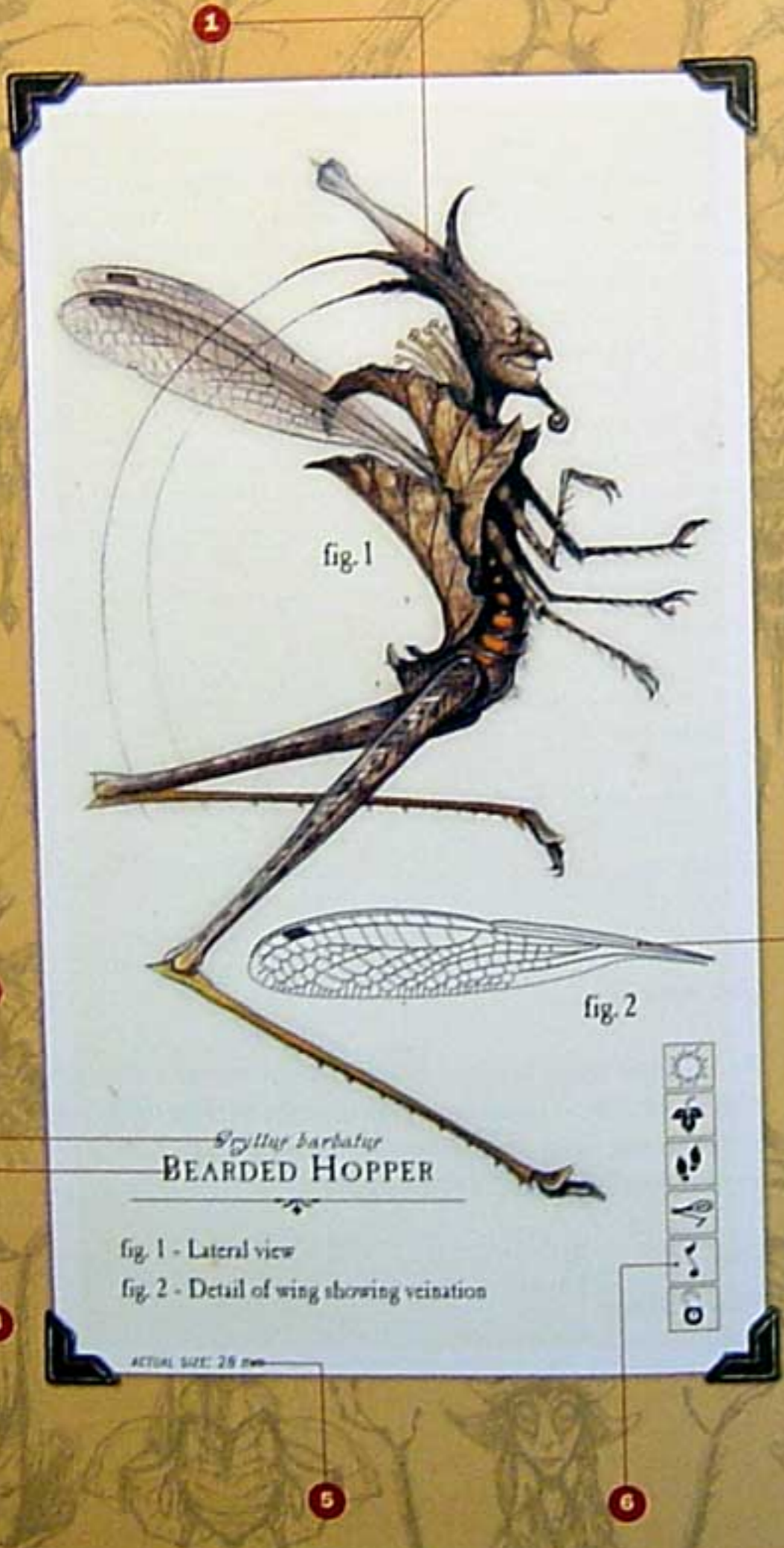

THE MAGNIFICENT SPRITE



A sprite is a constant reminder of all that is magical. Magnificent creatures with vast variation in color and form, these tiny faeries, some smaller than a toothpick, may make flowers bloom yet can deliver surprisingly fierce bites when threatened.

