Nobody guessed that a girl there named **Lil**


Was a pirate who'd sailed to new lands.

Yet even a pirate must learn how to read,

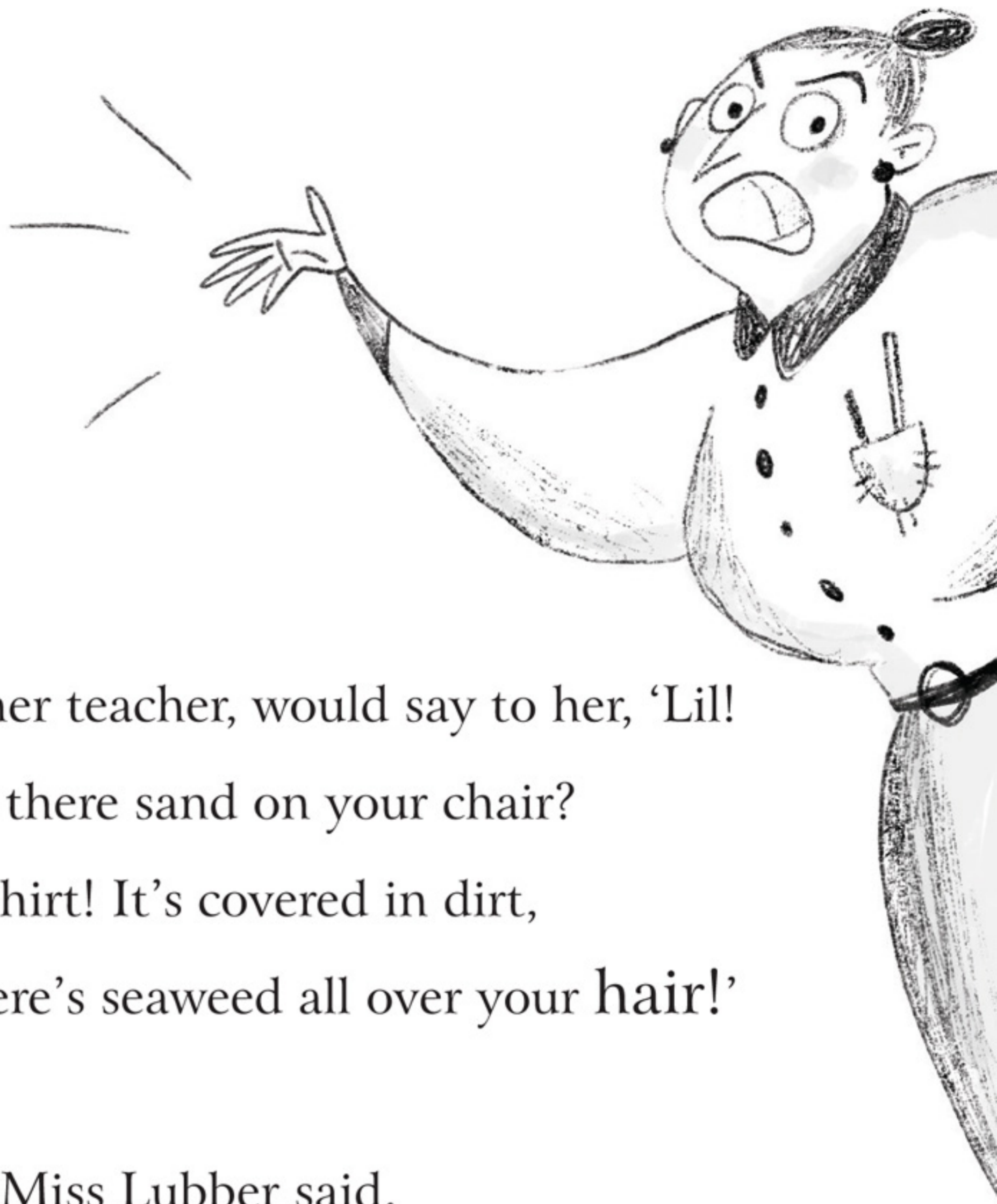
So that is why Lil sat in class.
