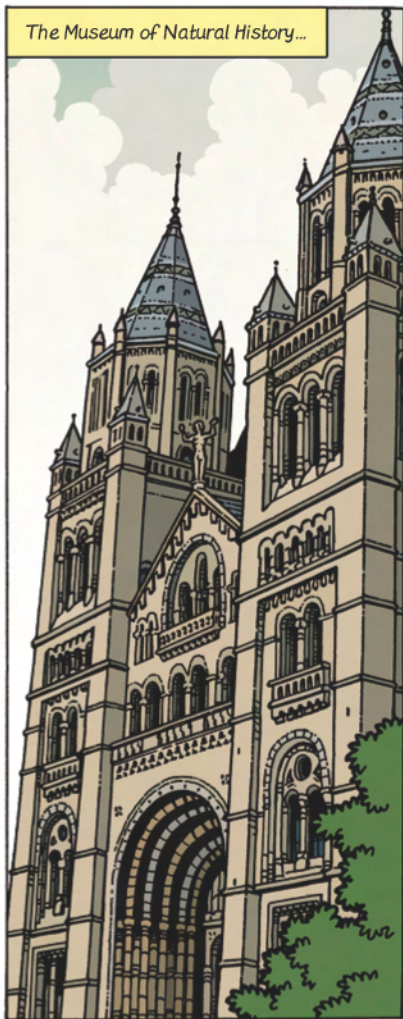

Is it dolphins in general you're interested in, or *Platanista minor*, specifically?

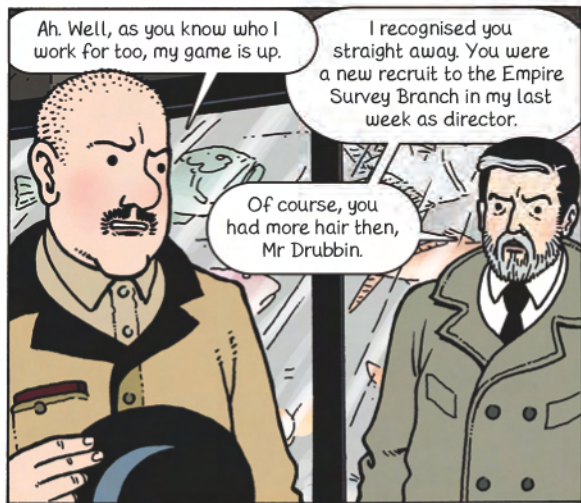


I'm sorry?
The Indus river dolphin. It's quite blind, you know, but still has an excellent sense of what's going on around it. A useful trait wouldn't you say, Mr Drubbin?

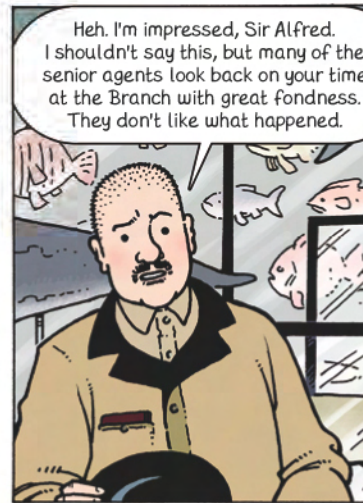


You know my name, I see, but... I don't believe I, er, know you...

No, sir. I assumed it was just another newspaper stunt.



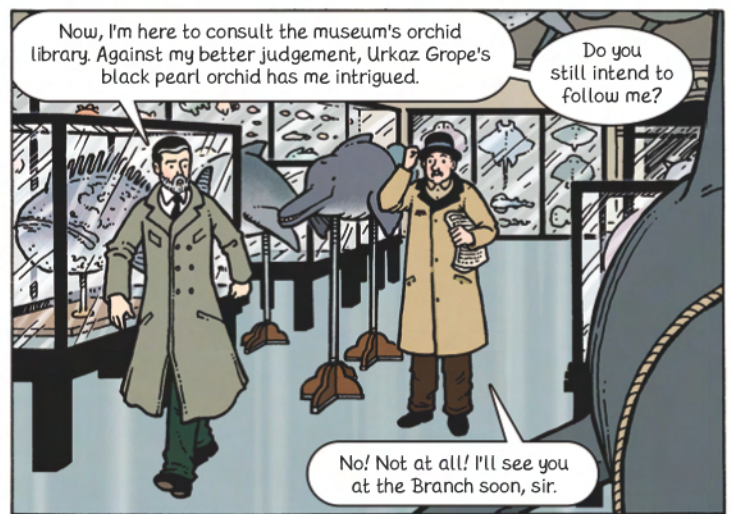
No, something's going on. Pickle's the one who stirred up this orchid business. I presume that's why Attle has you watching me, the rainbow orchid?
