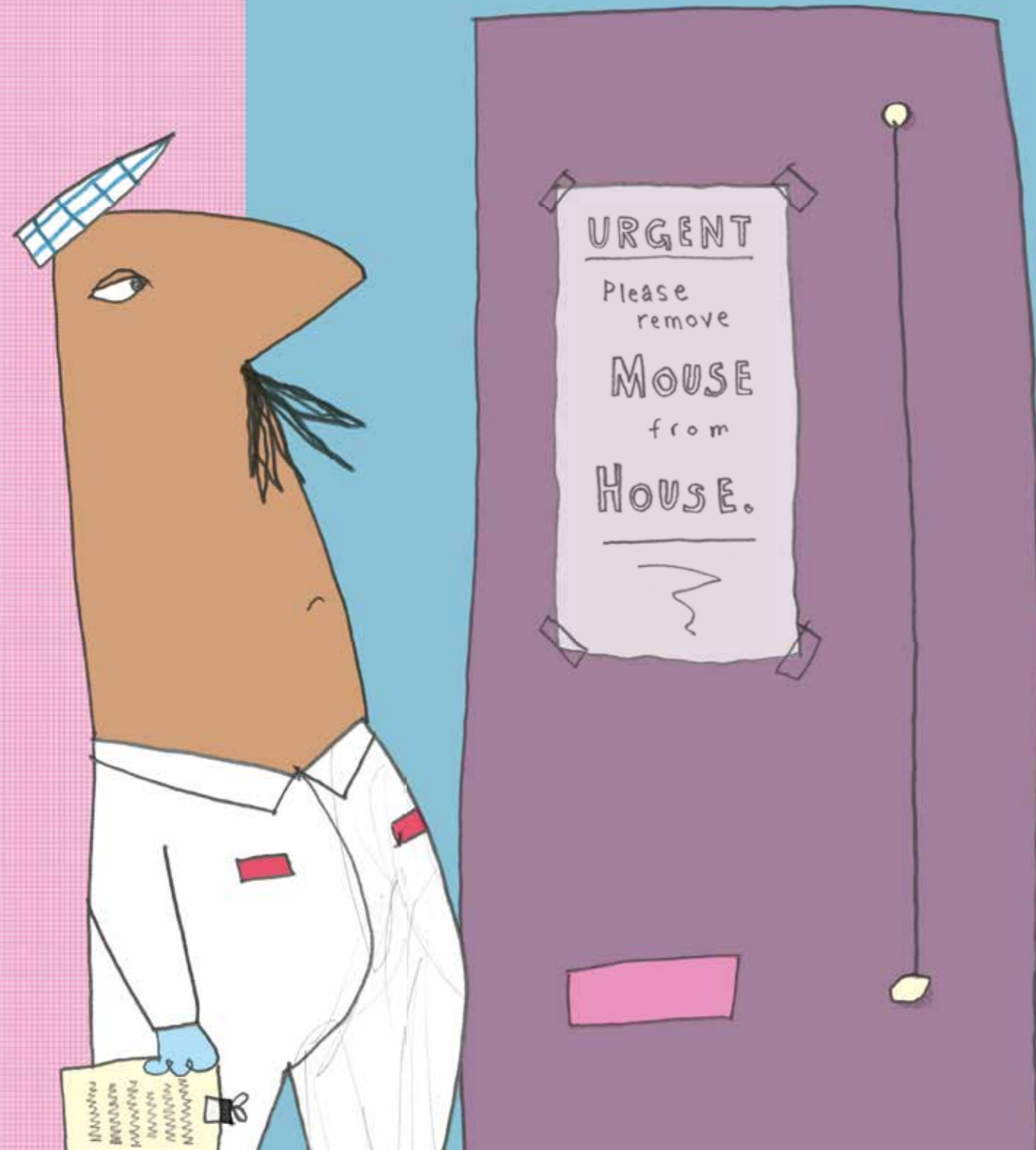
A van pulls up outside the *wrong* house
and out stumble the two catchers of mice:



