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
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



But don't worry. There are going to be some witches. And there is definitely going to be a big cauldron.






Cilla Da Spell was a witch.

King Burt has just returned from an exciting tour of the other kingdoms.


He enjoyed a day at the new fun park, the Big Widget, in the kingdom of Proud Fidget.

'It's so boring here!


Why don't I have an amusement park?' he grumbled to himself.
