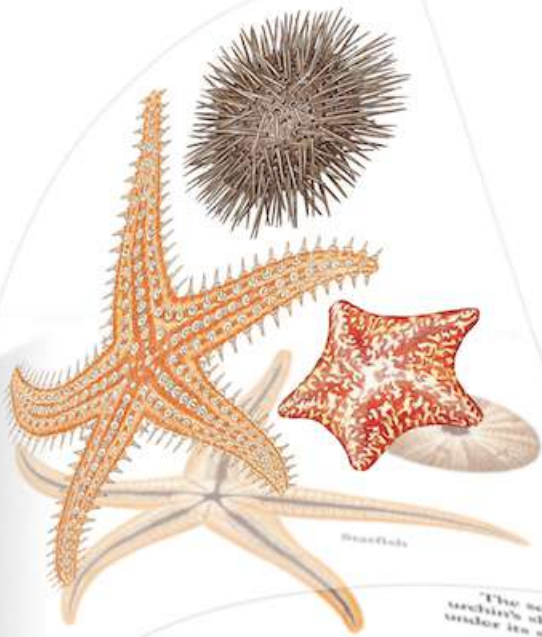

You know starfish by their long arms. The most common starfish have five.



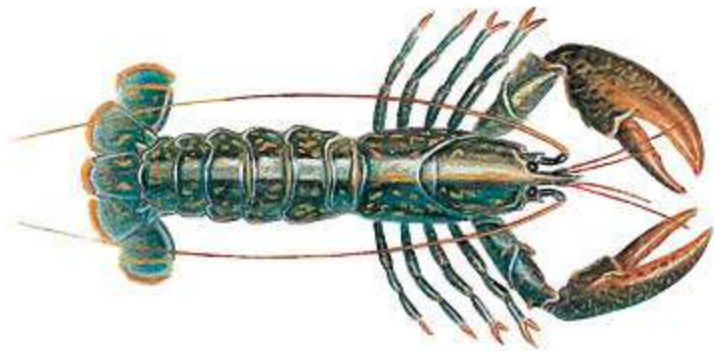
Suckers on the arms help starfish climb over things.