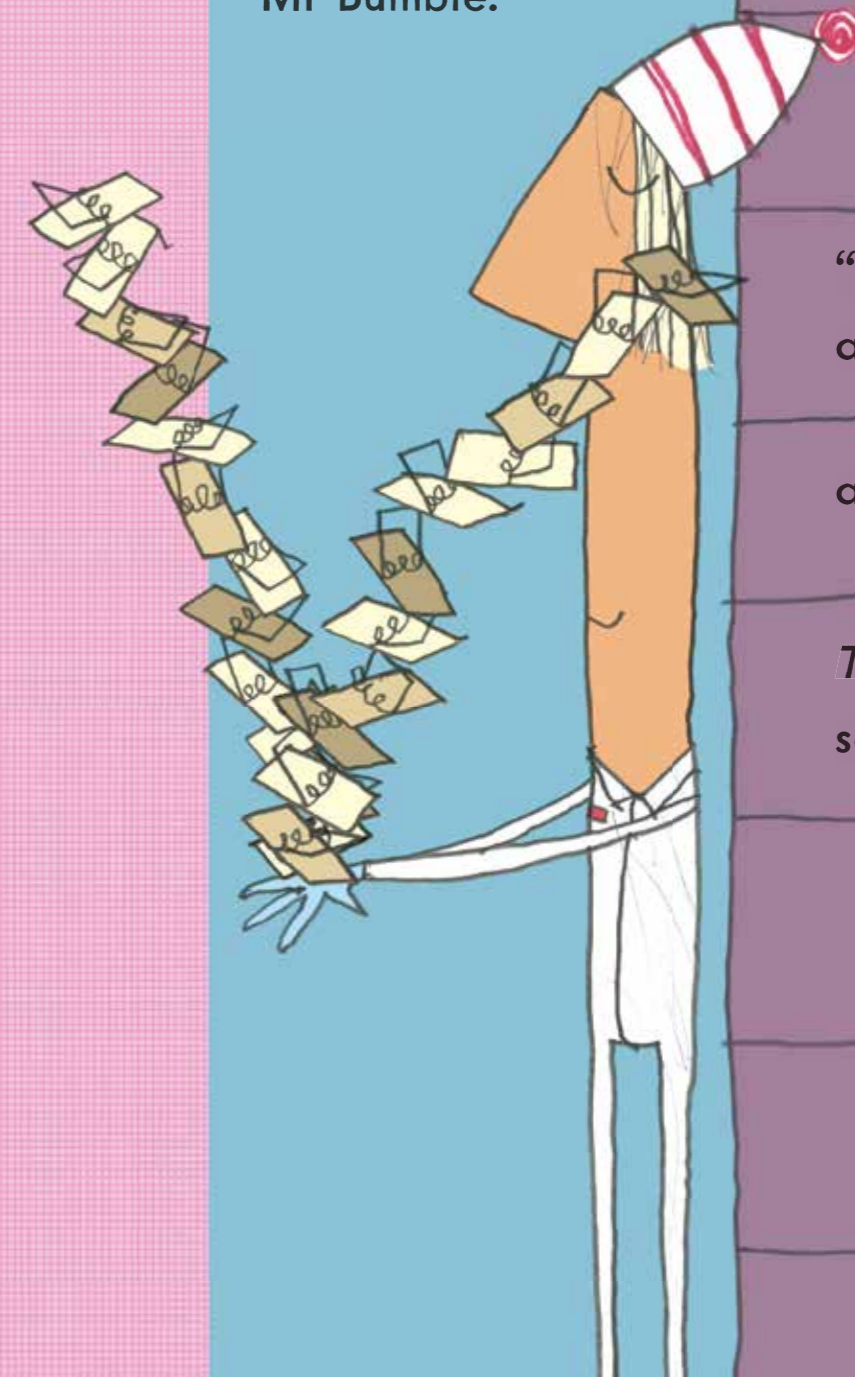
Mr Bosh

“Well, you go in and set the traps...

