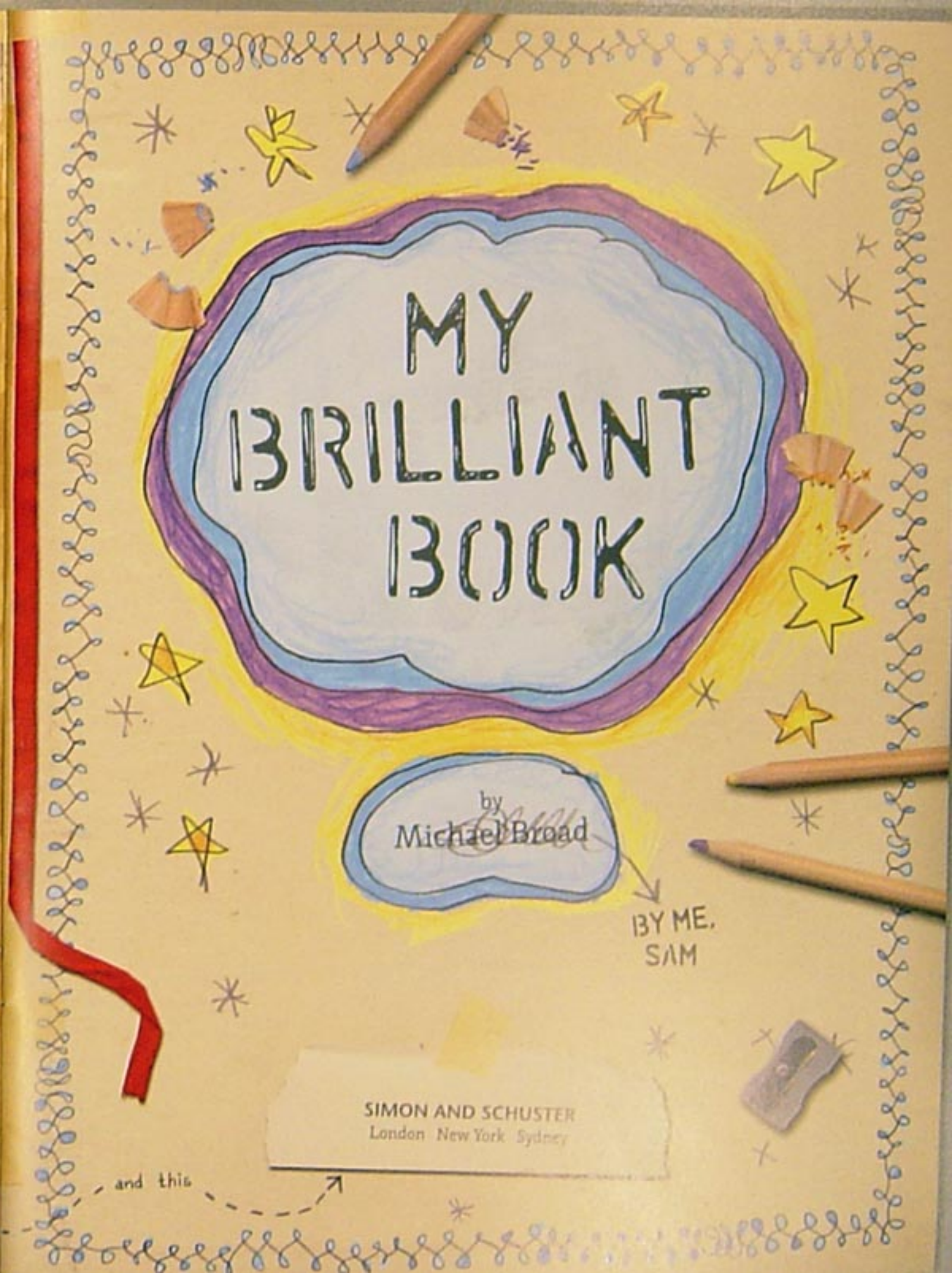

Holly waved one at me.