Squat lobster



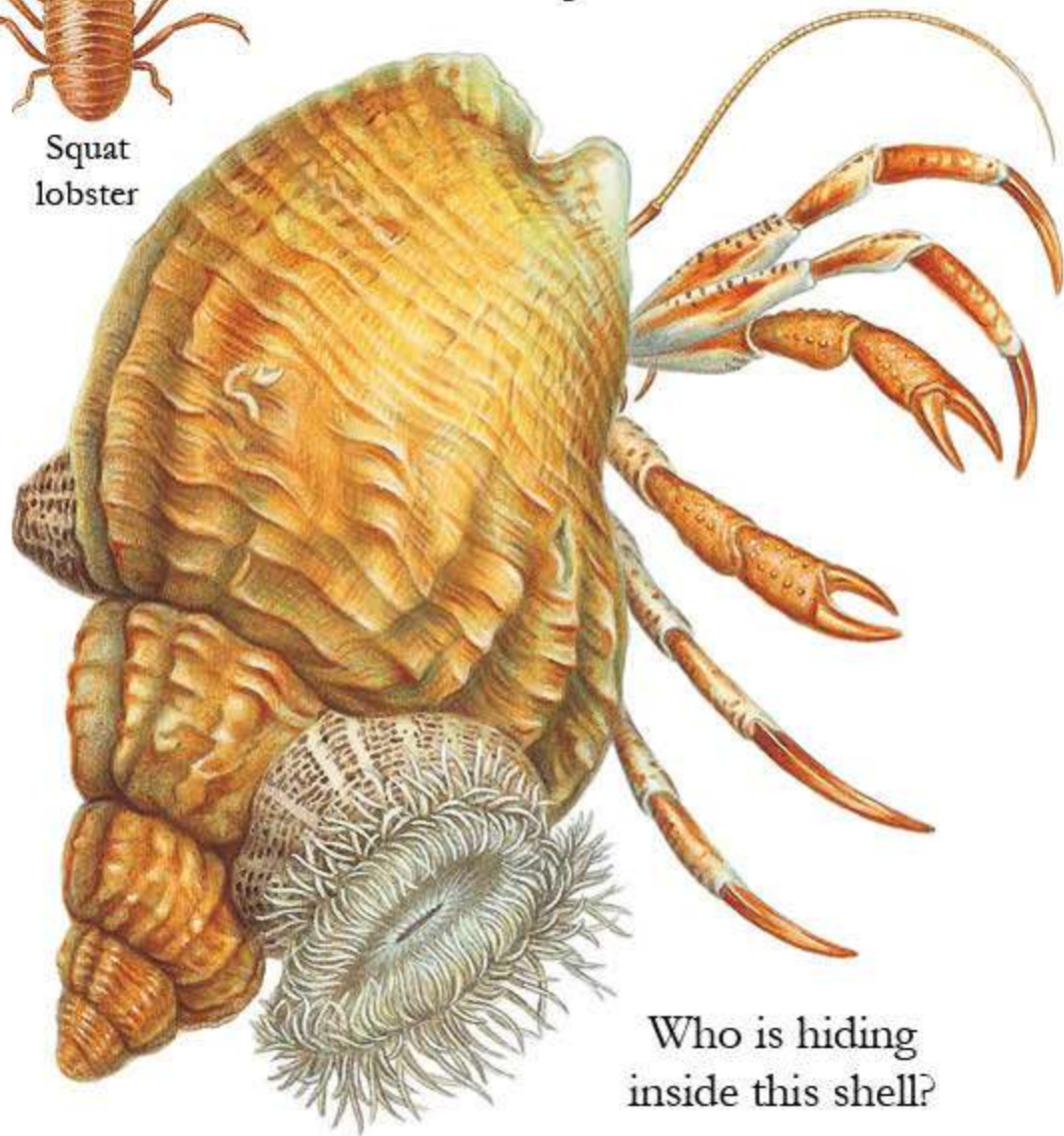
Shrimp

Who is hiding inside this shell?

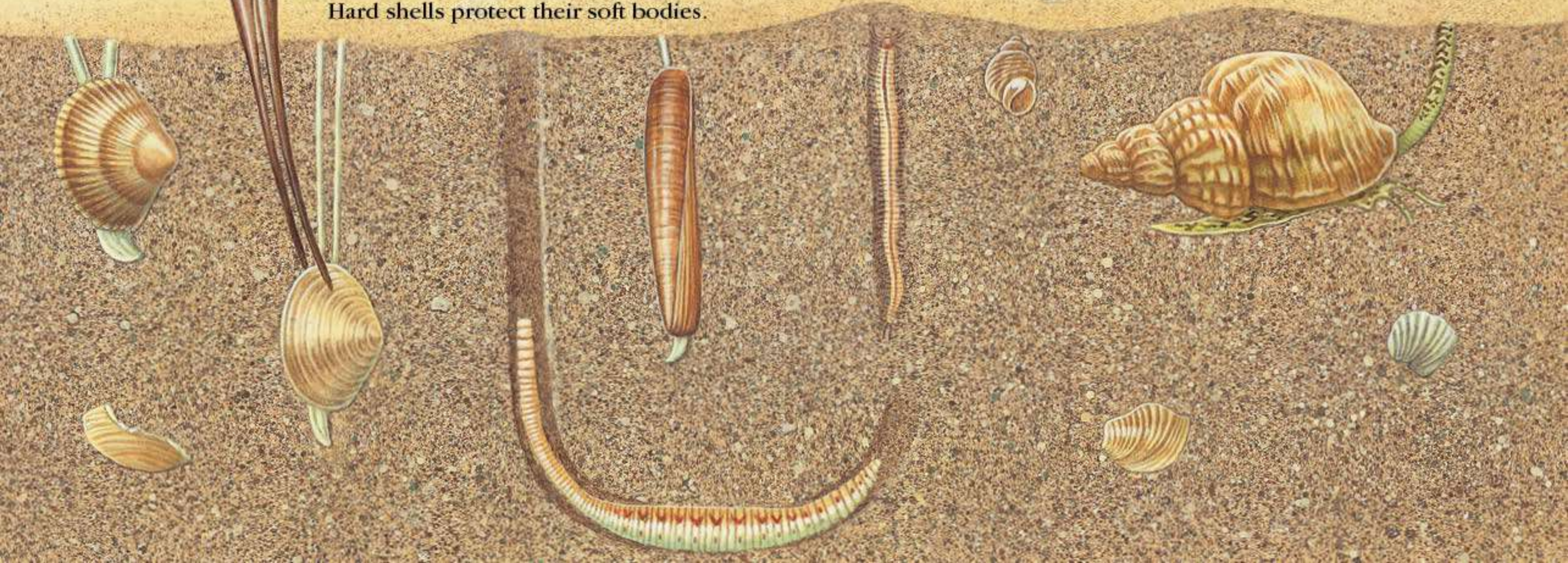
The tide is low. The shellfish dig down and hide in the wet sand.

