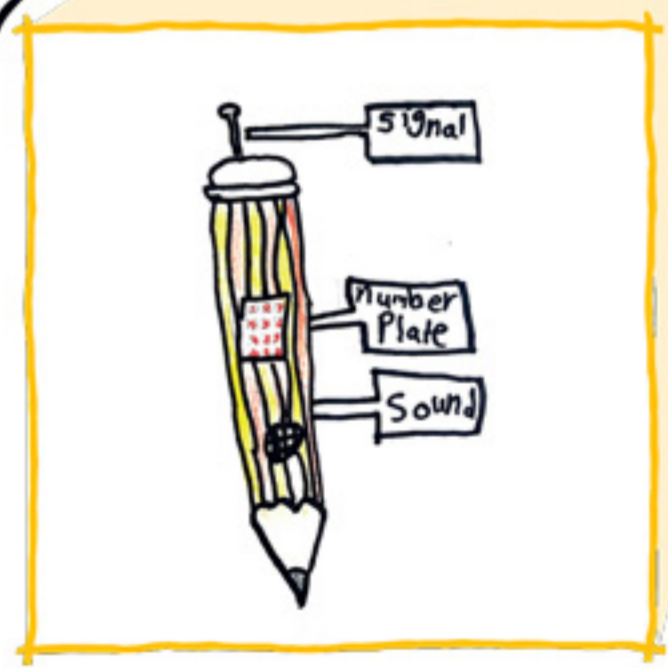


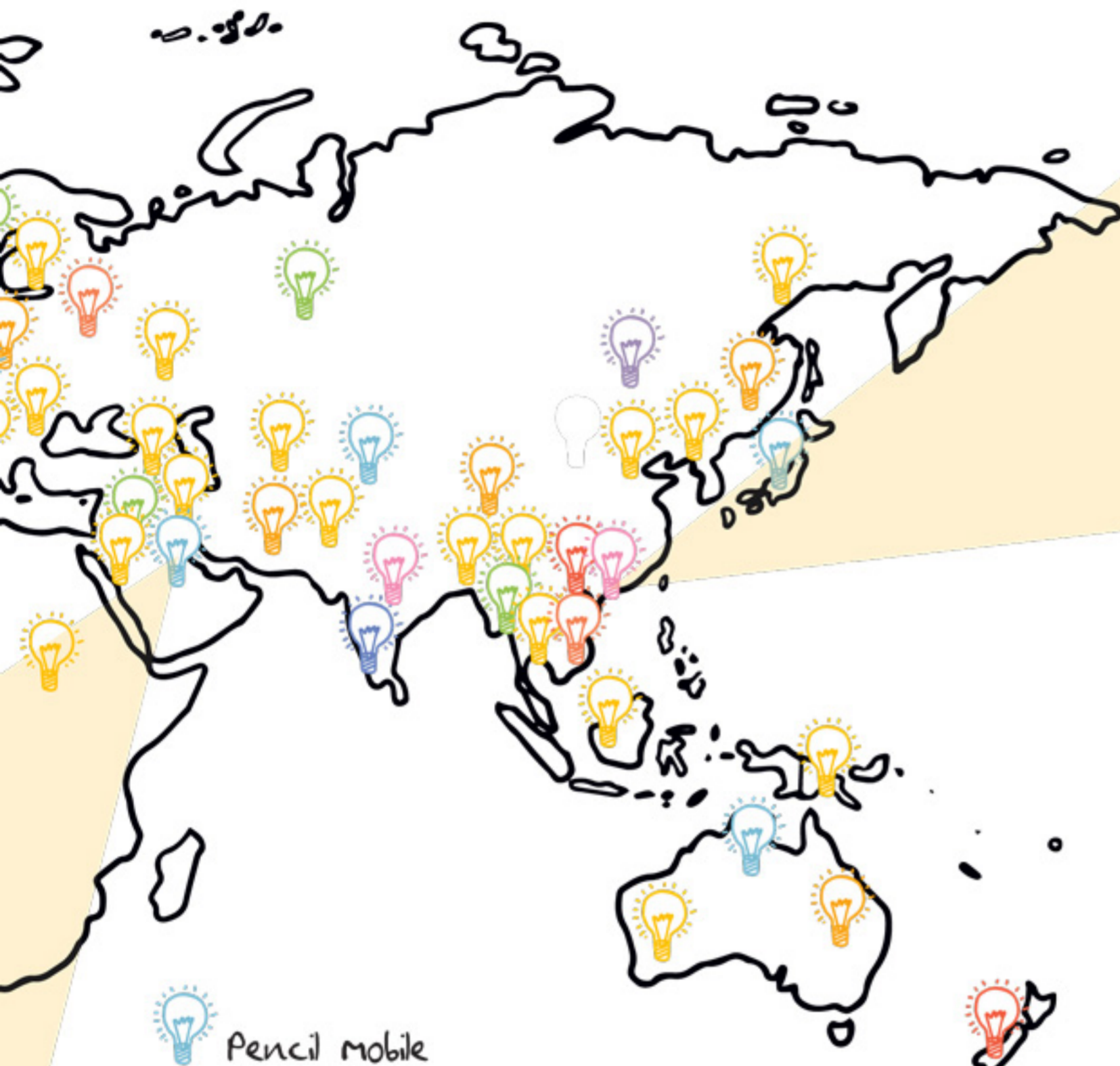
 **Bone Out**

 Pencil mobile

