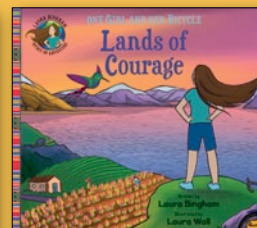
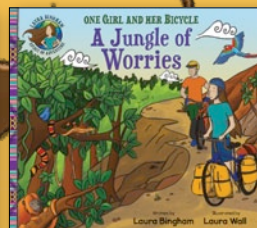

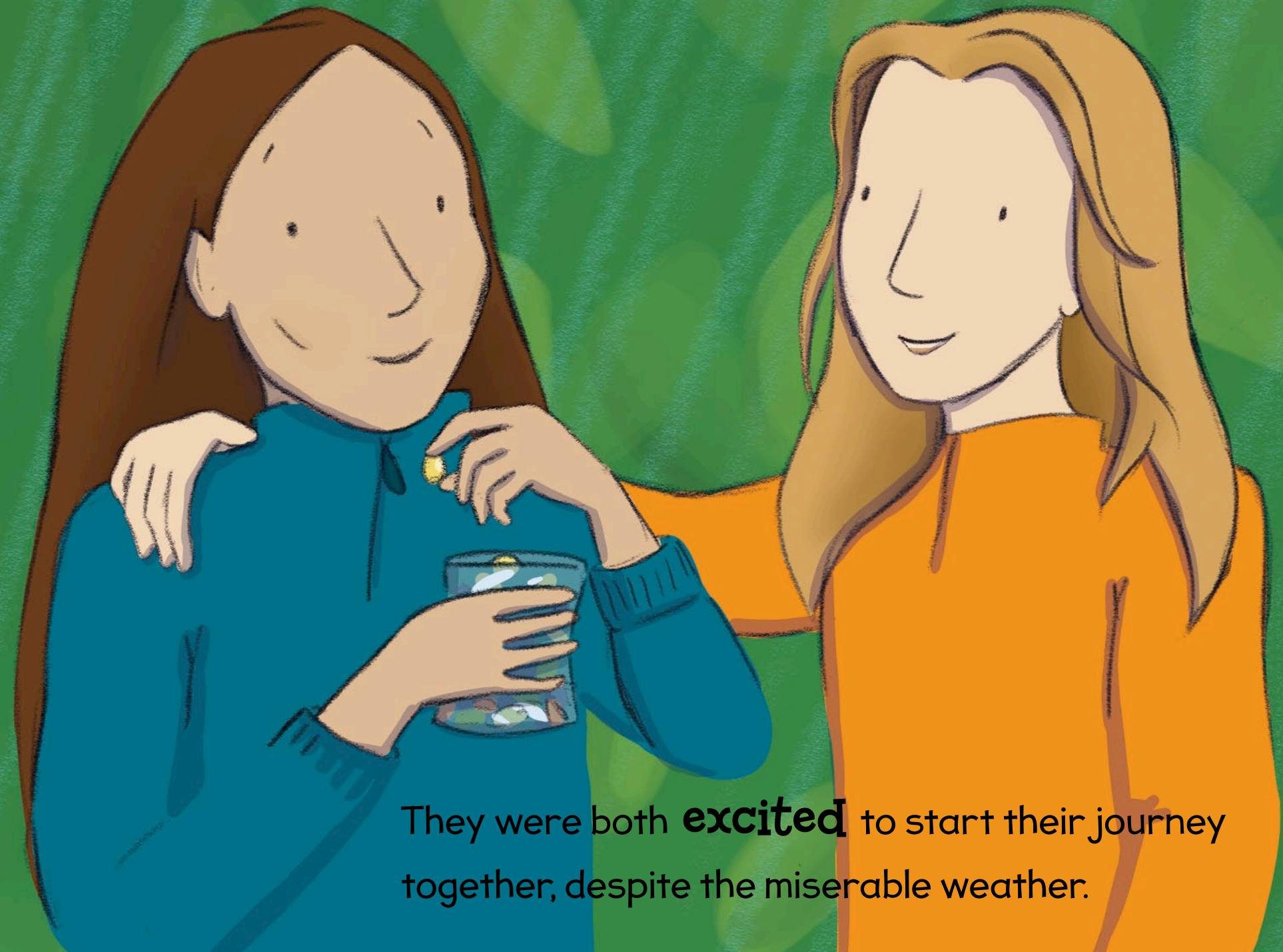
Another bus groaned to a halt and Laura looked up hopefully.

As she stared at the road ahead, trying to motivate herself, she caught sight of a wild horse galloping through the valley.