Hard shells protect their soft bodies.

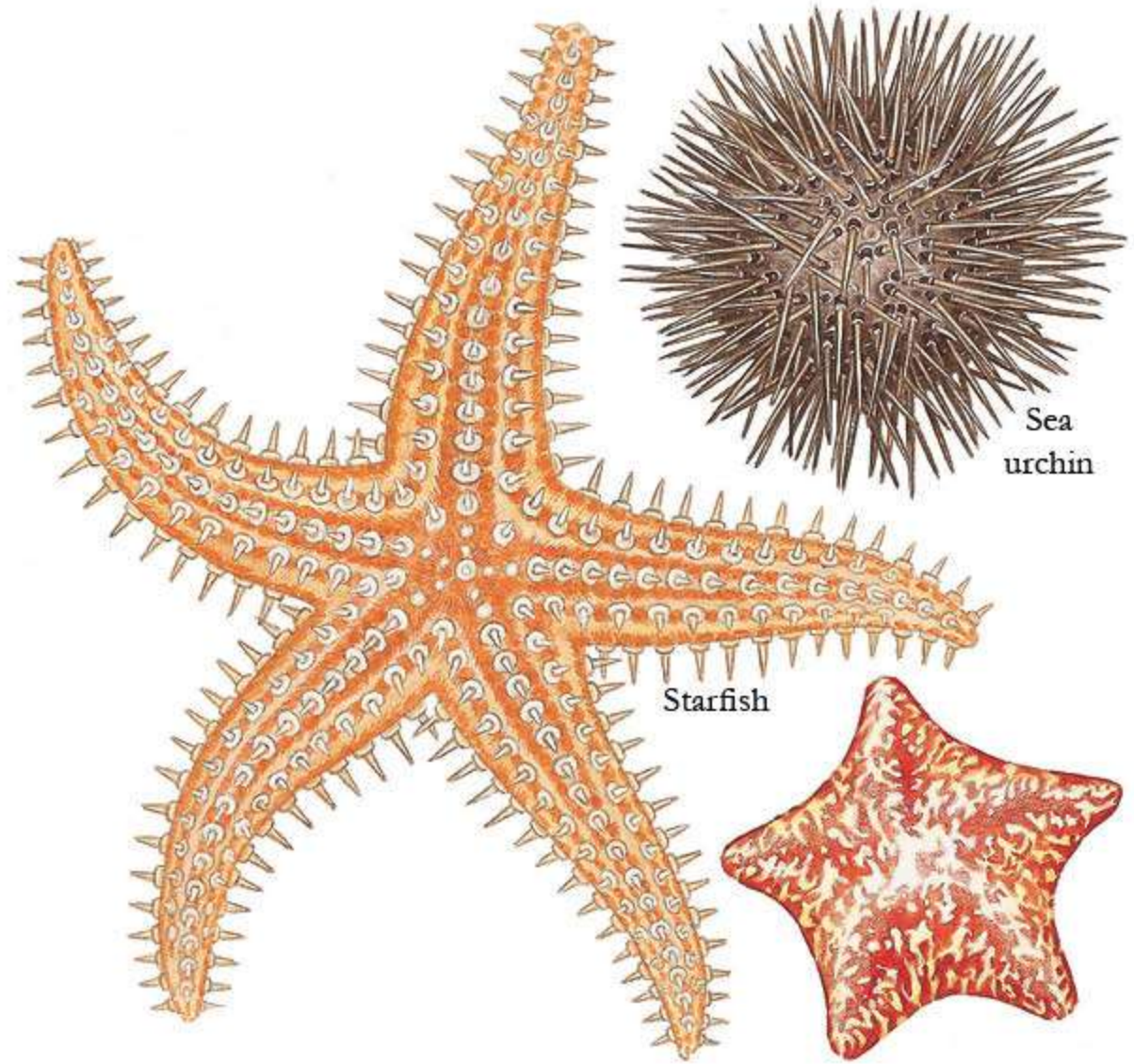
They push up tubes to breathe through.