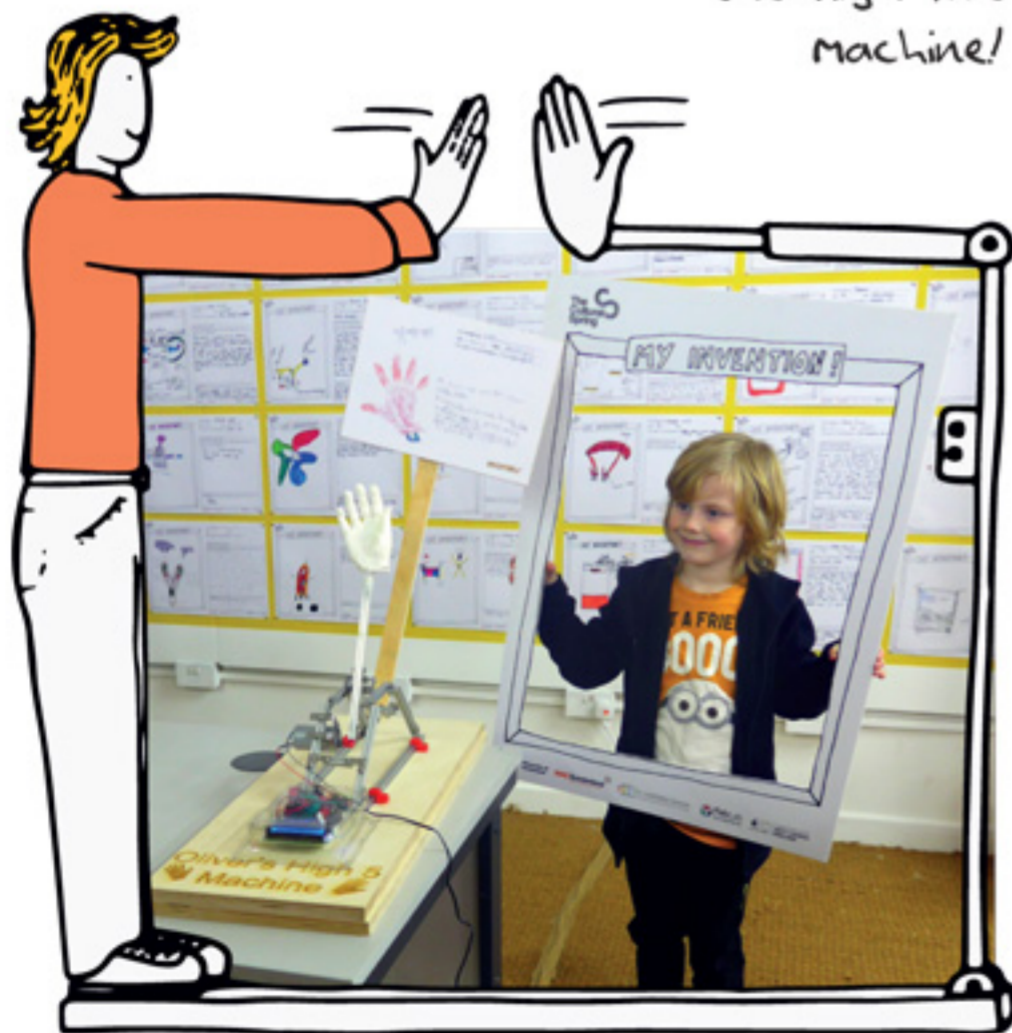
"It a pencil mobile that can be used in schools without any problems since