All the dragons were ashamed of him. They tried and tried to make George brave, but it was no good.




Finally, they decided that George must go. He was banished from the mountain and told **never** to return again.

“Oh yes,” replied George. “All dragons are.”

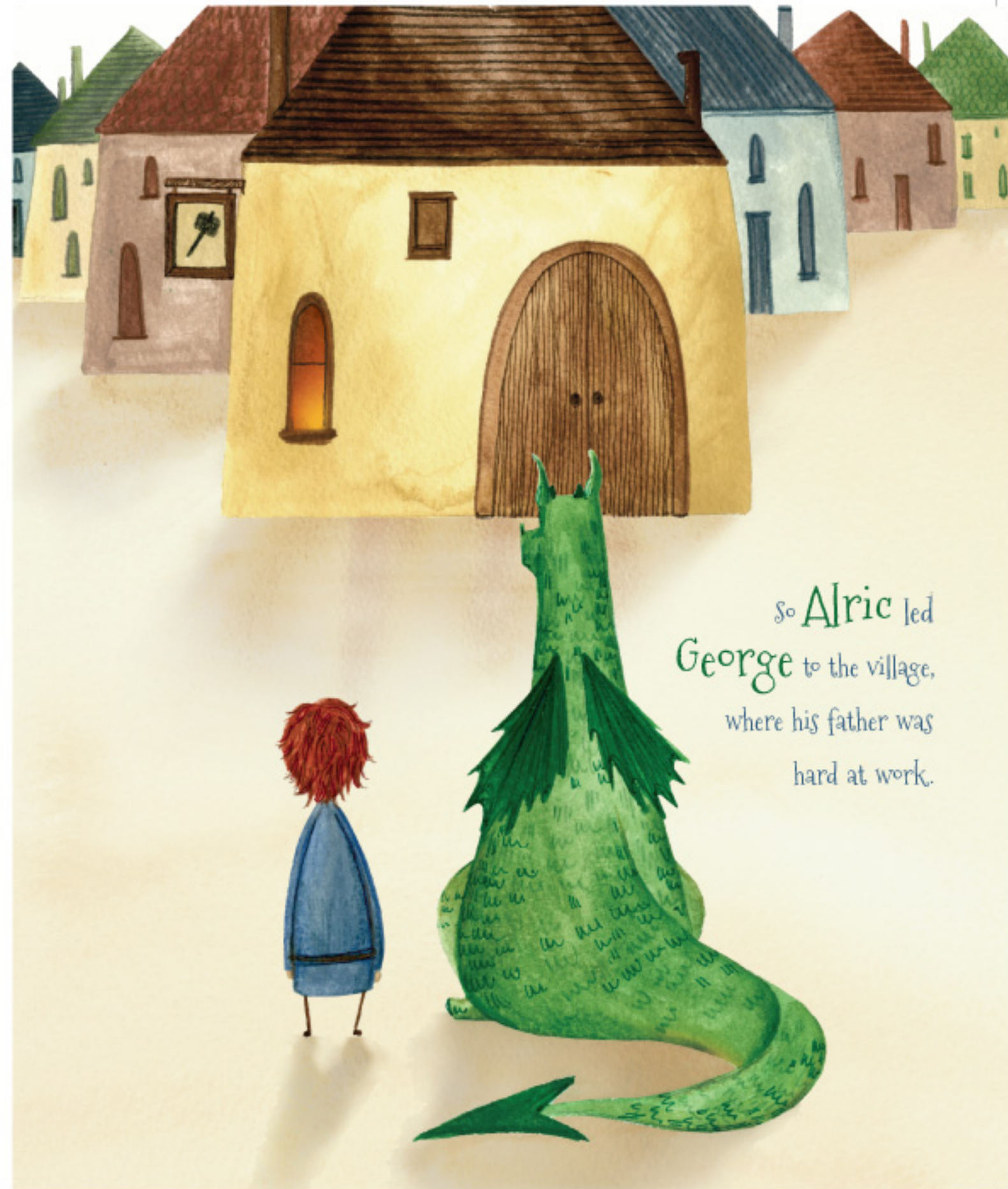
“Can you show me?” the boy urged.
