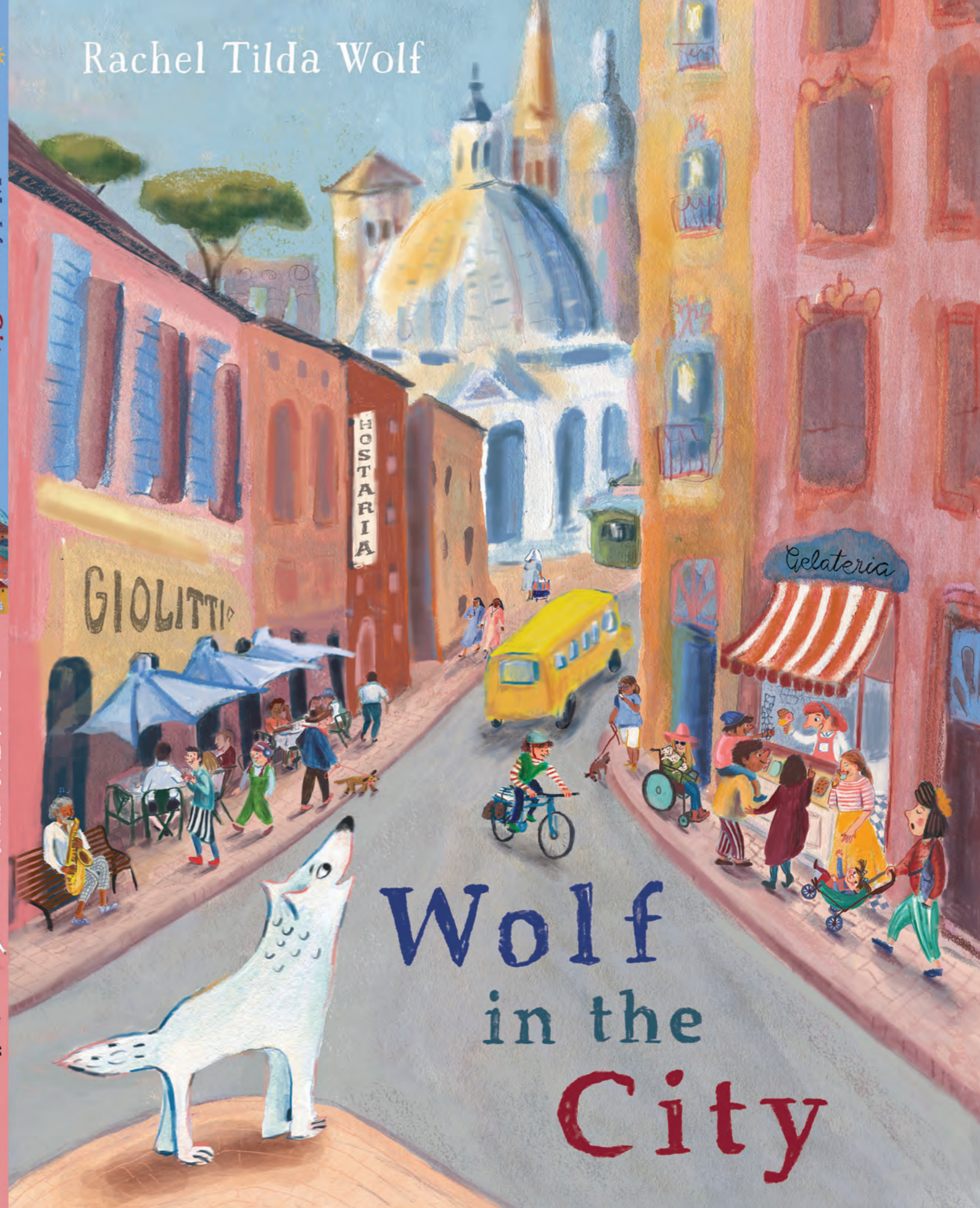

In the middle of the square lived Wolf.