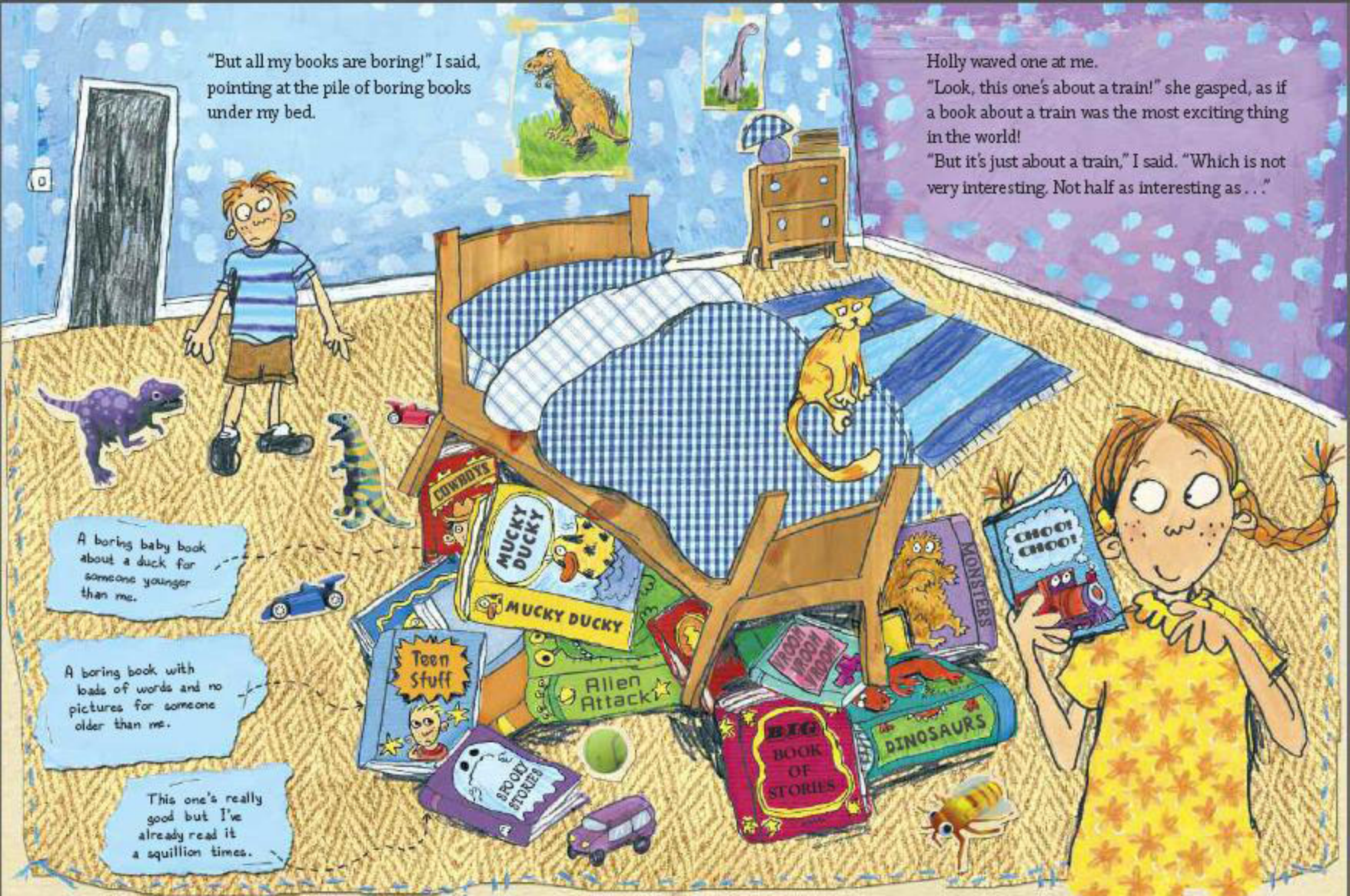
"Look, this one's about a train!" she gasped, as if a book about a train was the most exciting thing in the world!

"But it's just about a train," I said. "Which is not very interesting. Not half as interesting as..."

