“Yes,” agreed Megan. “Last year we learned

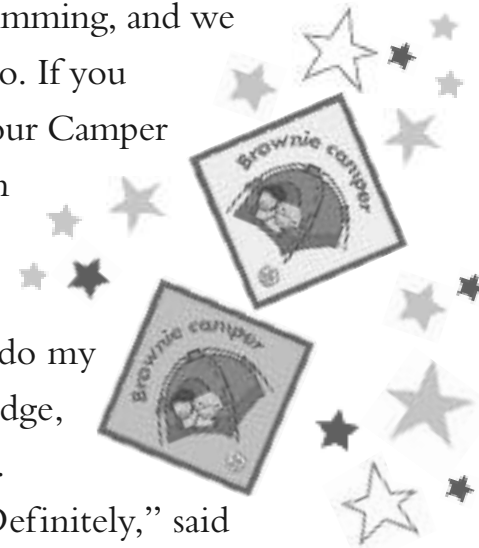
to cook, we went swimming, and we wrote camp diaries too. If you haven’t already got your Camper badge, maybe you can work on that while you’re there.”
