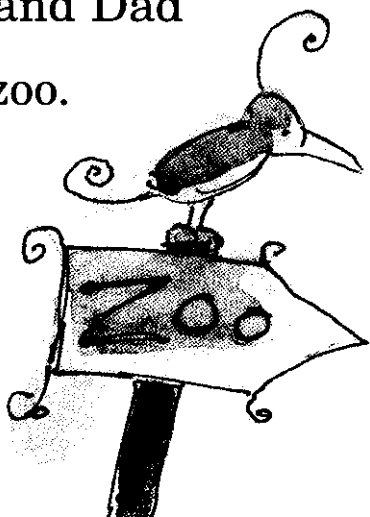

‘You’ll bake in that,’ Dad said.



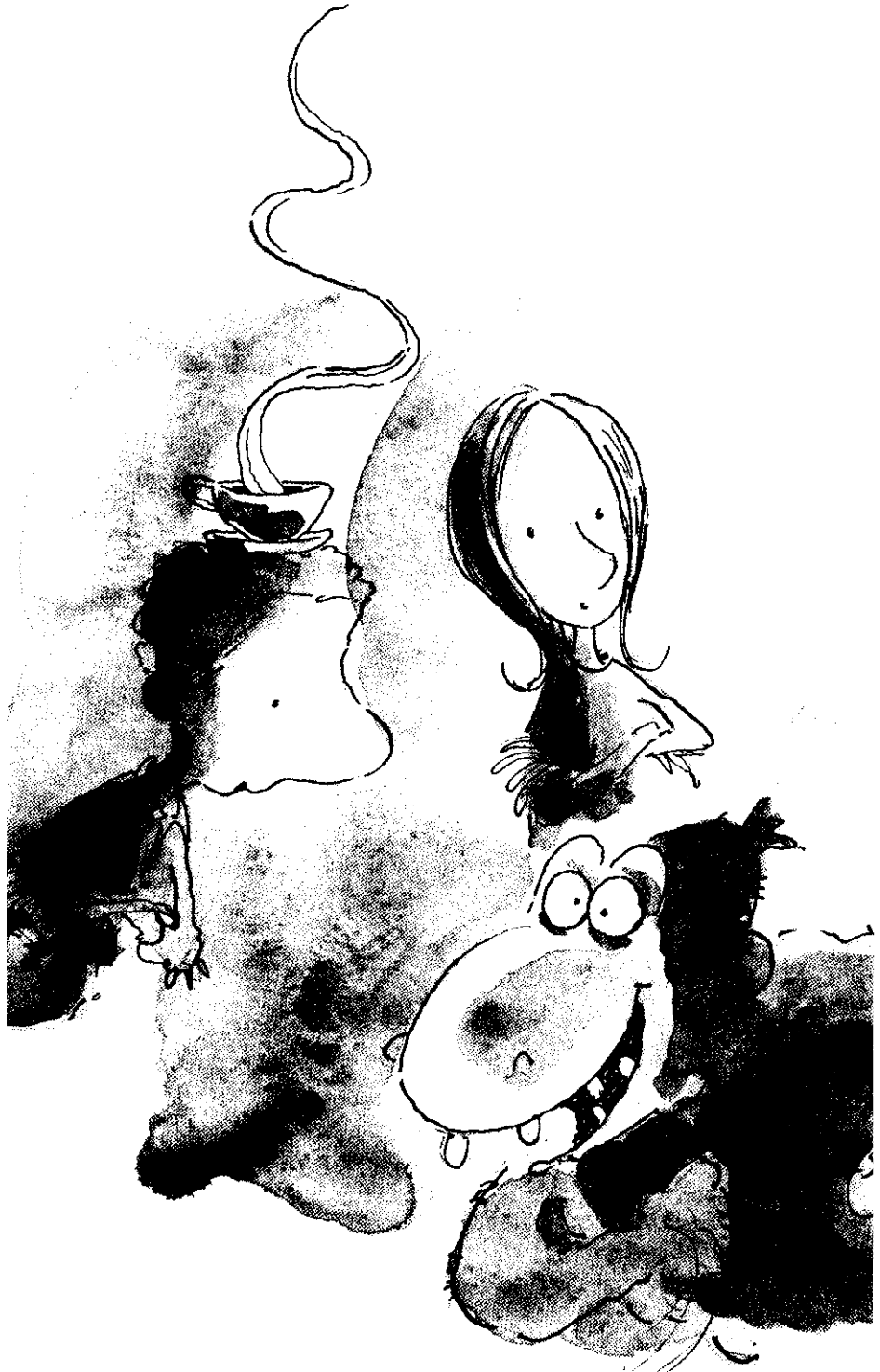
‘Waugh!’ Tom answered in his gruffest voice. He sounded just like a gorilla.

So Mum and Dad gave in and took him as he was.

