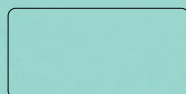



It fell from the sky on a Thursday.

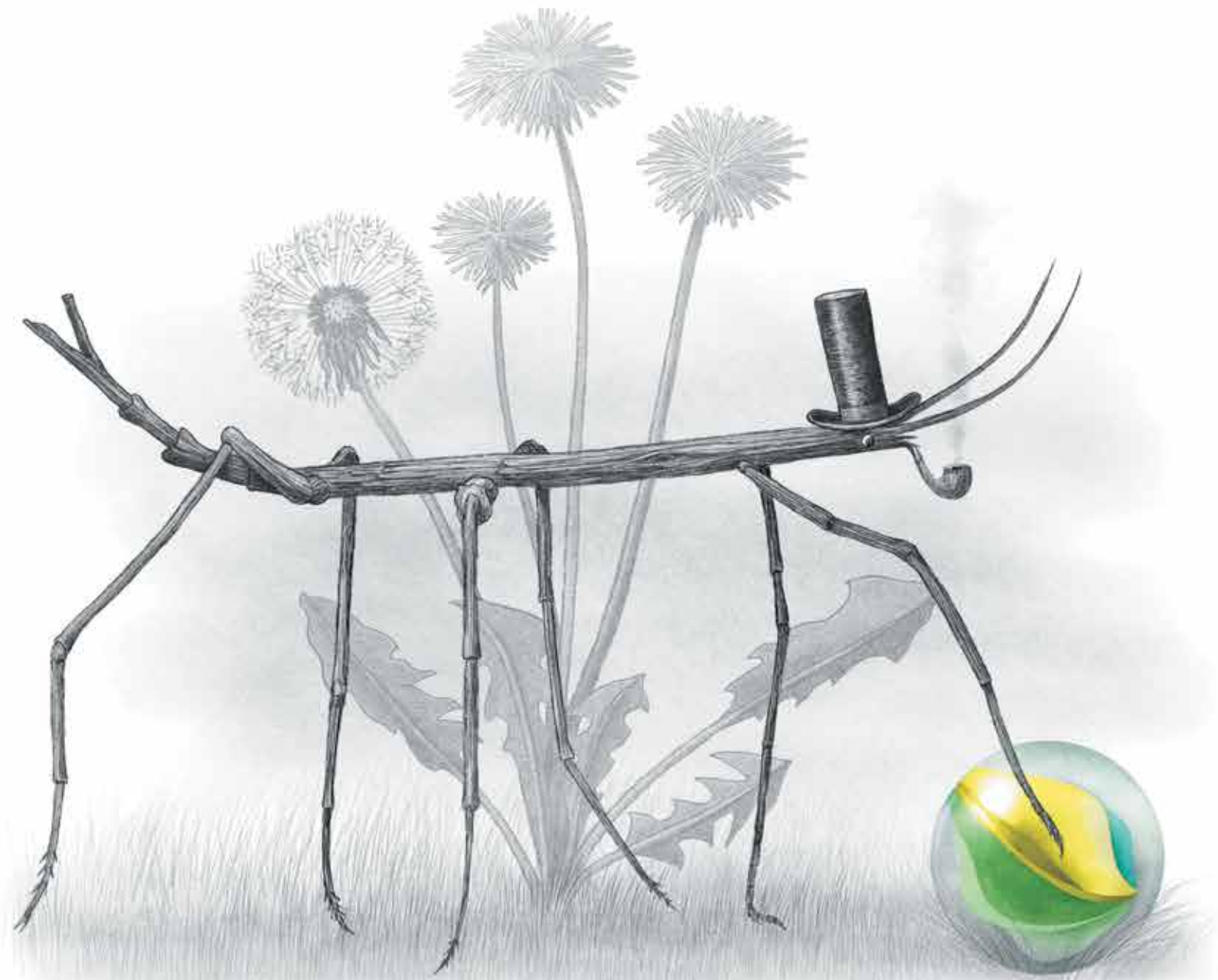

The Dung Beetle tried to roll it, but it was too heavy.

