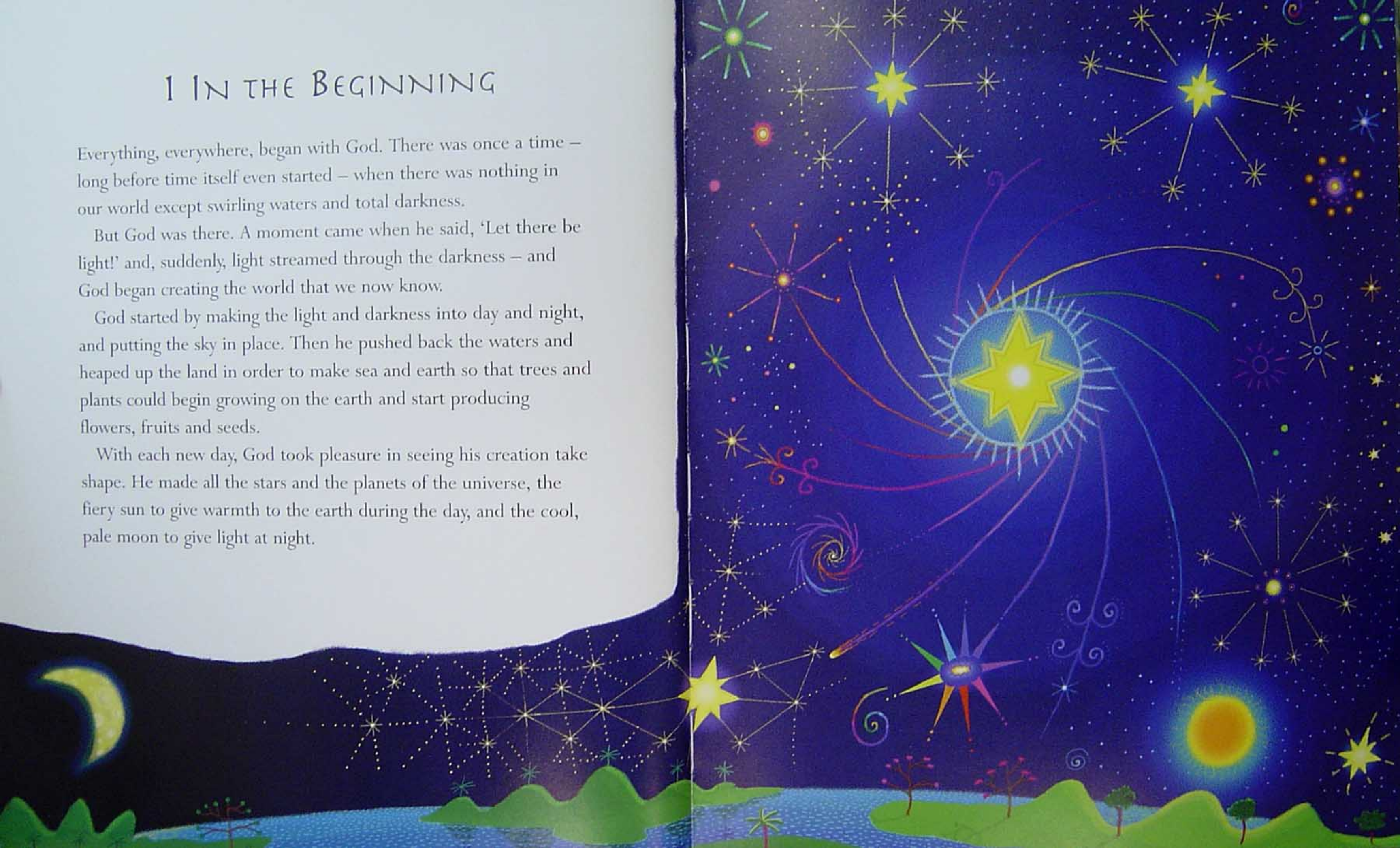
I IN THE BEGINNING
