Archie's Bag of Treasures



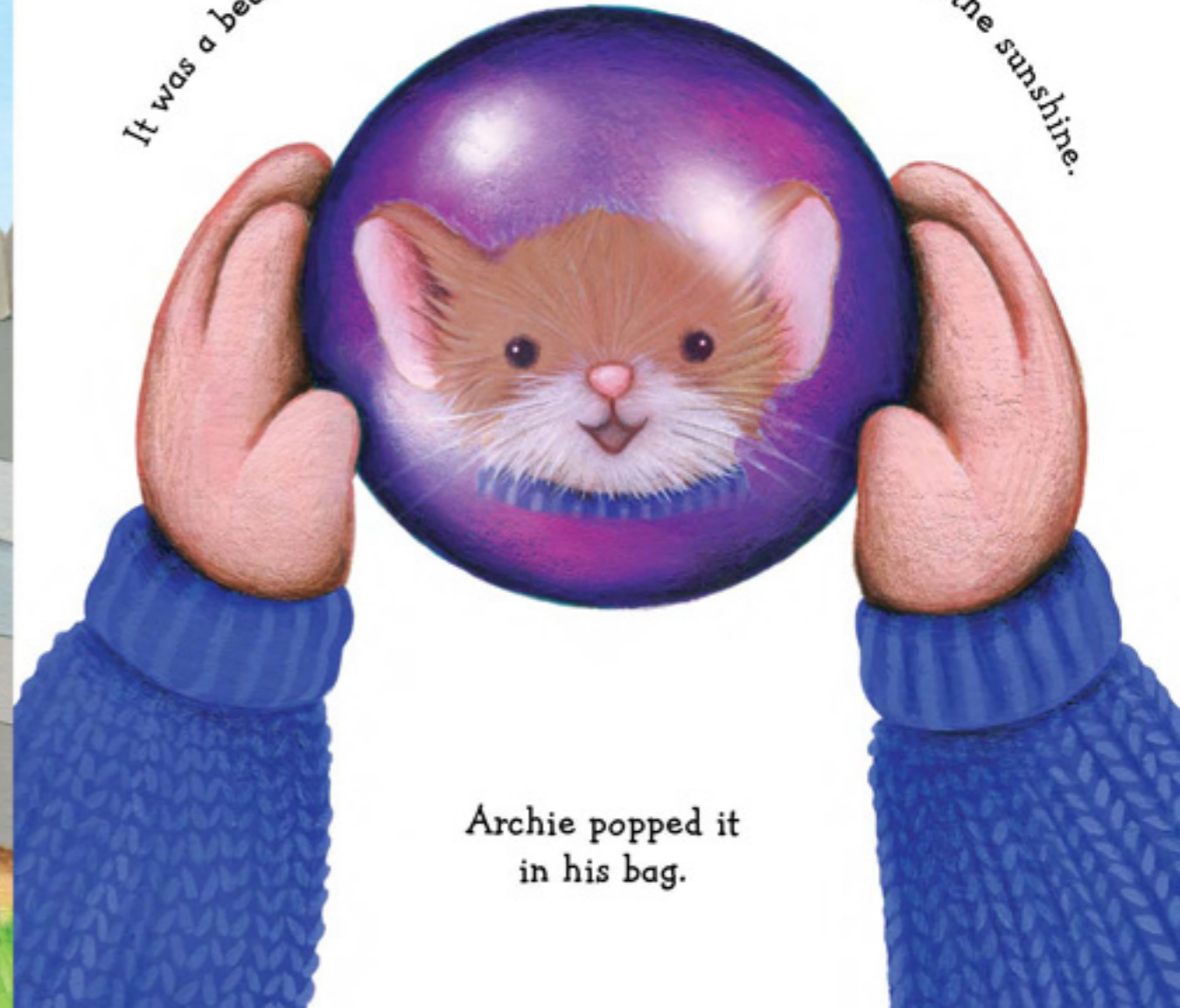