it doesn't have a camera or a screen. It have a small number plate and a signal sensor at the top. It

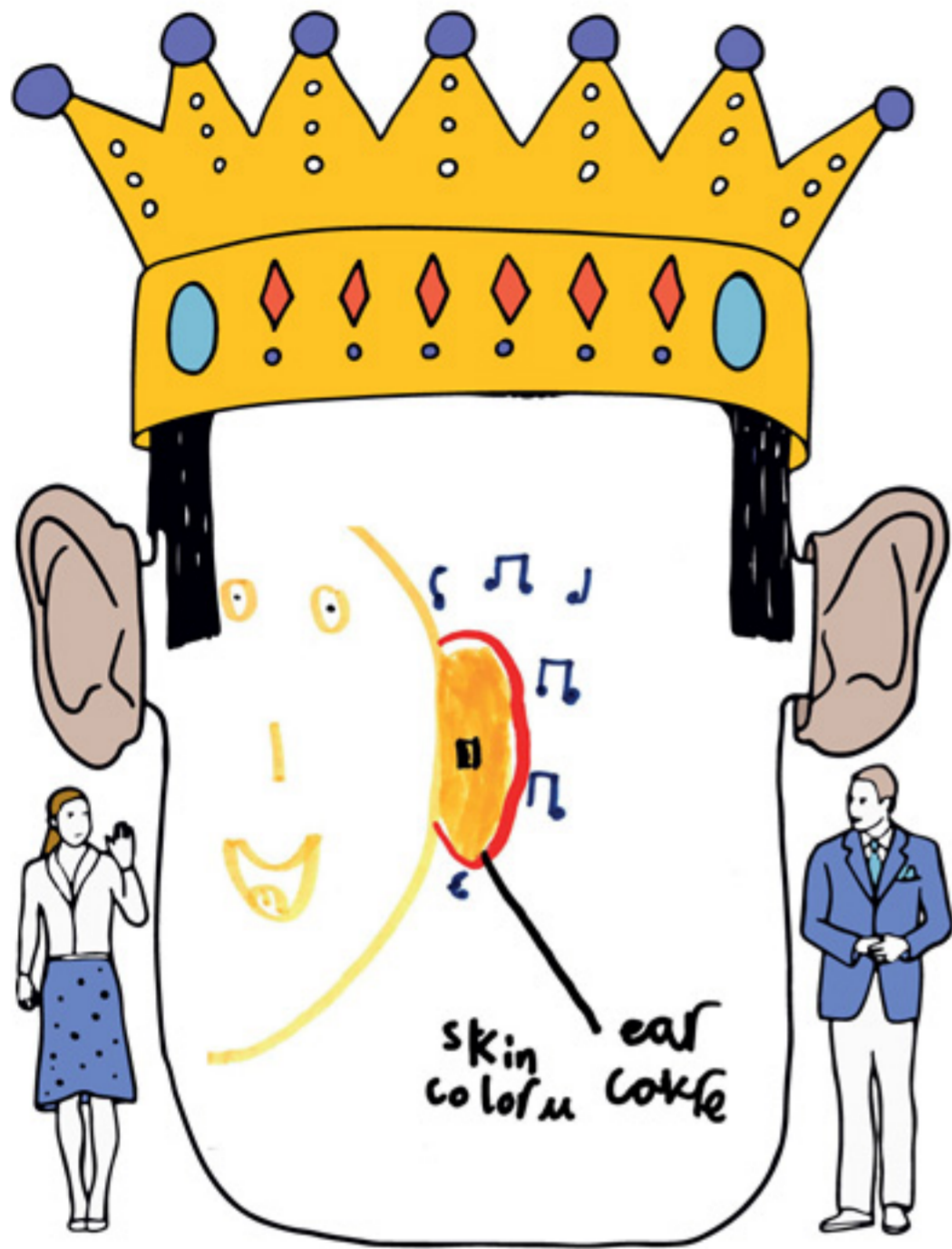

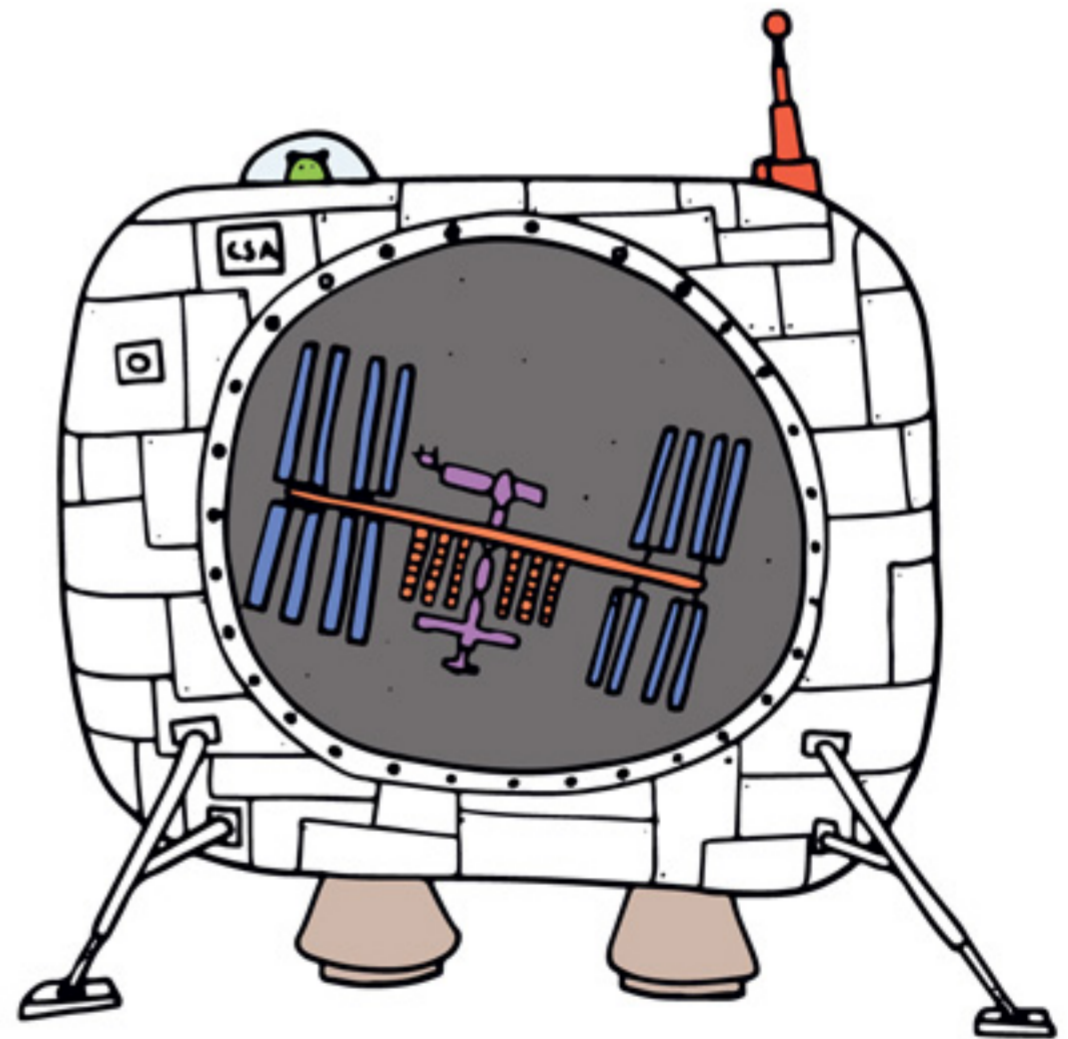

Meet Dominic Wilcox, our Chief Inventor!

