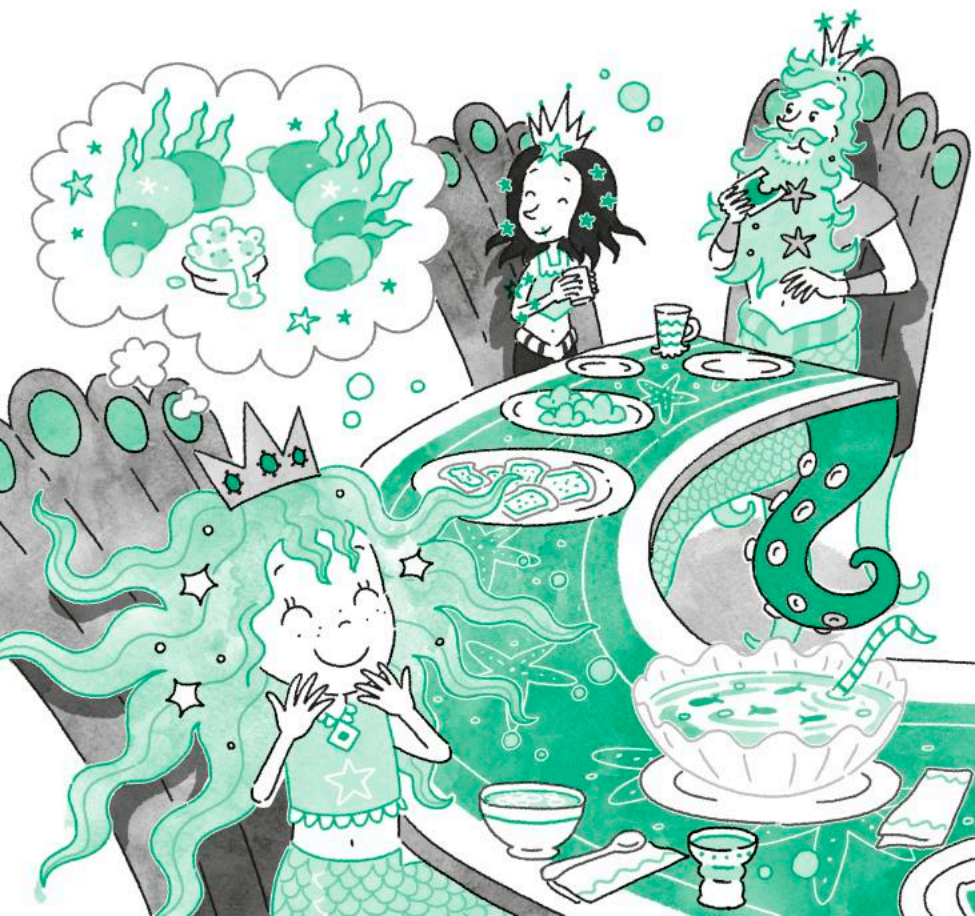


My family and I were sitting at breakfast, discussing where to go on our holidays.