Their wings are reminiscent of both insects and flowers and their bodies give off a dim glow at night. They have become iconic, even outside the community of sprite fanciers. Their tiny, winged forms are reproduced on jewelry and clothing.

But when thinking about keeping a sprite as a pet, you need to do more than appreciate it. You need to consider the following: How will you acquire your sprite? Where will you house it? How will you be sure it gets the proper exercise and correct nutrition? This book provides simple and easy-to-understand guidelines that, when followed, will help keep your pet both healthy and happy.



DO NOT ATTEMPT

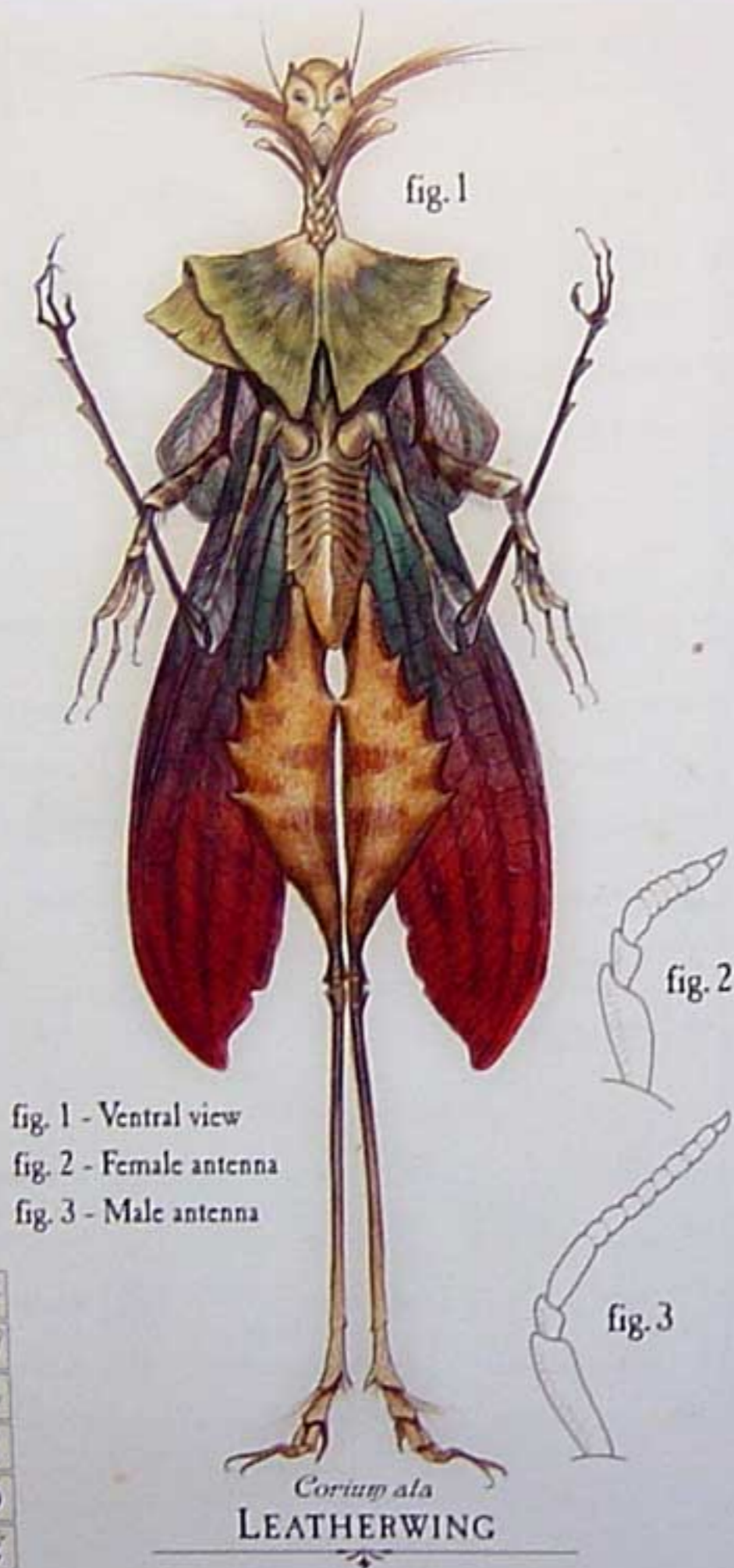


fig. 1 - Ventral view
