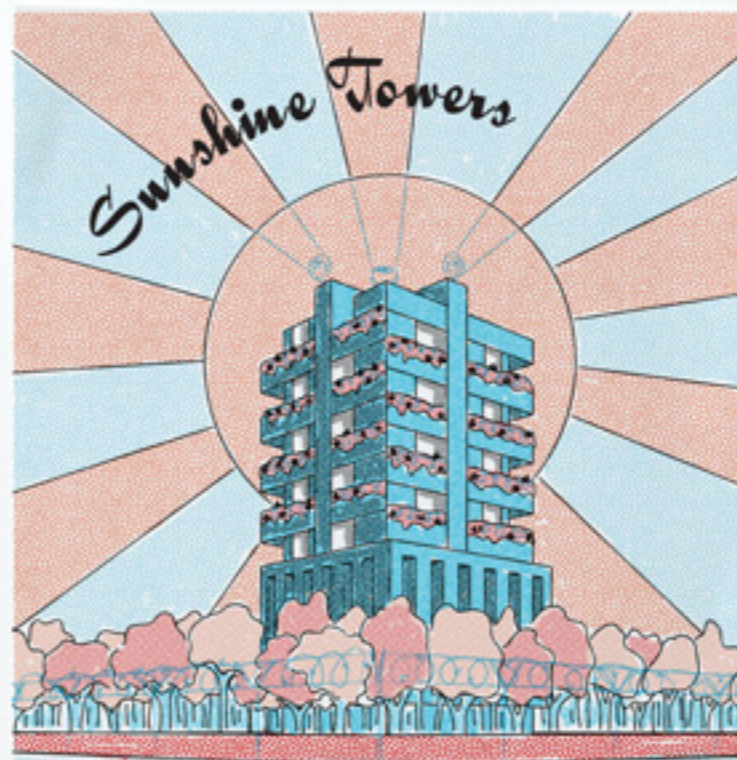

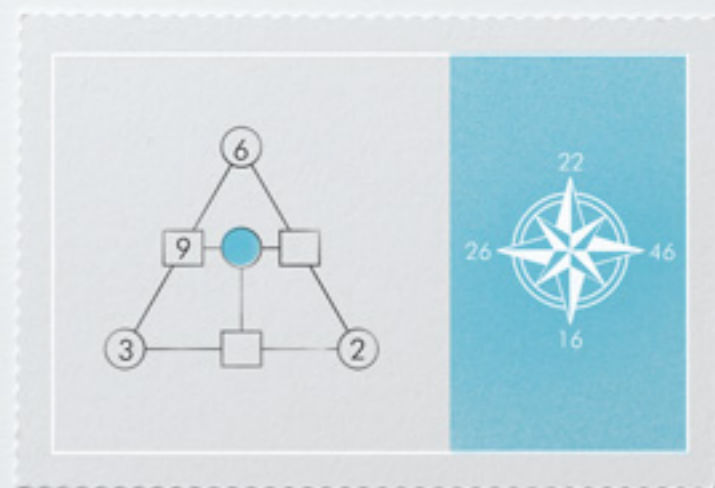


Come for a day, stay forever!

- Find the deed!

