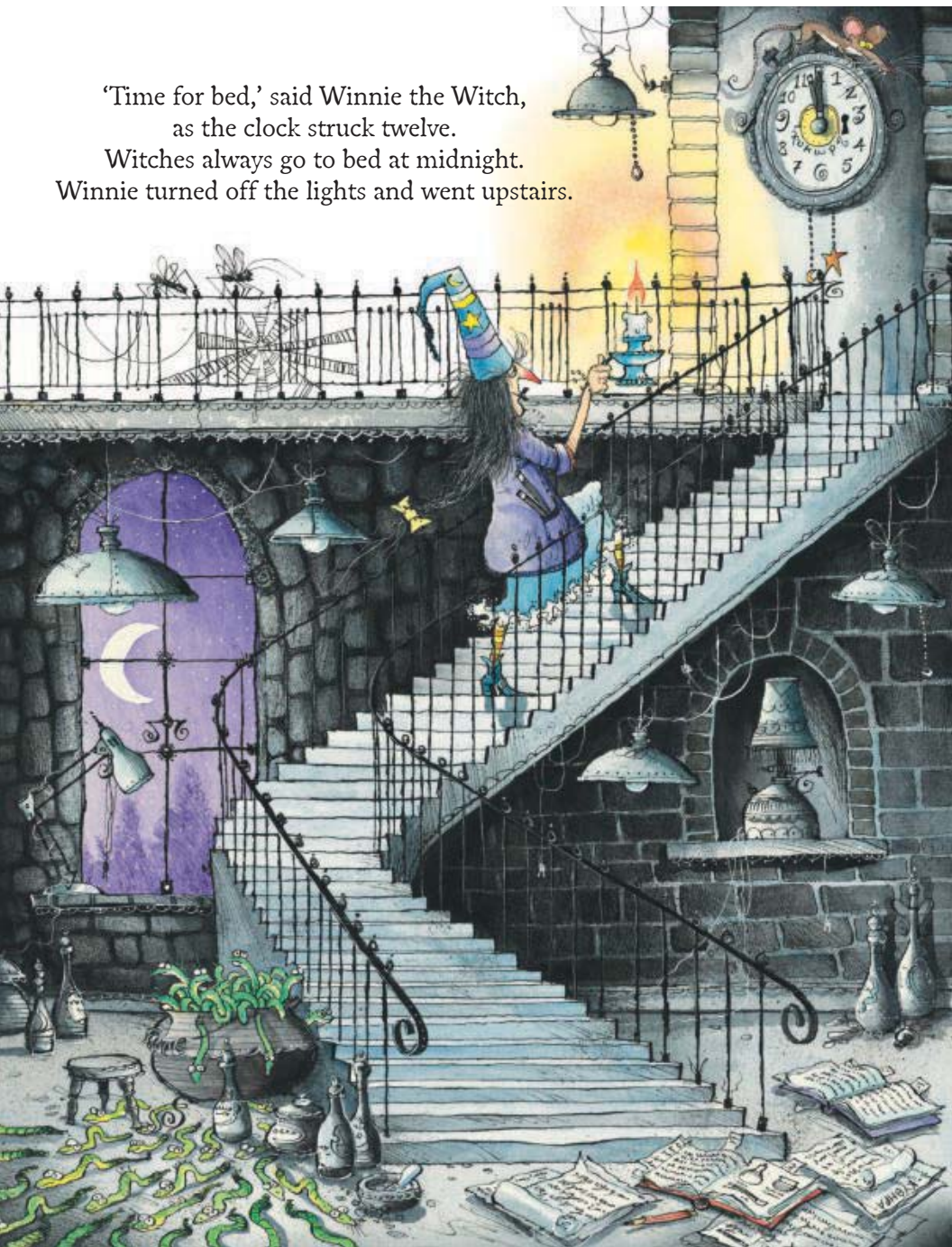
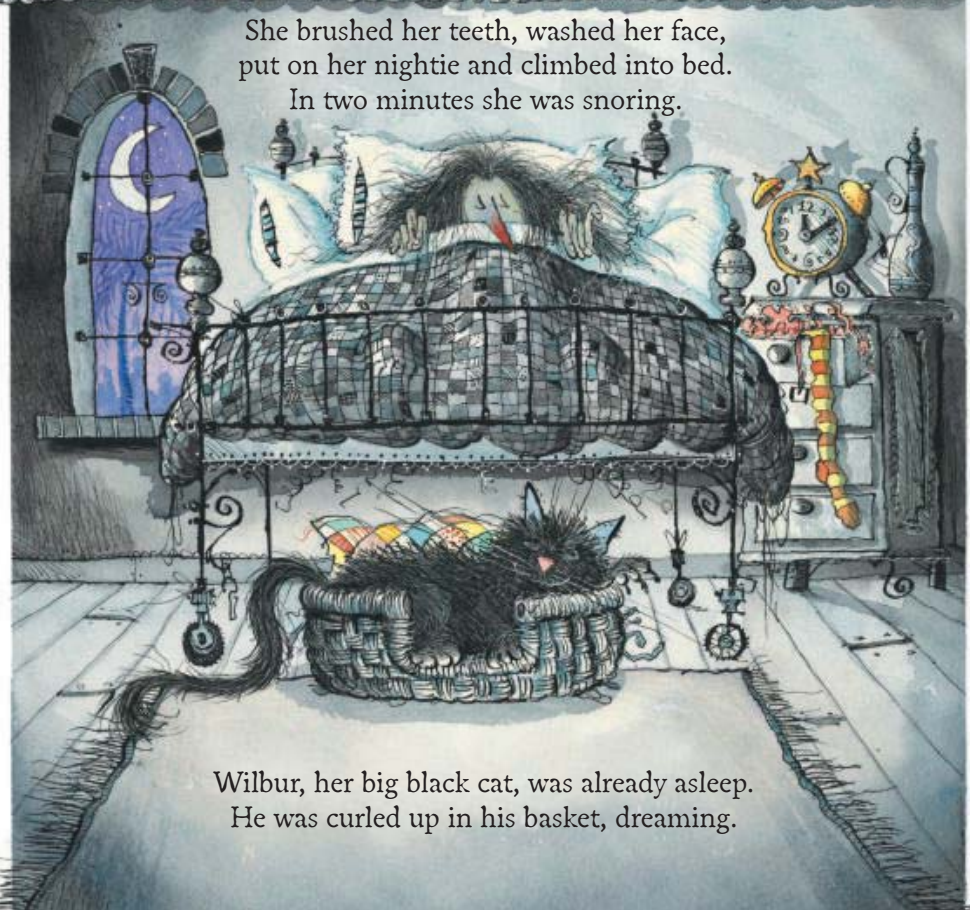