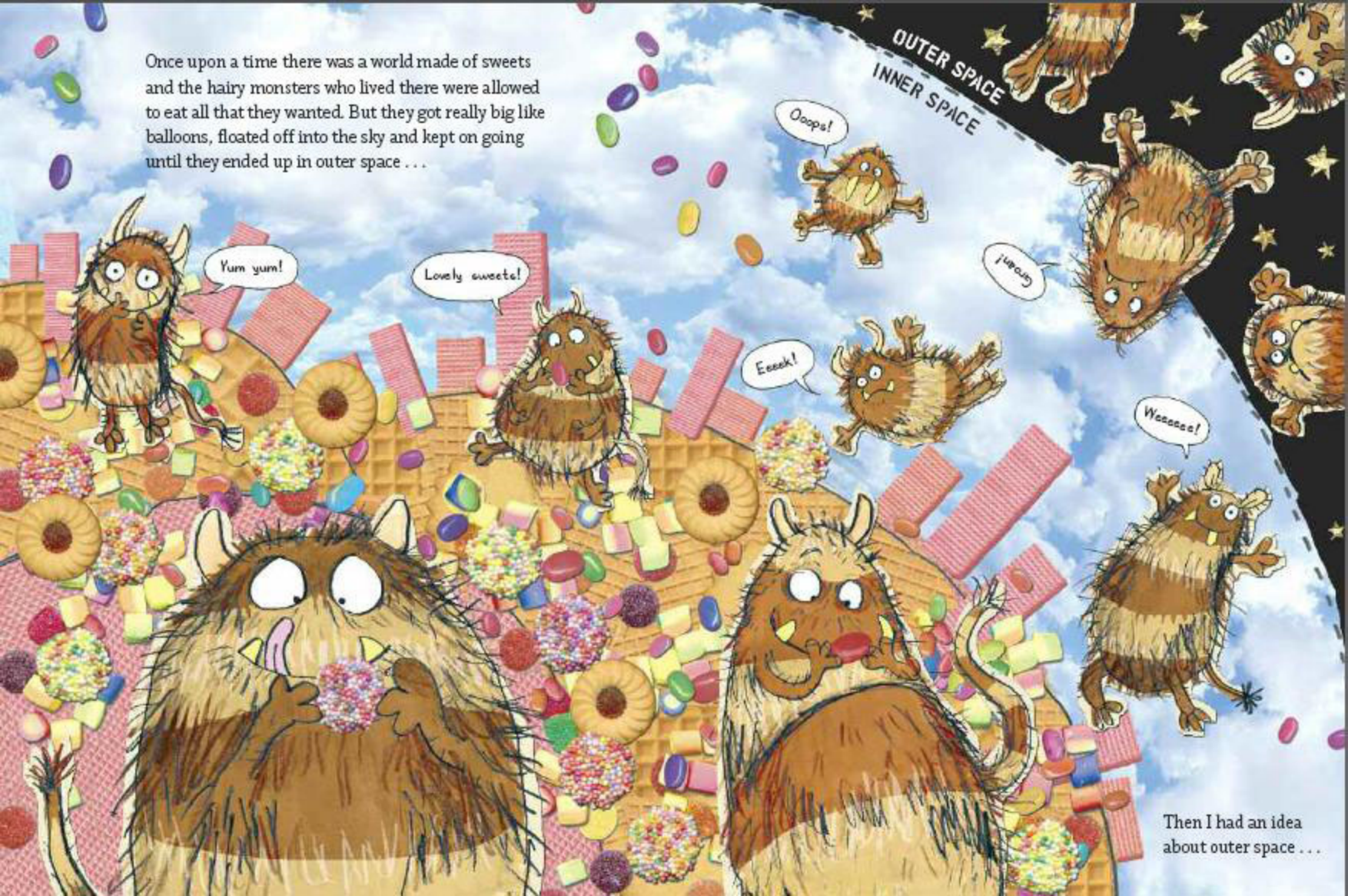
A boring baby book about a duck for someone younger than me.