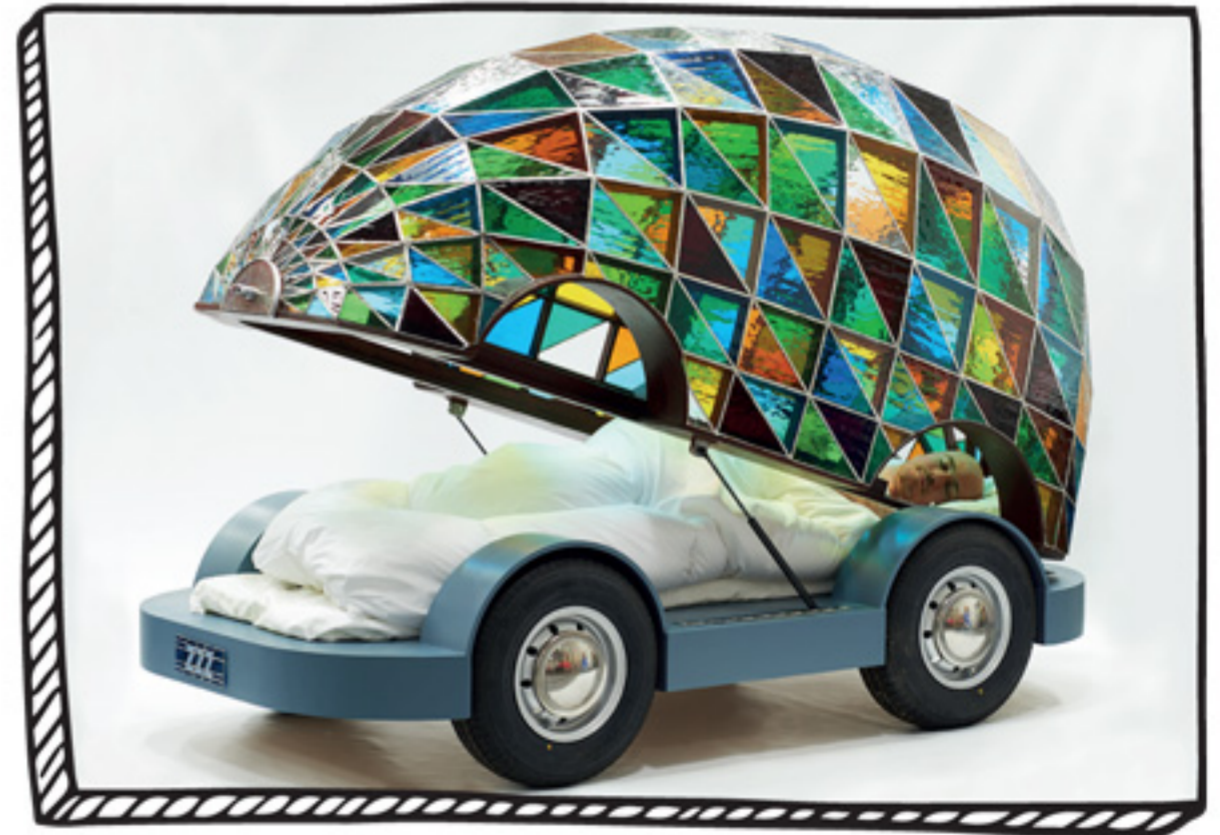


Dominic Wilcox is an inventor, designer and artist. His work has been shown in museums and galleries around the world.