Winnie AND Wilbur

Winnie turned off the lights and went upstairs.

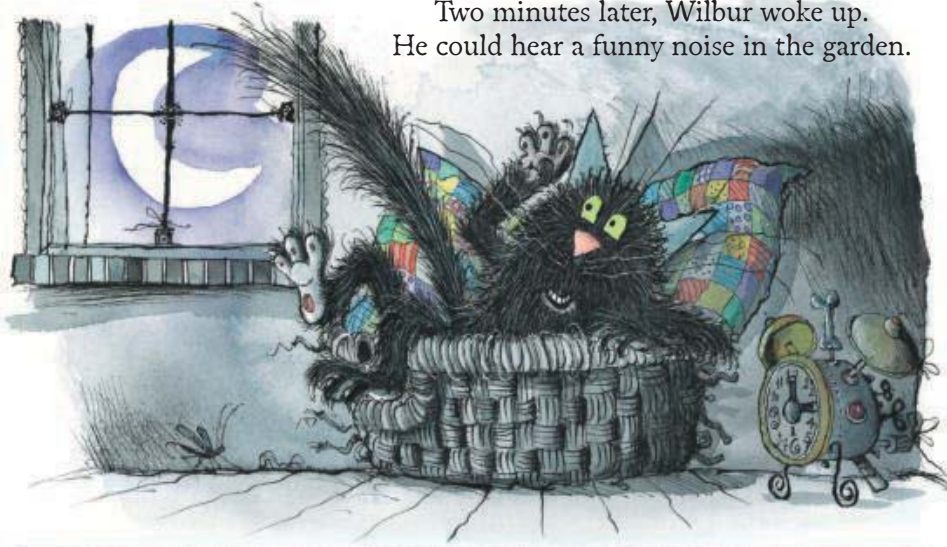


She brushed her teeth, washed her face,

He could hear a funny noise in the garden.