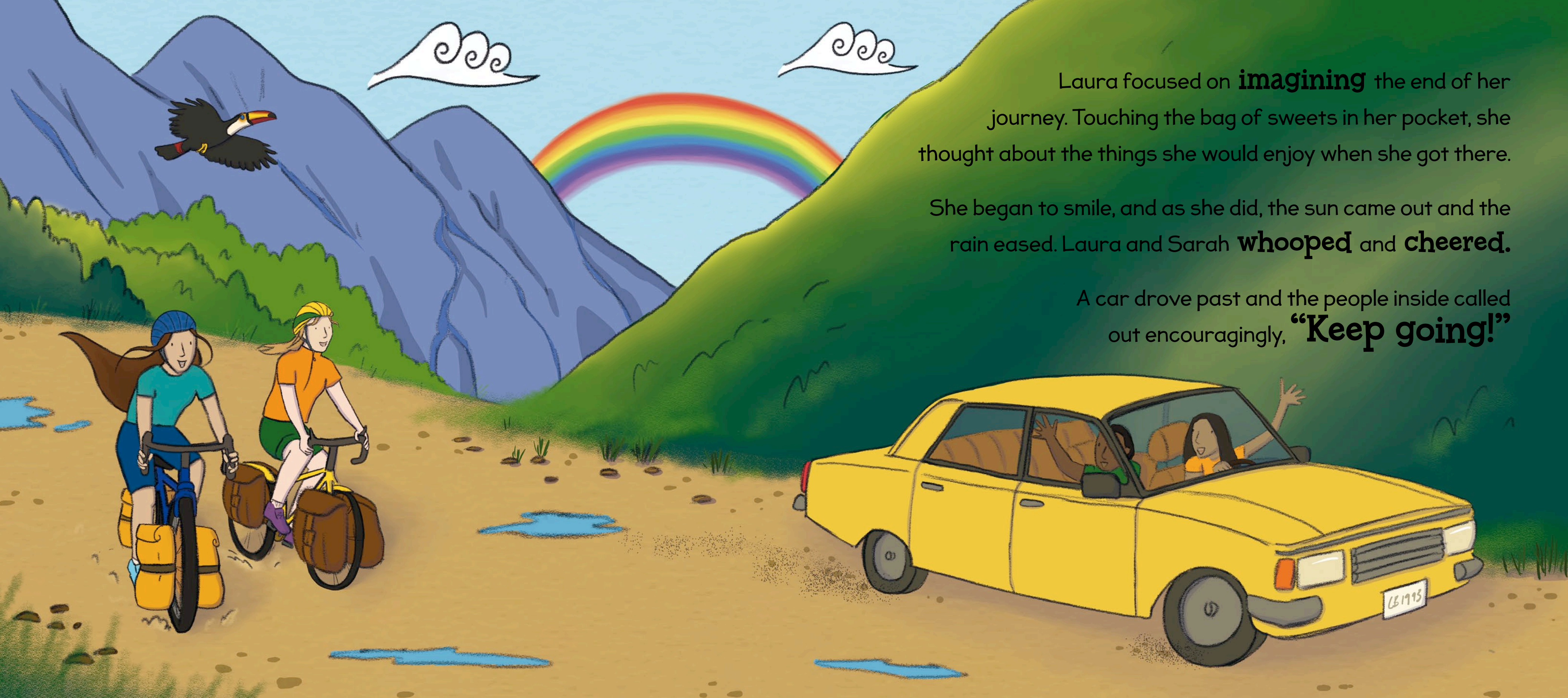
She knew if she was to make it to Buenos Aires, she would need to be more **positive**.

## Criollo horse

Criollo horses are native to the Pampas, a huge area of grassland that spreads across Argentina, Uruguay, Paraguay and Brazil. They are strong and smart and can endure harsh conditions as they travel long distances across the wide-open plains.



## Iguana

Iguanas are large lizards that are mostly herbivorous, usually eating fruit and vegetables. They have a sort of third 'eye' on the top of their head to look out for predators, but if they get caught they can shed their tail to allow them to escape!

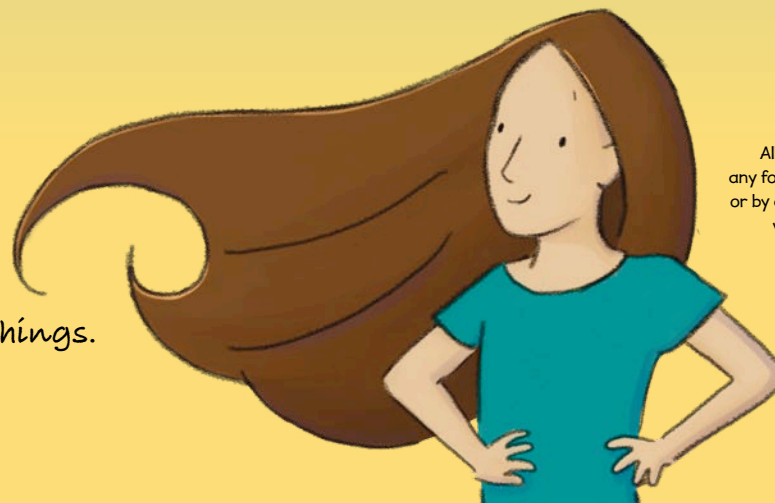


## Pampas fox