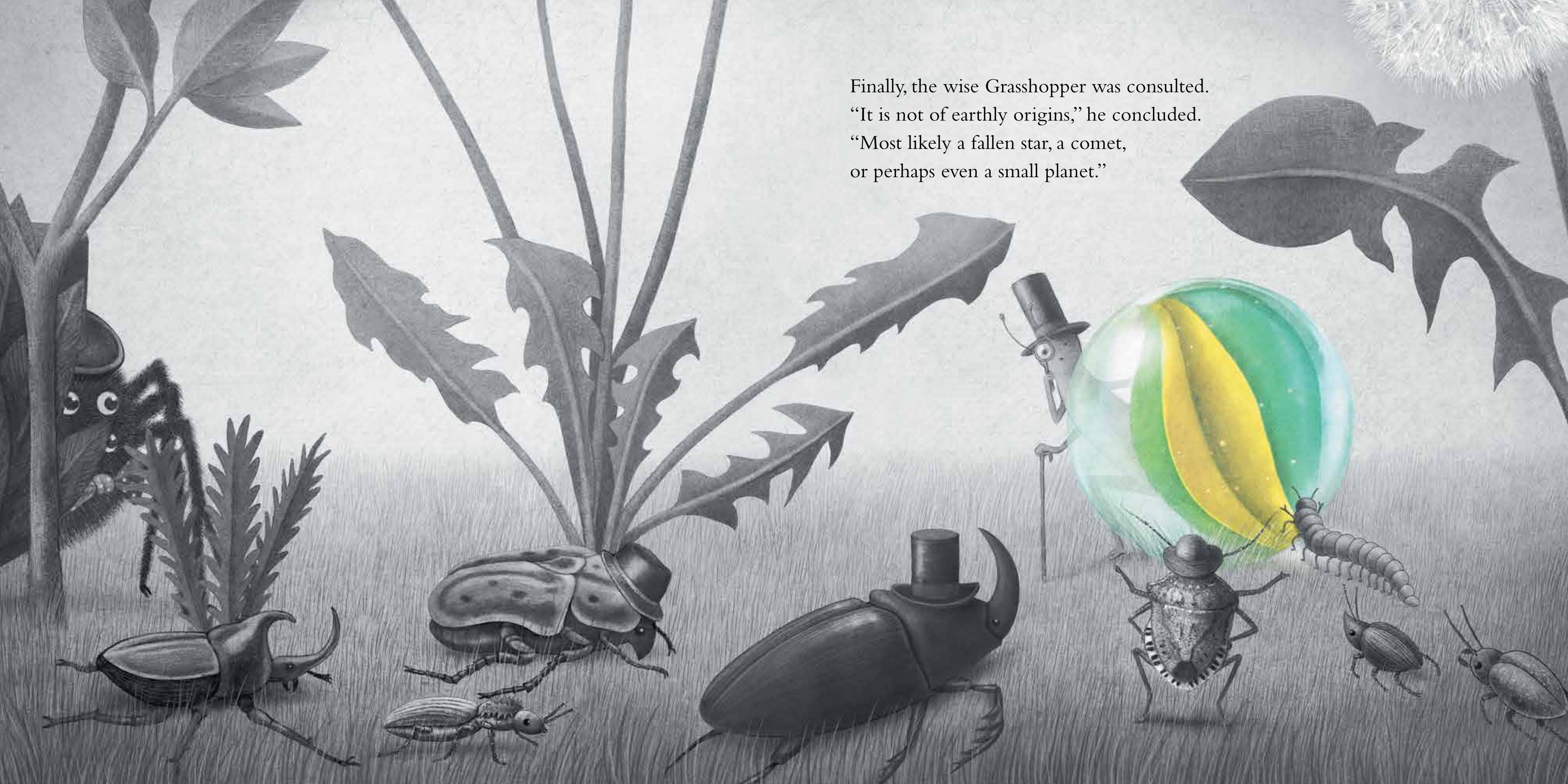


The Stink Bug doubted that it fell from the sky at all. He thought it might have grown from the ground, like a flower.
