There's even more fun to be had with the fairies in my second magical book of fairy fun. All the fairies you like are back again – Snowdrop, Ruby, Sapphire, Emerald, Star, Moonbeam, Bonnie, Goldie, Precious and Cammie (the wee man). And there are some new fairies too! There's Poppy – who is a very special fairy because she only has one wing – and her friends Daisy and Primrose, who get kidnapped in *Fairy Rescue*. And there are the fairies from *Fairy Secrets* – Myfanwy and Bronwen, who are Welsh valley fairies that ride a flying Welsh pony and whose job it is to make old toys come to life.

If you've read Fairy Rescue you'll know that from time to time all the different kinds of fairies in my books – flower fairies, tooth fairies, book fairies and dream fairies – like to get together and have fun, so that's what they do in my fairy fun book. The only trouble is that my fairy queens – Queen Mae, Queen Amethyst, Queen Celeste, Queen Eldora, Queen Flora and Queen



Lily of the Valley – sometimes argue when they get together, so I hope they won't be arguing too much about the puzzles in this book!

I often get asked if I have a favourite fairy and I always find that a really difficult question to answer because I actually have quite a few favourites! Snowdrop from Fairy Dust is special because she was the first fairy I ever wrote about, and Cammie the wee man (who doesn't really like to be called a fairy) is special too because he's based on an imaginary friend I had when I was little. Ruby from Fairy Treasure is also special because she's the only fairy I've named after a real person – a very special little girl who is the daughter of my oldest friend. (Ruby's mum and I have been friends since we were six and we used to like playing pretend games together - including ones about fairies!) But I also loved writing about Precious from Fairy Gold because she was my first naughty fairy, and Star and Moonbeam are definitely my dreamiest fairies, which makes them extra special too. So you can see why it's very hard to pick just one favourite!



If you've read my books then you might have your own favourite fairy already – or if not then maybe you'll have picked one by the time you've finished all the activities in this fairy fun book. In any case I'm sure you're going to have a great time trying out all the fairy puzzles and quizzes and other fun things to do – which are especially made for children who are as mad about fairies as I am!










Fairy Types

In Gwyneth Rees's fairy books, there are four types of fairy. Do you know what they are? Match the missing letters to the right word and write them in the spaces.




Find the Forest Fairies


The word that will appear downwards in the box is the name of a type of fairy who might appear if you sleep in a magic bed!


