She tried to find him – but Growly Bear ended up in the Lost Property Office, hidden behind all the lost umbrellas, hats and gloves.

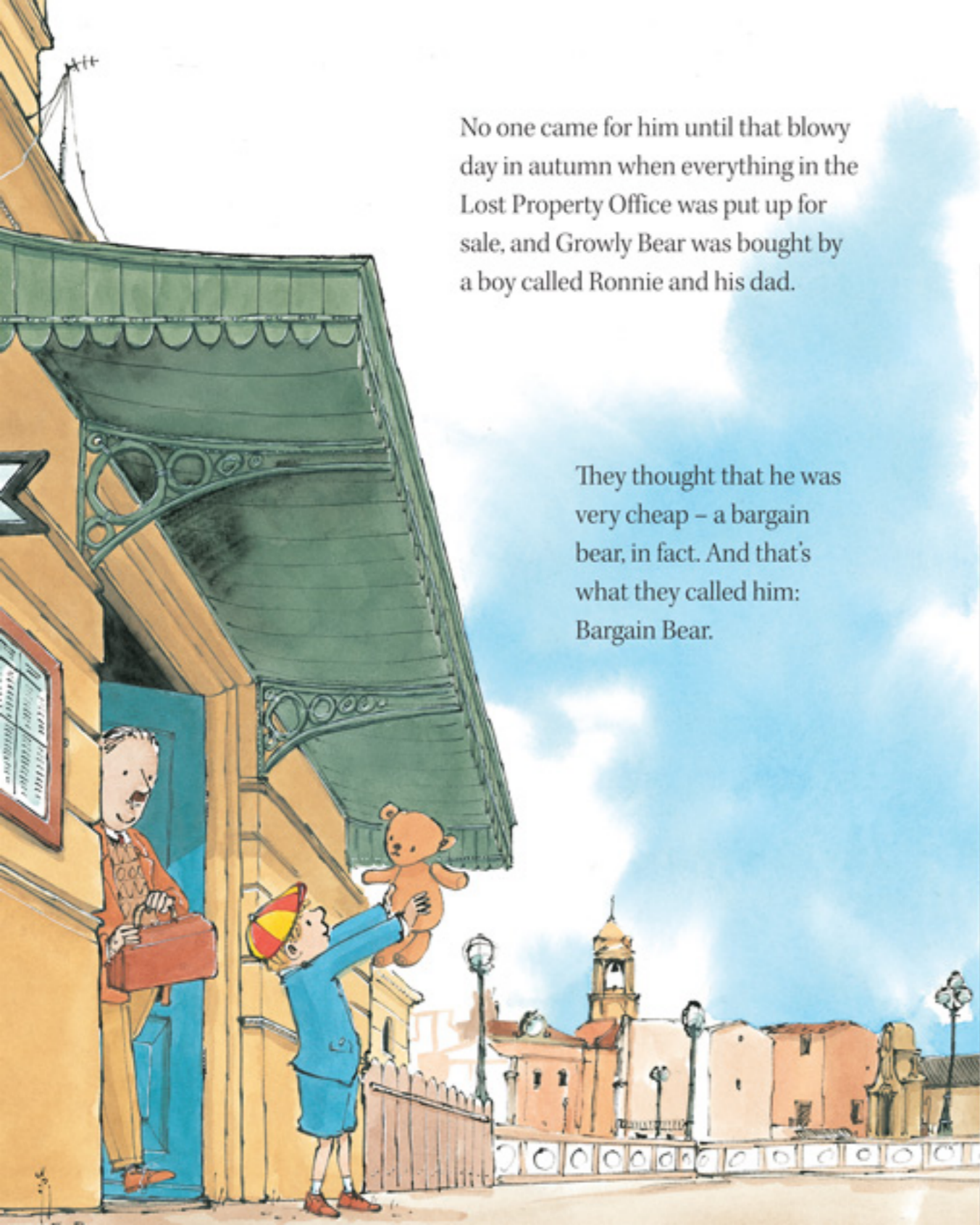


Then one sad day, Mary Rose lost him on a train.
