The herds are shut in byre and hut,

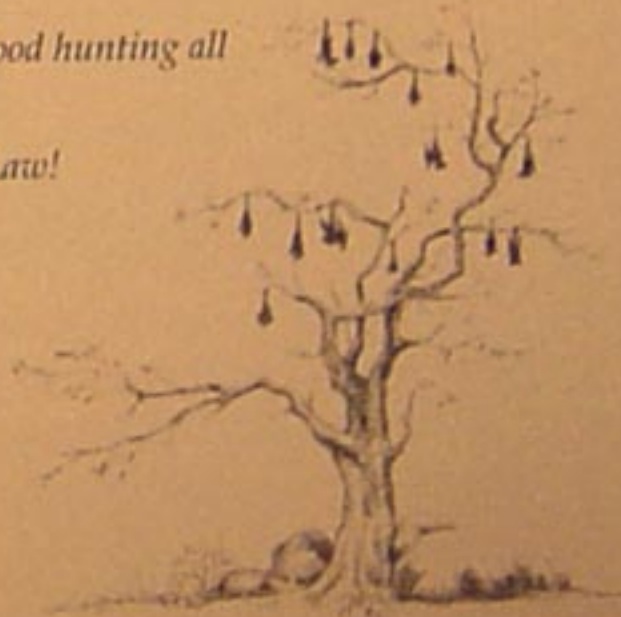
For loosed till dawn are we.