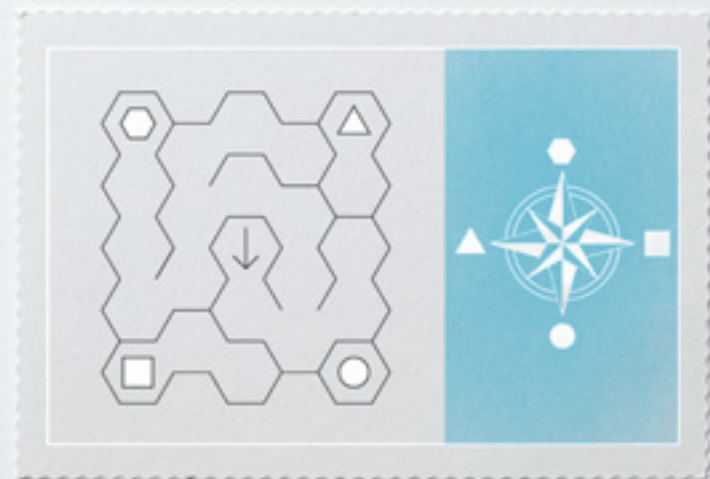
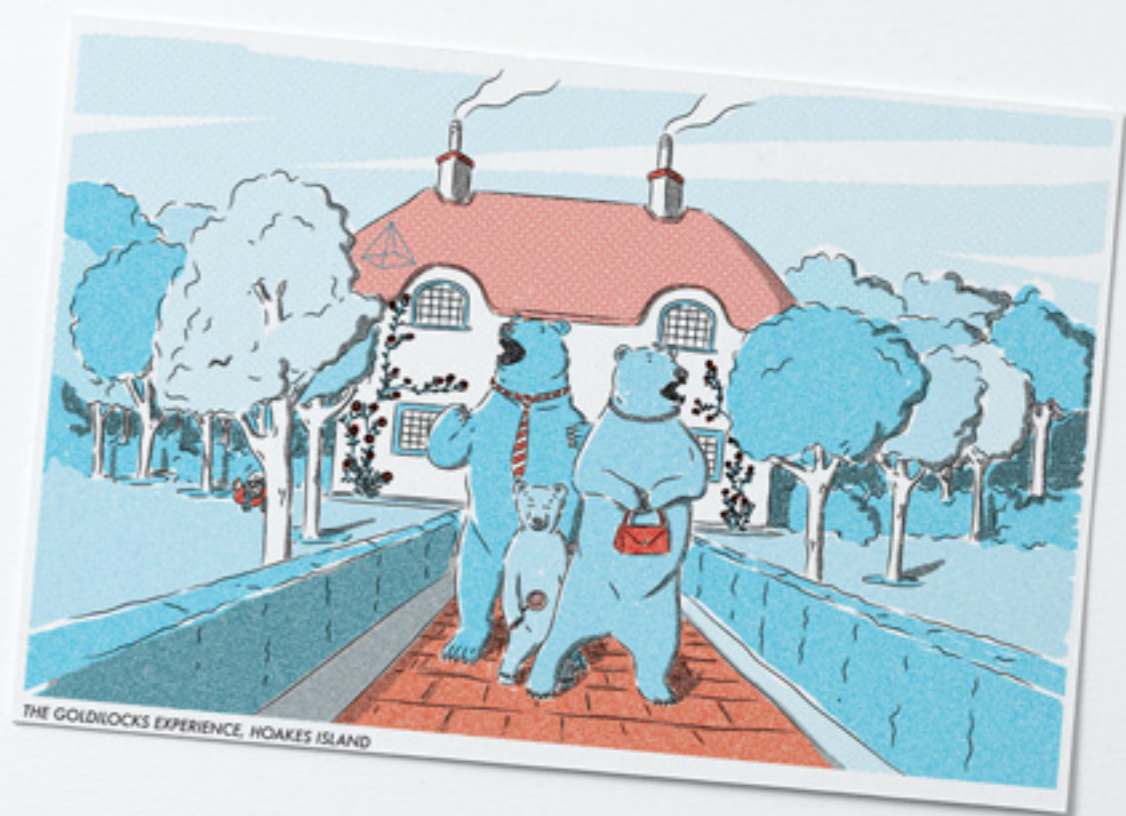
And now, let's get going. The next page we go to is ... Oh help. Got any ideas?

