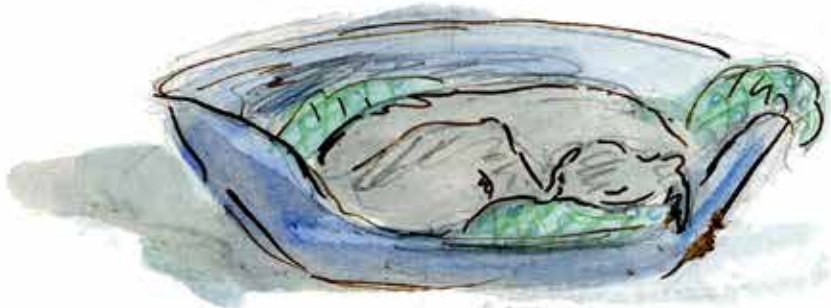
Let's go Merlin!

Walky walk



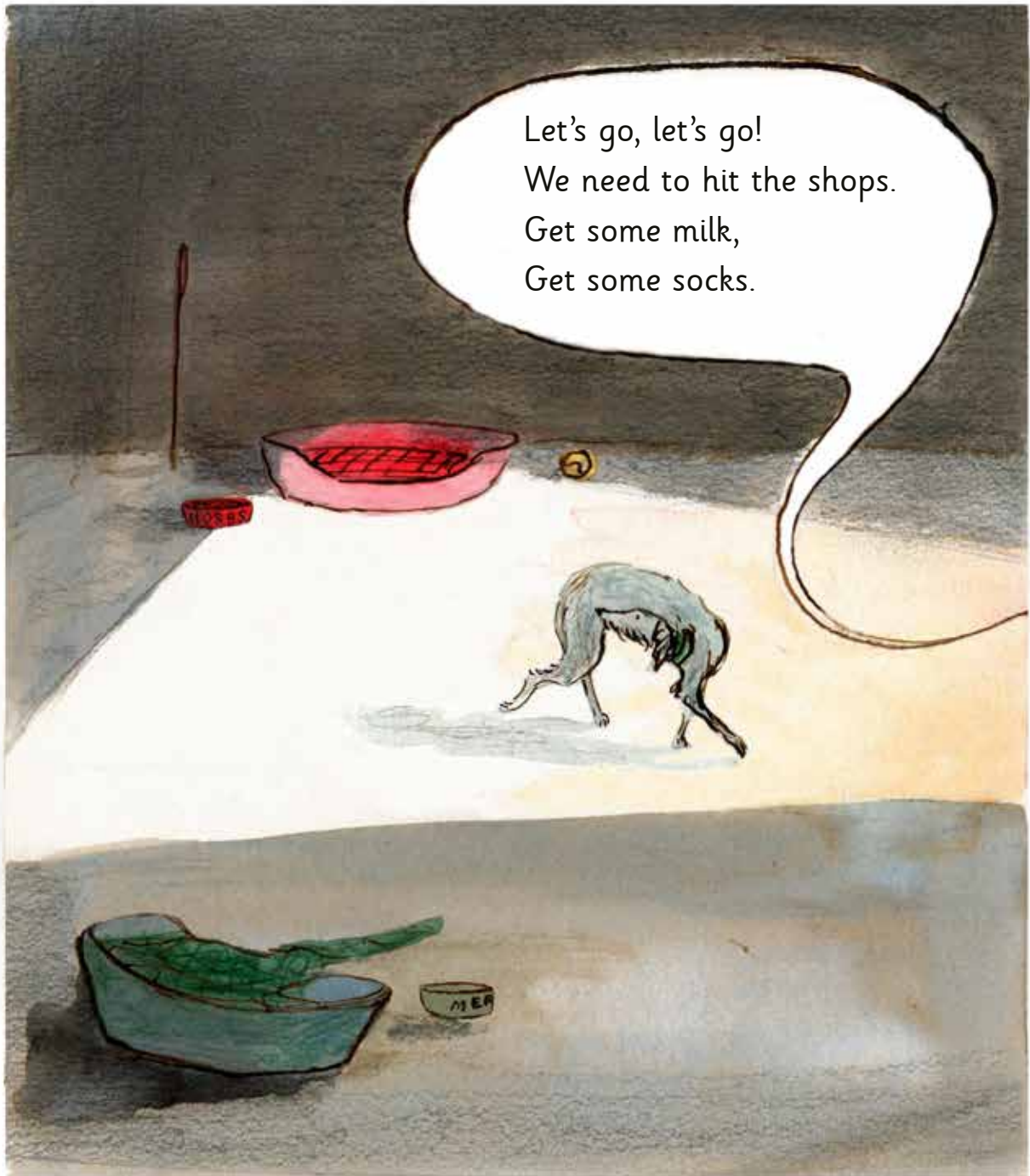
Walky walk walk



