"She's not being very kind!" whispered Owl to Frog, as they went to have a sit down and a drink.



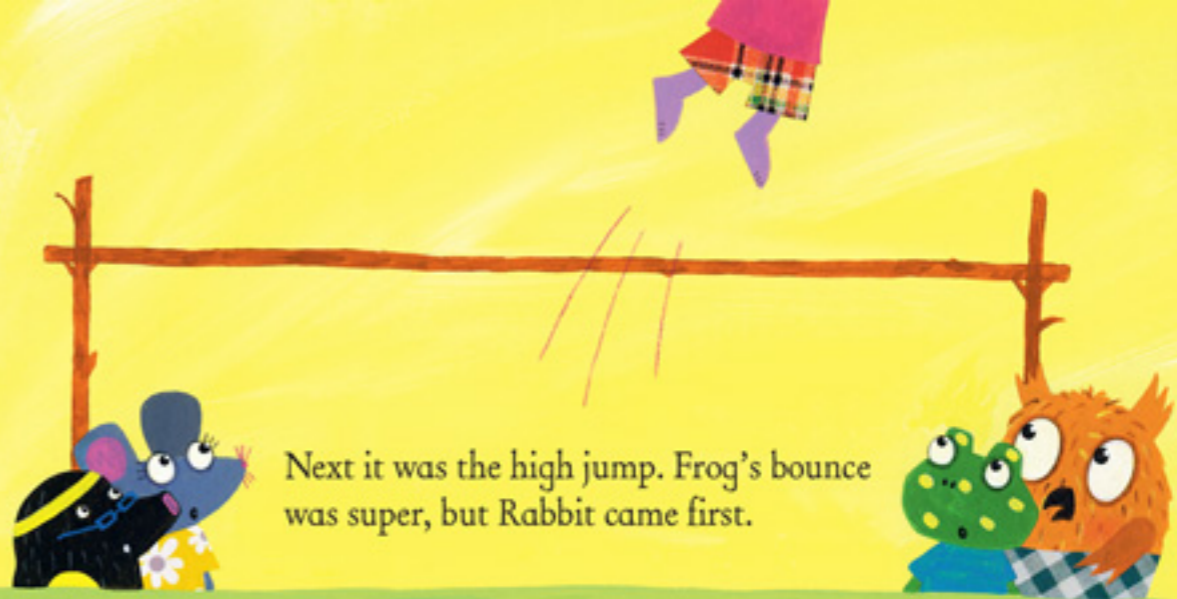
No one wanted to sit with Rabbit.
