upset **5** people by singing really, really loudly,



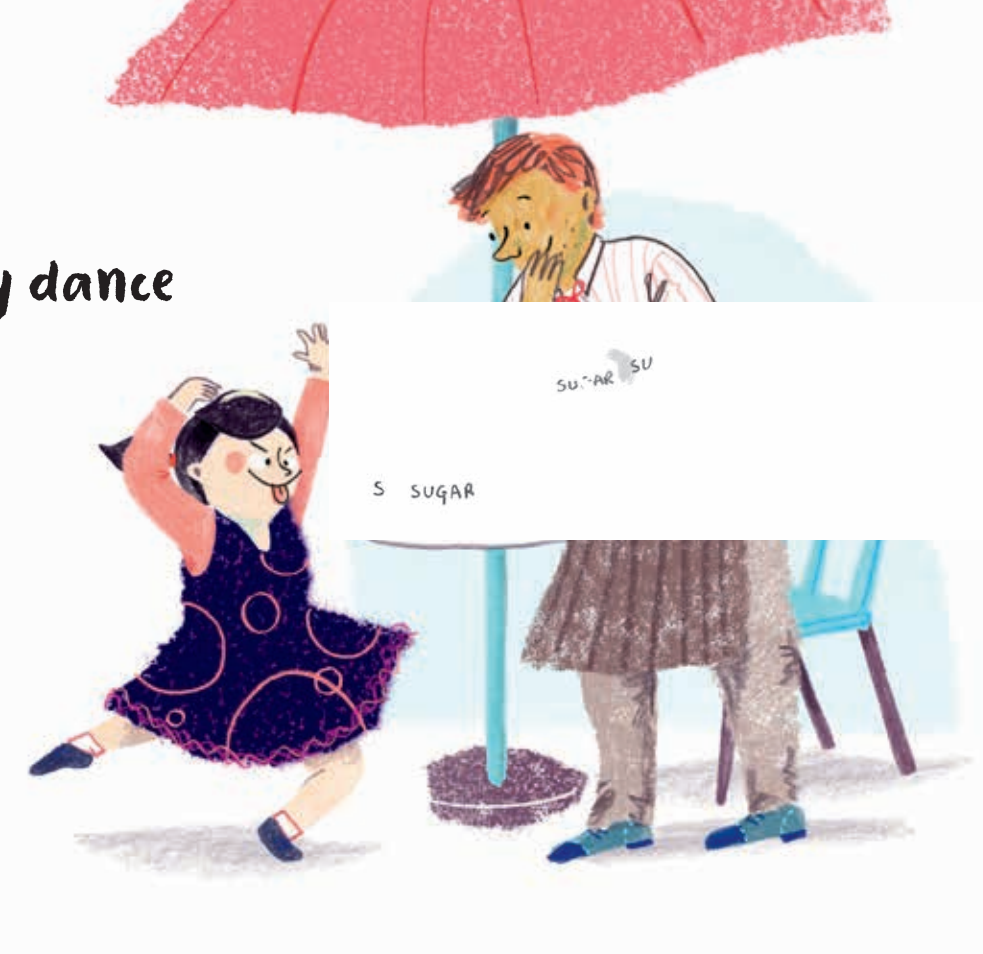
and chewed up **2** books,
