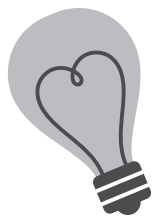

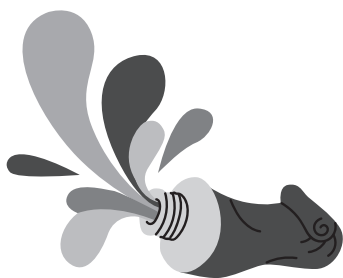

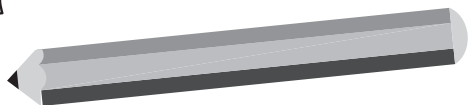

I was very lucky to grow up around **books** and lots of other art, because my parents LOVE reading, and my dad is also a **painter**. We had several of his paintings on the walls of our



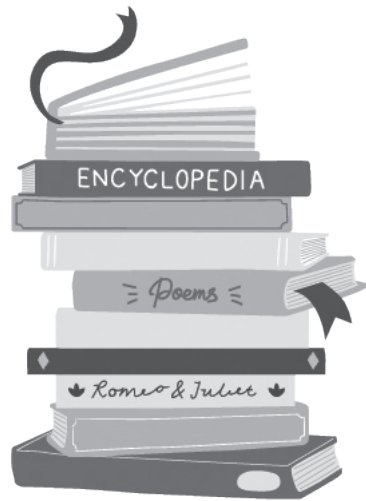
house, and after I left home, he turned my old bedroom into an **art studio**.

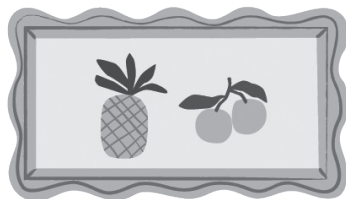
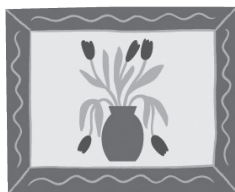
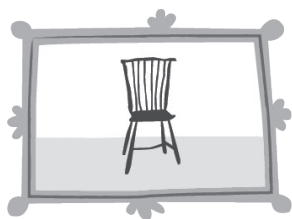


That's a big question – probably too big to start with, actually. Let's try this instead . . .



What do YOU think art is?


I used to think 'art' referred to *drawings* and *paintings* and nothing else. Art was something that hung on the walls of galleries and museums, I thought.



Well, some art *does* hang on the wall of galleries and museums – and drawings and paintings are certainly art – but that little word, those three letters:

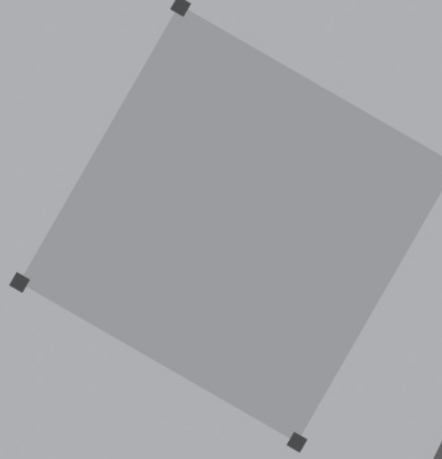
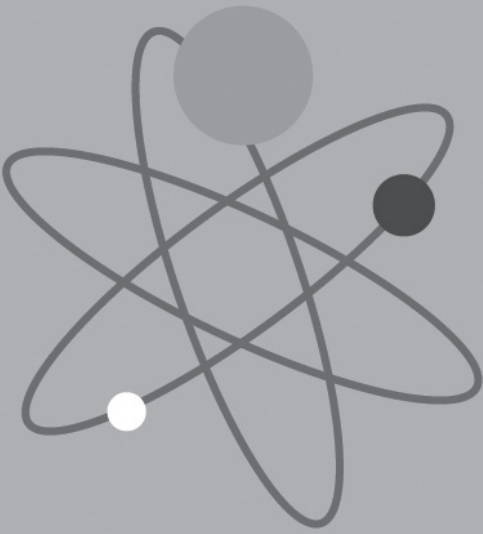

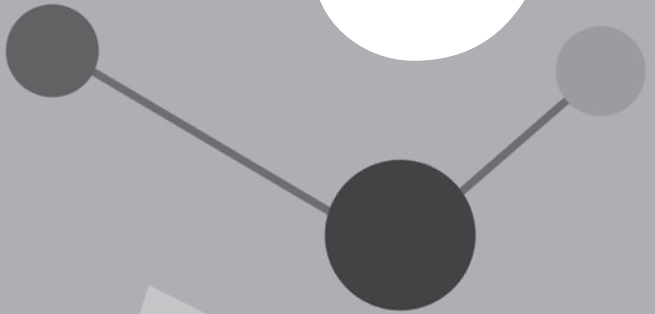