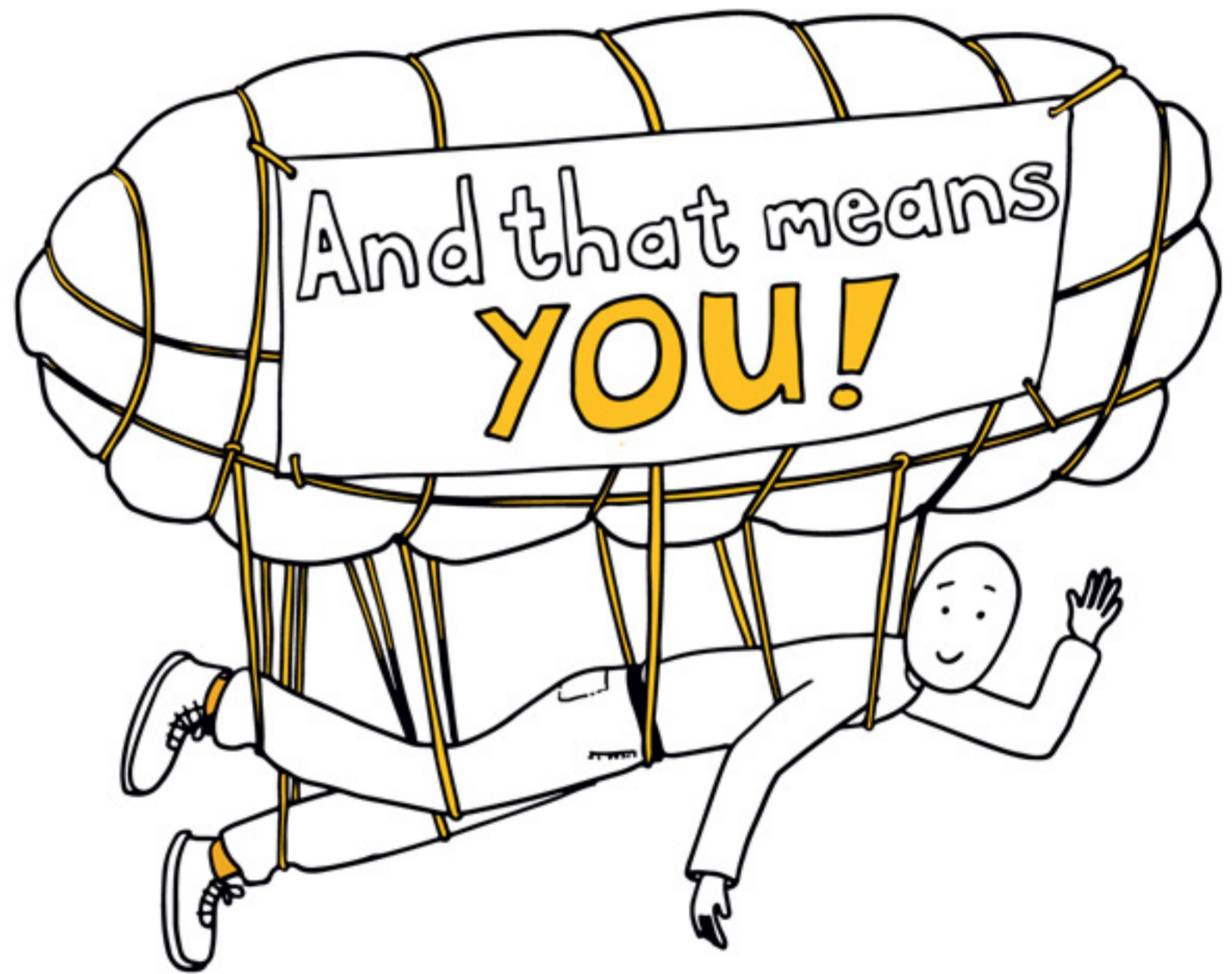
