

"Hurry up, Caitlin!" Lauren went to the garden gate to look along the street. "What's keeping her? This is Saturday - Puppy Club day!"


Just then she saw Caitlin turn the corner with her little toy dog, Daisy, tucked under her arm. "Here she comes!"
