Then he noticed a bit of paper pinned beside the door. It said 'Gone away. House to Let'.

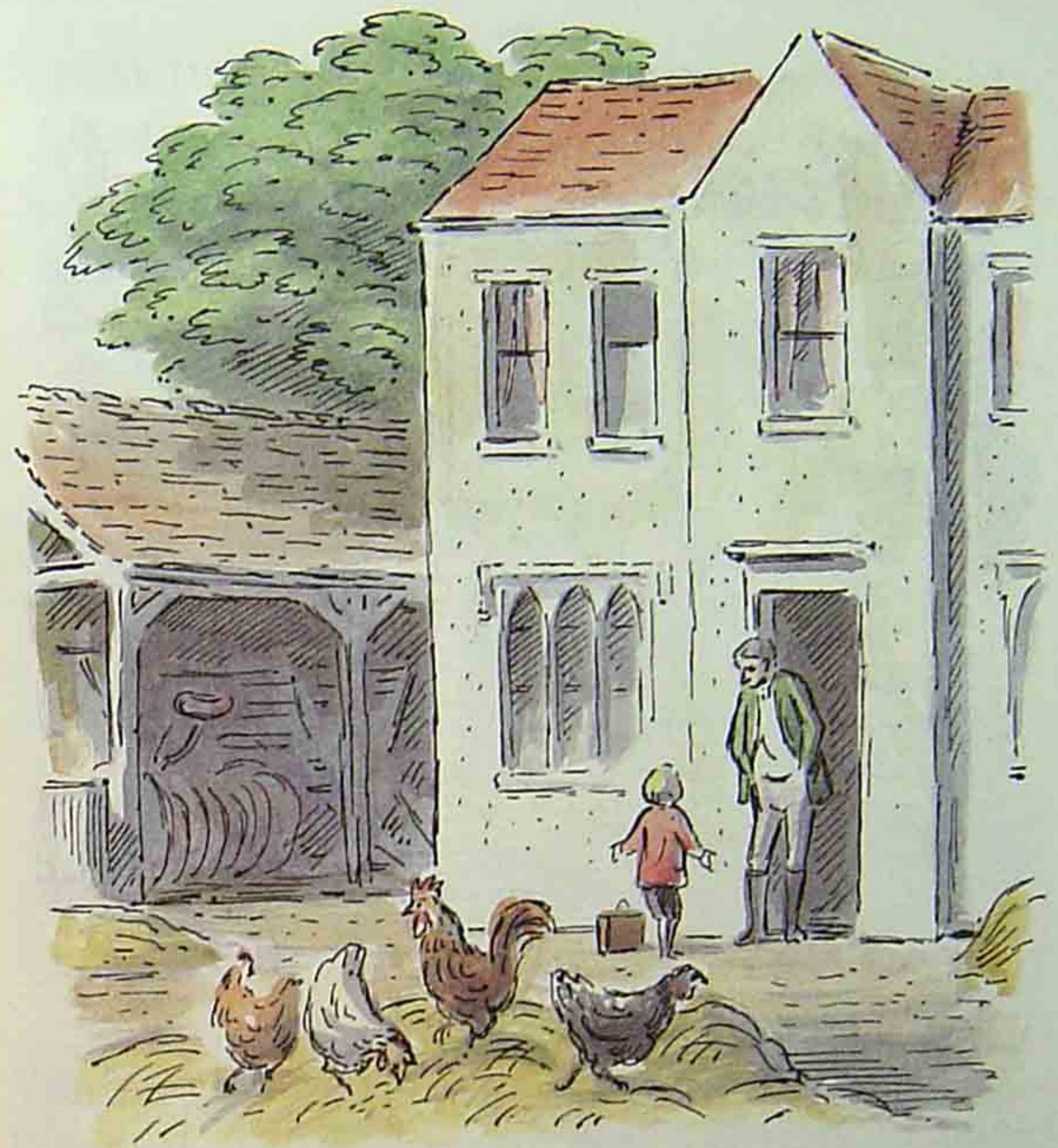
Poor Tim. He sat down on the step and wondered and wondered what strange thing could have happened.
