“You must be fit,” he said.



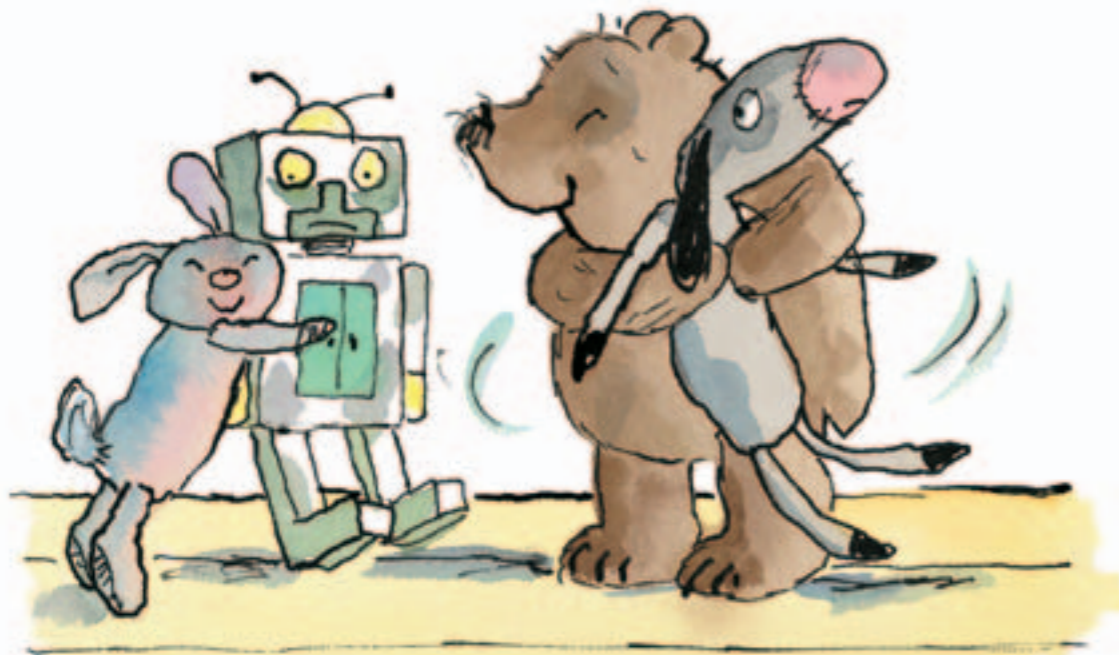
Mr Ted got all the toys to do exercises.
