I scored four times the day the scout came. His name was Mark. We all knew who he was. Everyone wanted to do well. This was Manchester United. Clubs don't come bigger than that.



George Best The Belfast Boy

- Pele said that George was the greatest footballer in the world. Maradona also thought he was one of the world's greats.
- George was born on May 22nd, 1946 in East Belfast.
- When Bob Bishop, the Manchester United scout in Belfast, saw George he sent the United manager Matt Busby a telegram. It said: "I've found you a genius."
- In six seasons George Best scored 115 goals in290 games. United won the Championship twice.



When Man U beat Benfica of Portugal 5–1 away from home in the European Cup, George came back wearing a sombrero hat. The newspapers called him 'El Beatle'.

'El' means 'the' in Spanish and they called him 'El Beatle' because now he was as great as the Beatles, the world's most famous pop group.

- ⑤ In 1968 Manchester United beat Benfica 4–1 again. George scored one of the goals.
- The same year he was voted European Player of the year.
- Sadly, George started to drink heavily and his career at United ended when he was only 26.
- George said of himself, "When I'm gone people will forget all the rubbish and all they'll remember will be the football. That'll do for me."
