And NONE of us could BELIEVE what we saw when we watched the FOOTAGE.


Maisie said that we should forget ALL ABOUT IT and NEVER go near the basement again.

That's when Jodi leaned over the table and whispered, "What's he looking for?"


I just shrugged, because it was obvious he