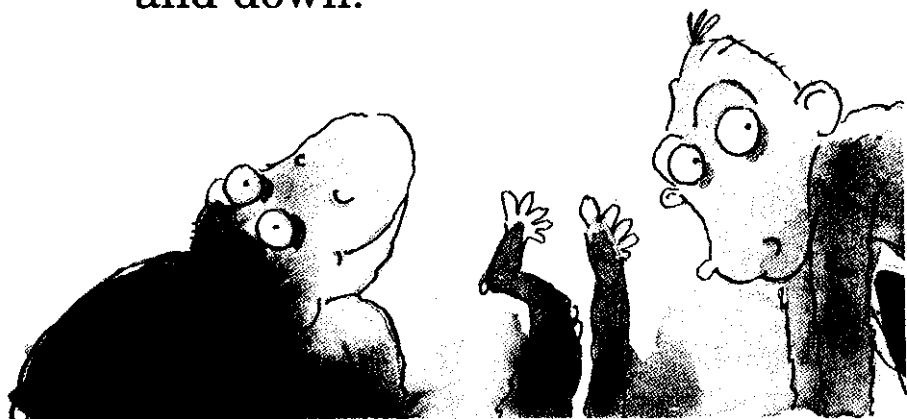
When they reached the zoo, Tom went looking for

He felt really excited. He started jumping up and down.



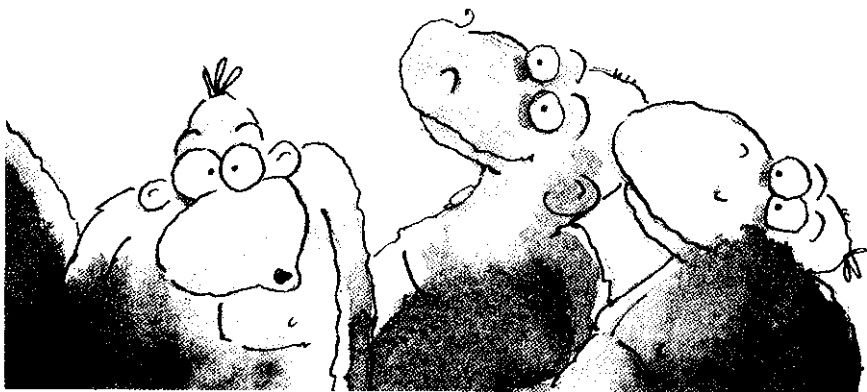


‘Waugh!’ he shouted.

the warning came too late.

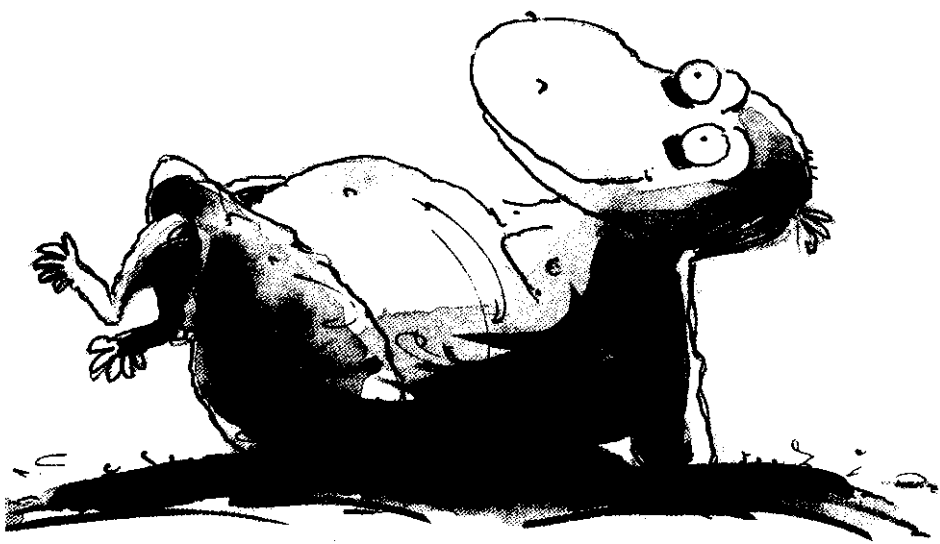


Tom had already slipped. He fell into the gorilla pen.

minutes later, with a net



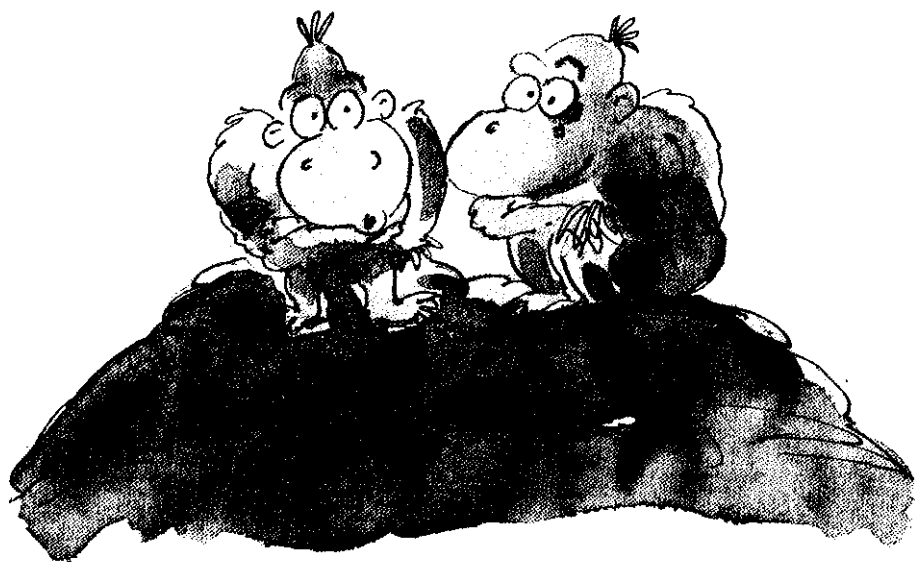
on a long pole. He looked