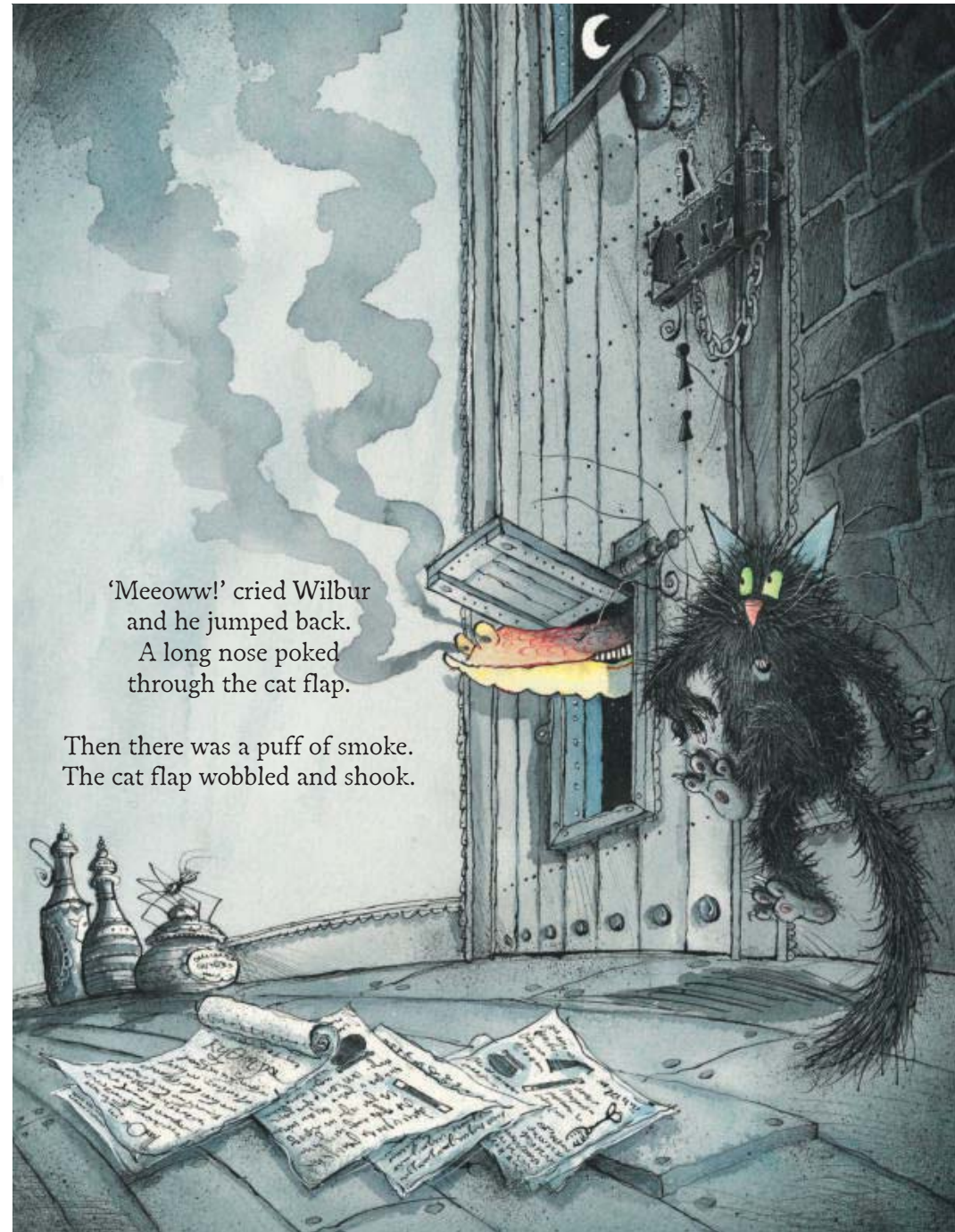