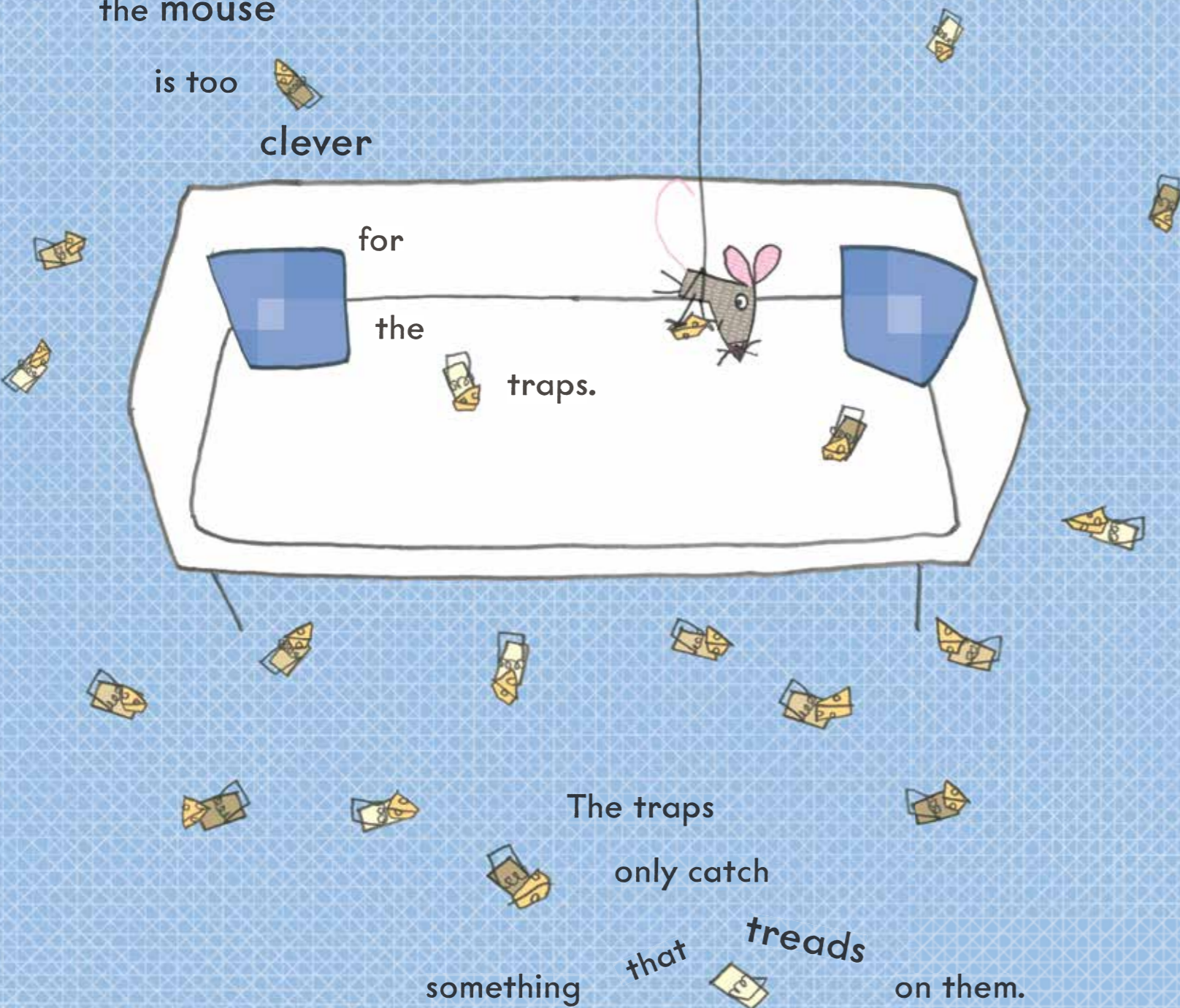
and **SNAP!**

That will be that,” says Mr Bosh.

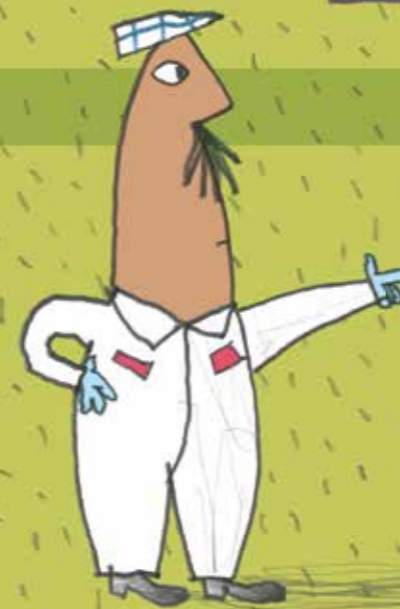
