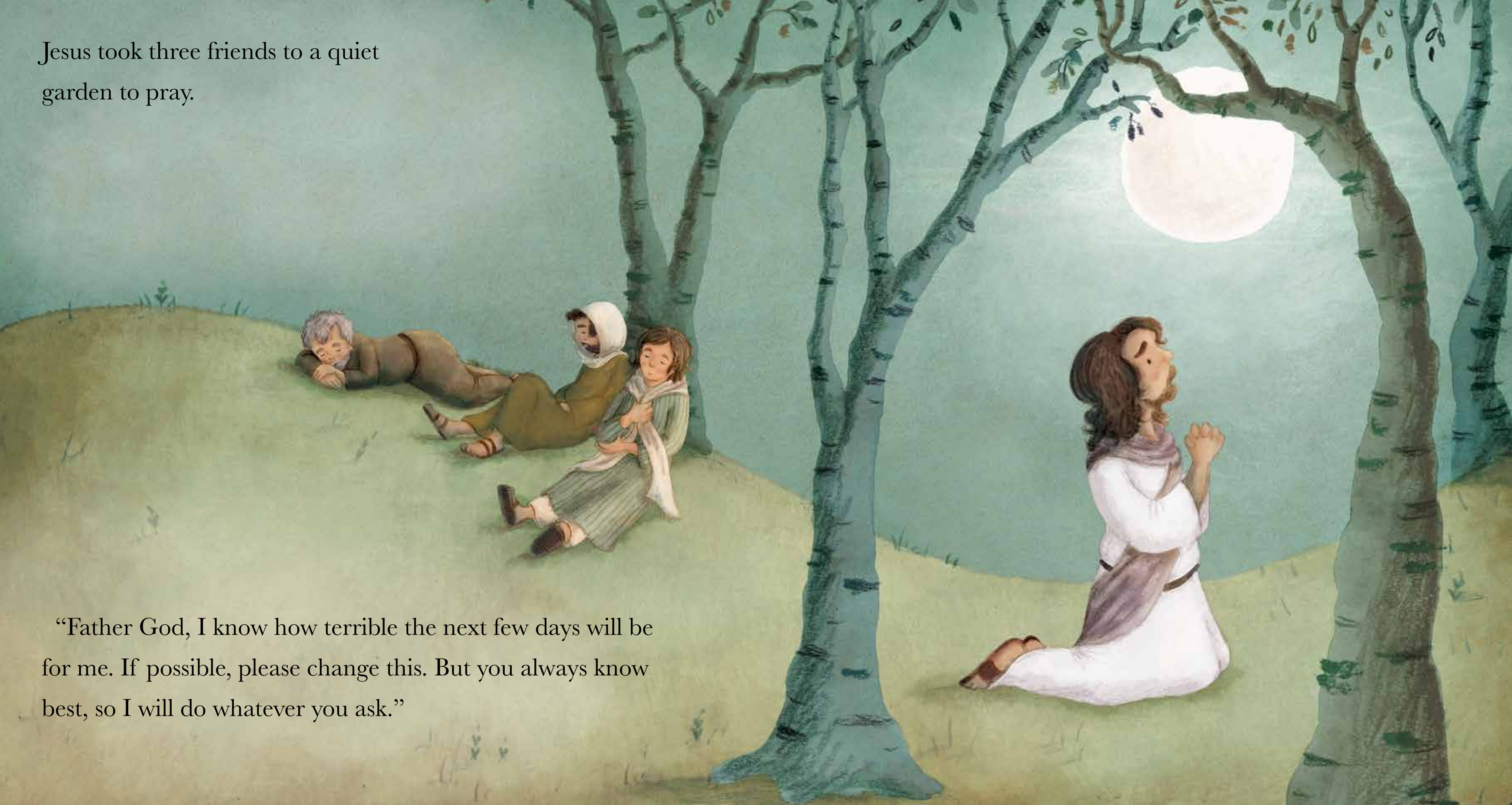
Now, Jesus had twelve close friends who believed with all their hearts that he was God-on-earth, the Promised One they had been waiting for.
