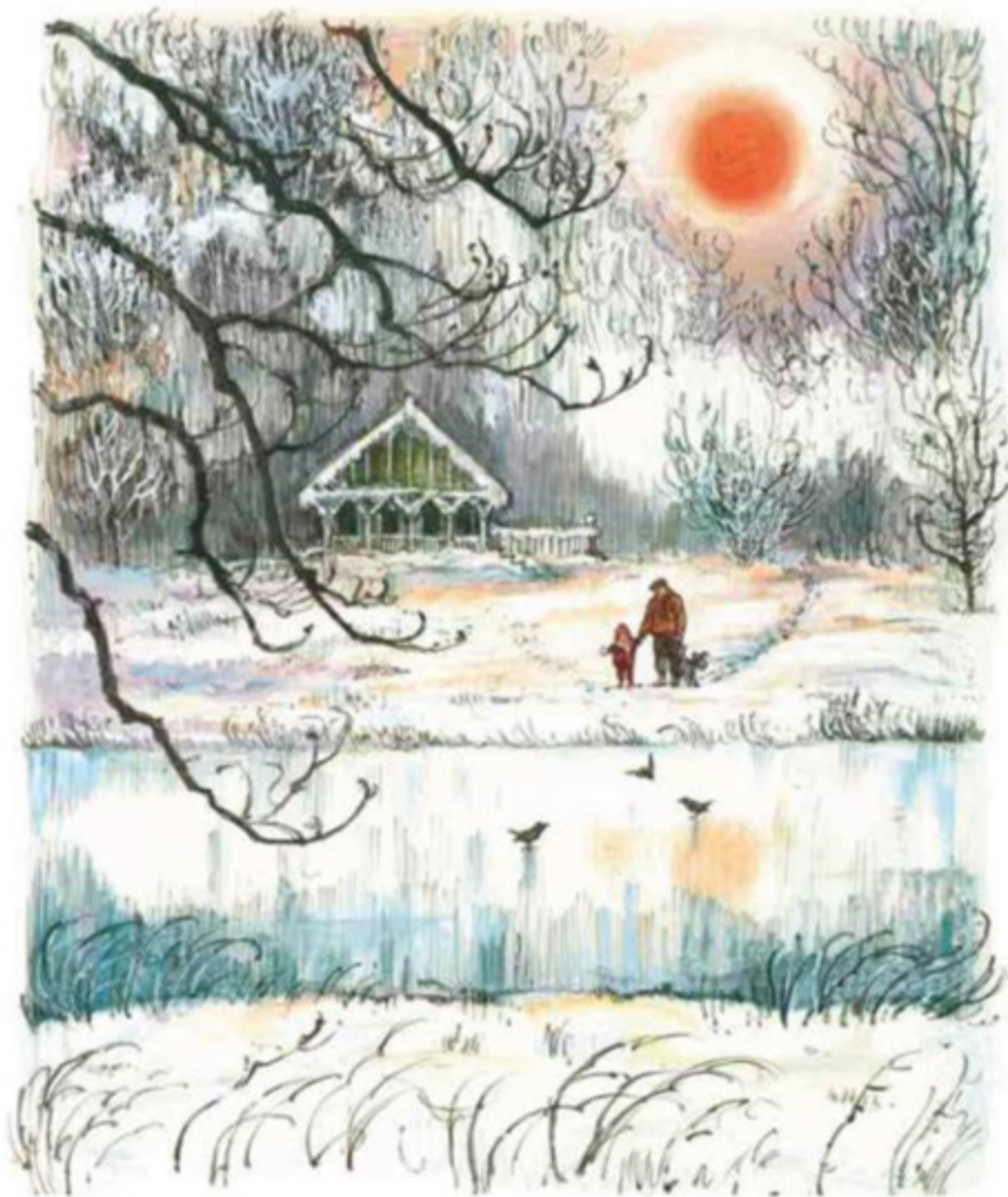

Warm bed.





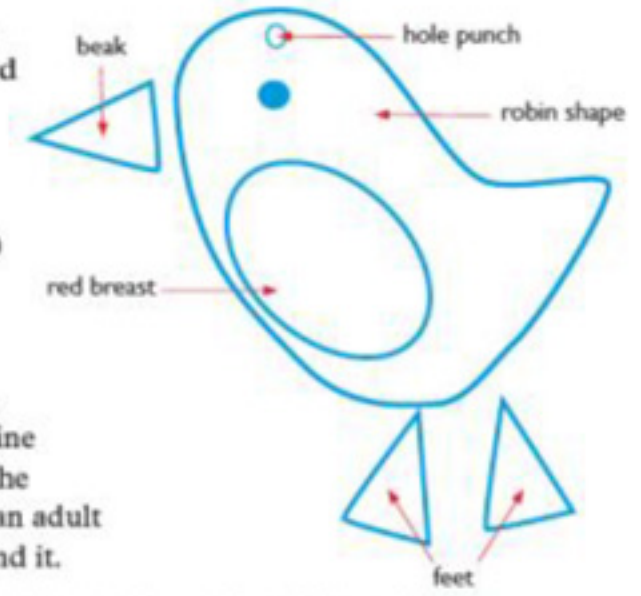
# Red Robin Decorations

*You can make these colourful decorations to hang on a Christmas tree, or even use them as gift labels for presents!*



### You will need:

- A4 sheet of red paper
- A4 sheet of brown card
- Stick-on eyes
- A glue stick
- A pencil (or crayon)
- A hole punch
- Red ribbon (or string)
- Scissors



### Instructions

1. Using your pencil or crayon, draw an outline of a robin shape on the brown card and ask an adult to help you cut around it.
2. Draw a small circle on the red paper. Carefully cut it out and stick it onto the brown shape to give the robin a bright red breast.
3. Stick an eye onto the robin and punch a small hole at the top of the decoration.
4. Cut three small triangles out of the remaining brown card and stick them onto the robin: one for the beak and two for the feet.
5. Carefully thread the red ribbon or string through the hole at the top of the decoration and tie the ends of the ribbon.