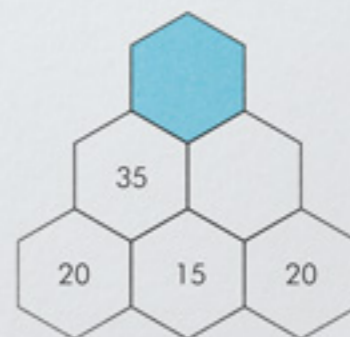

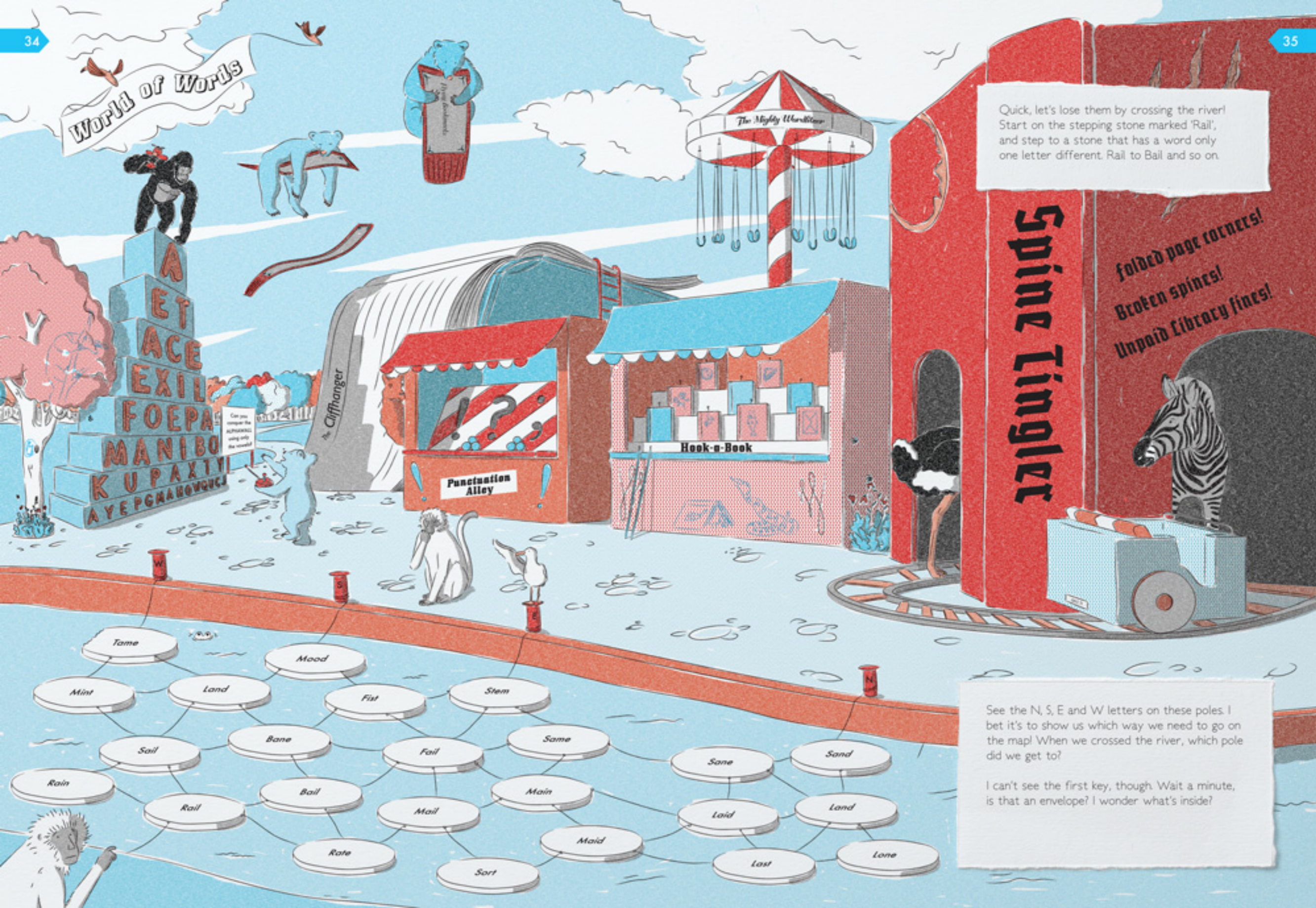

My plan is to build an amusement park on Hoakes Island that will serve as a sanctuary for my friends, but will also give them employment and a sense of purpose.






Rita is the one to lead them - she is not only very clever, she is also terribly good at motivating people.

Of course, there will come a day when I am no longer here. I have made arrangements with my agents on the mainland to keep the animals supplied with food, keep the electricity on, etc. In this way, Granville will not have to wonder where his next banana is coming from, nor will Rita ever fear that she has eaten her last garlic ant.

Speaking of which, I have abandoned the idea of opening an insect sanctuary on Hoakes Island. Rita said all of the right things about it, but leaving an anteater in charge of an ant farm was not wise. She was most sorry afterwards, but not half as sorry as the ants.

Henry's rescued animals were not kept as pets. All of us became his employees and performers at the park. Of course, as far as the public were concerned we were just people dressed up in costumes. 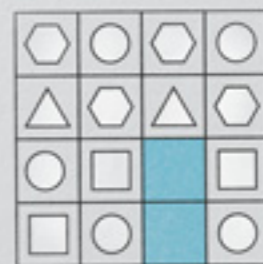

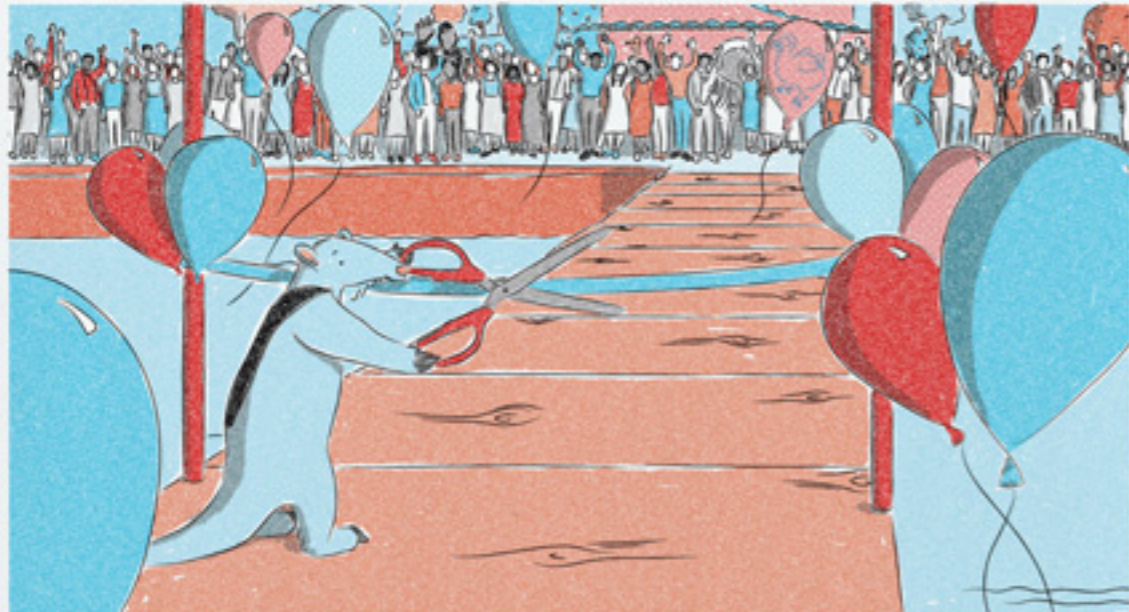