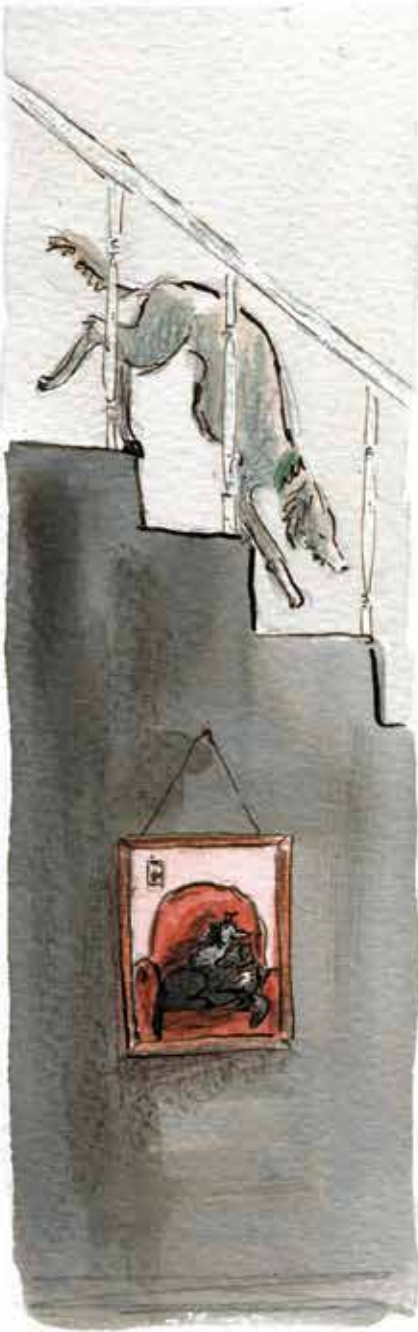
One eye squeezed open,

(in his head)



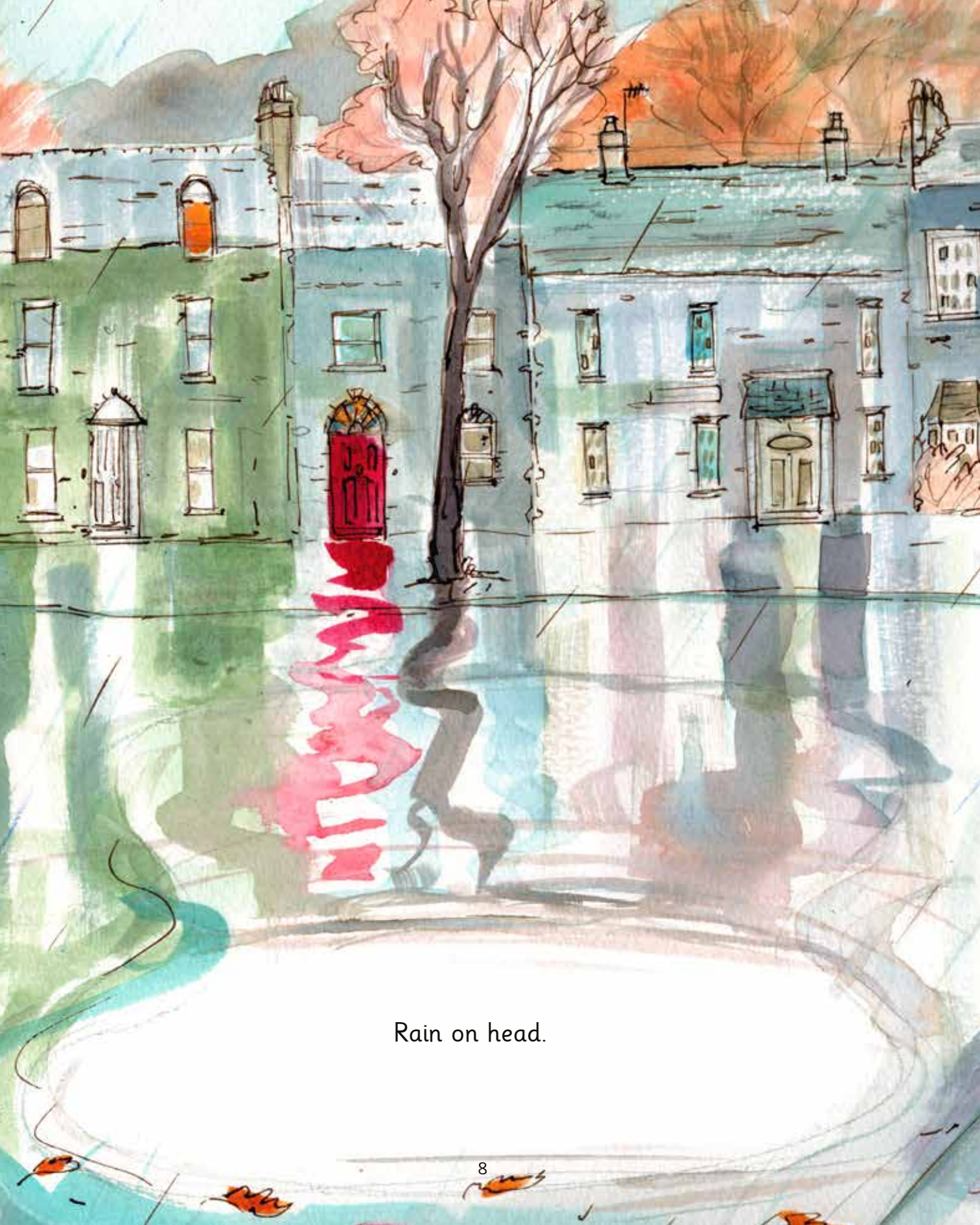
Merlin!

