This is Moose's passport photo...



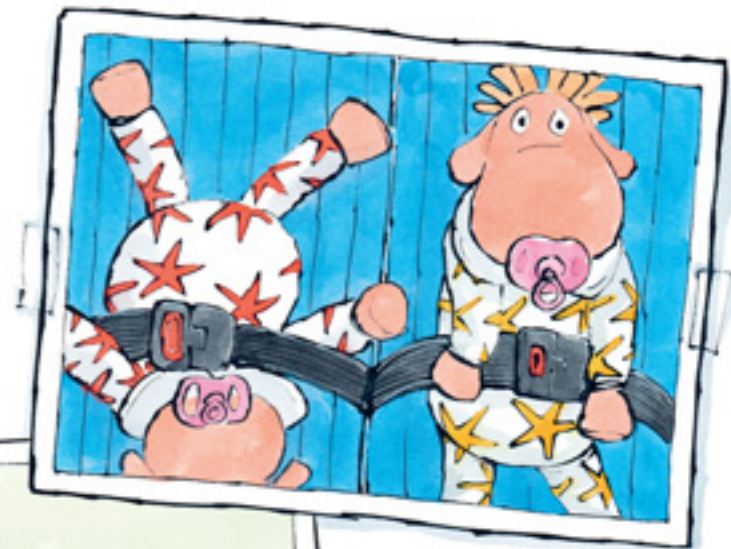
...and this is Monty's.

They had never been apart until the day they left Alaska and...

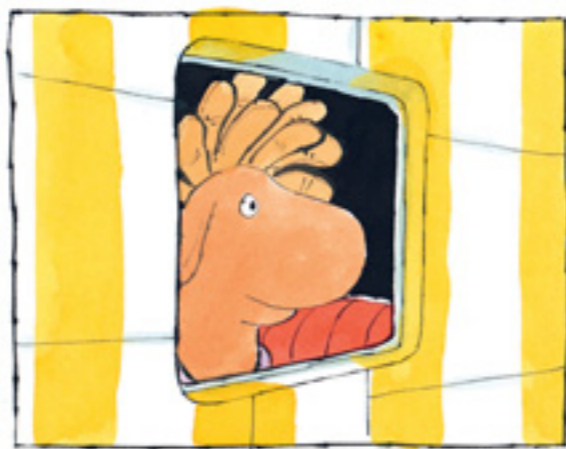


...lost each other at the airport. They were going on holiday to London.