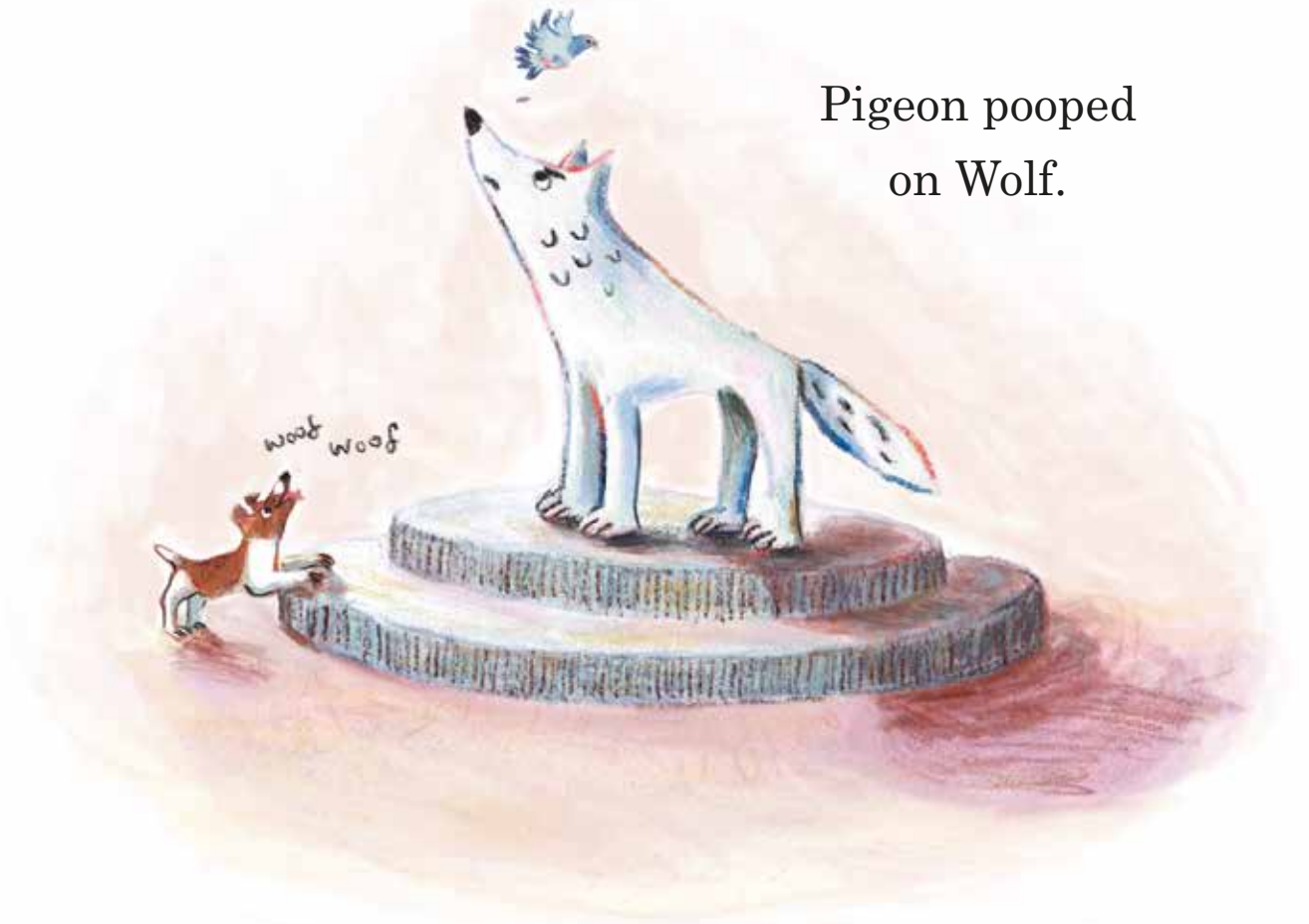


Every morning was the same: Old Edith fed the pigeons.