sniffs it from side to side.



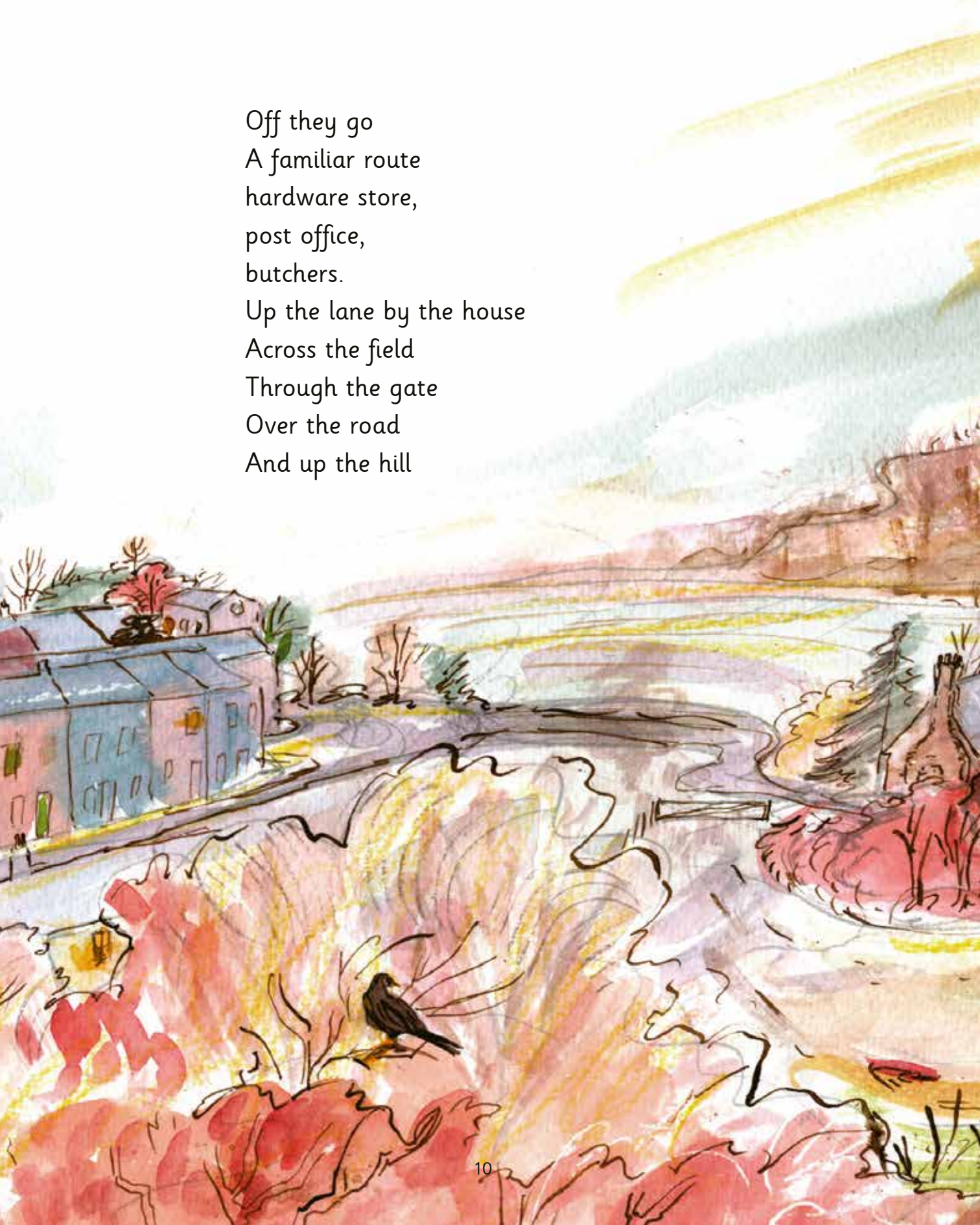
Goes downstairs,