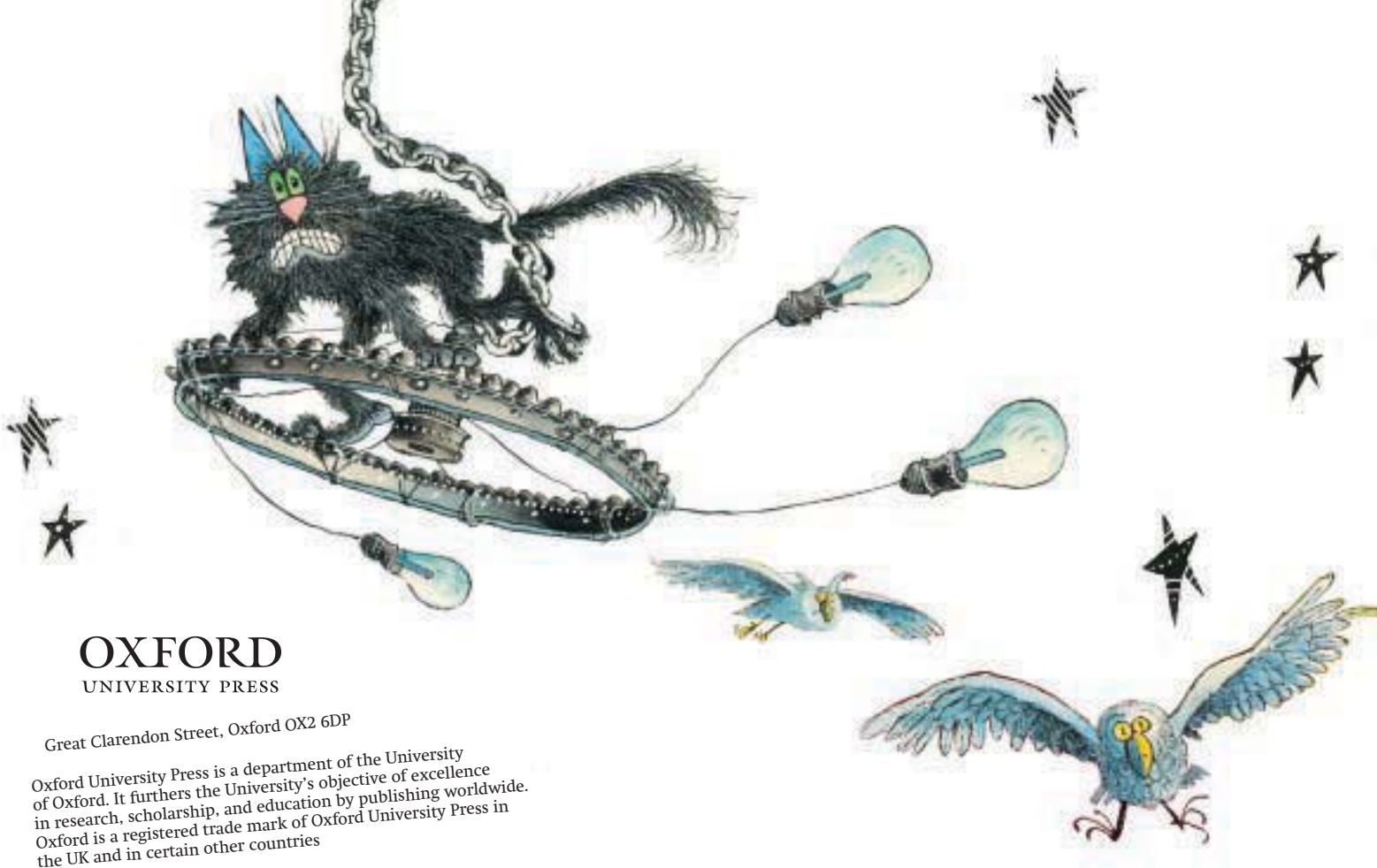
He crept to the cat flap and peeped out.
