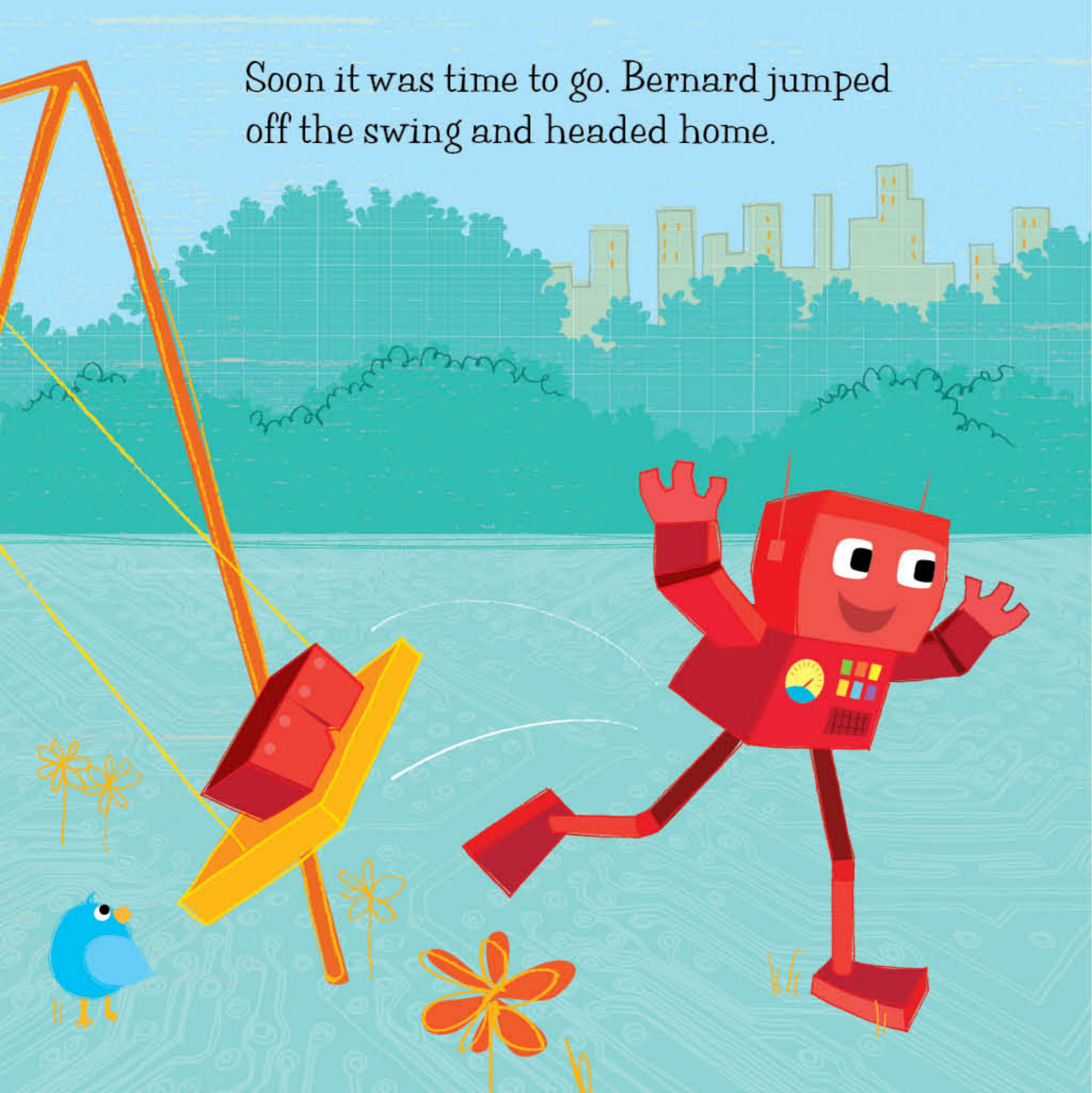
Bernard the robot loved to play at the park.

Soon it was time to go. Bernard jumped off the swing and headed home.



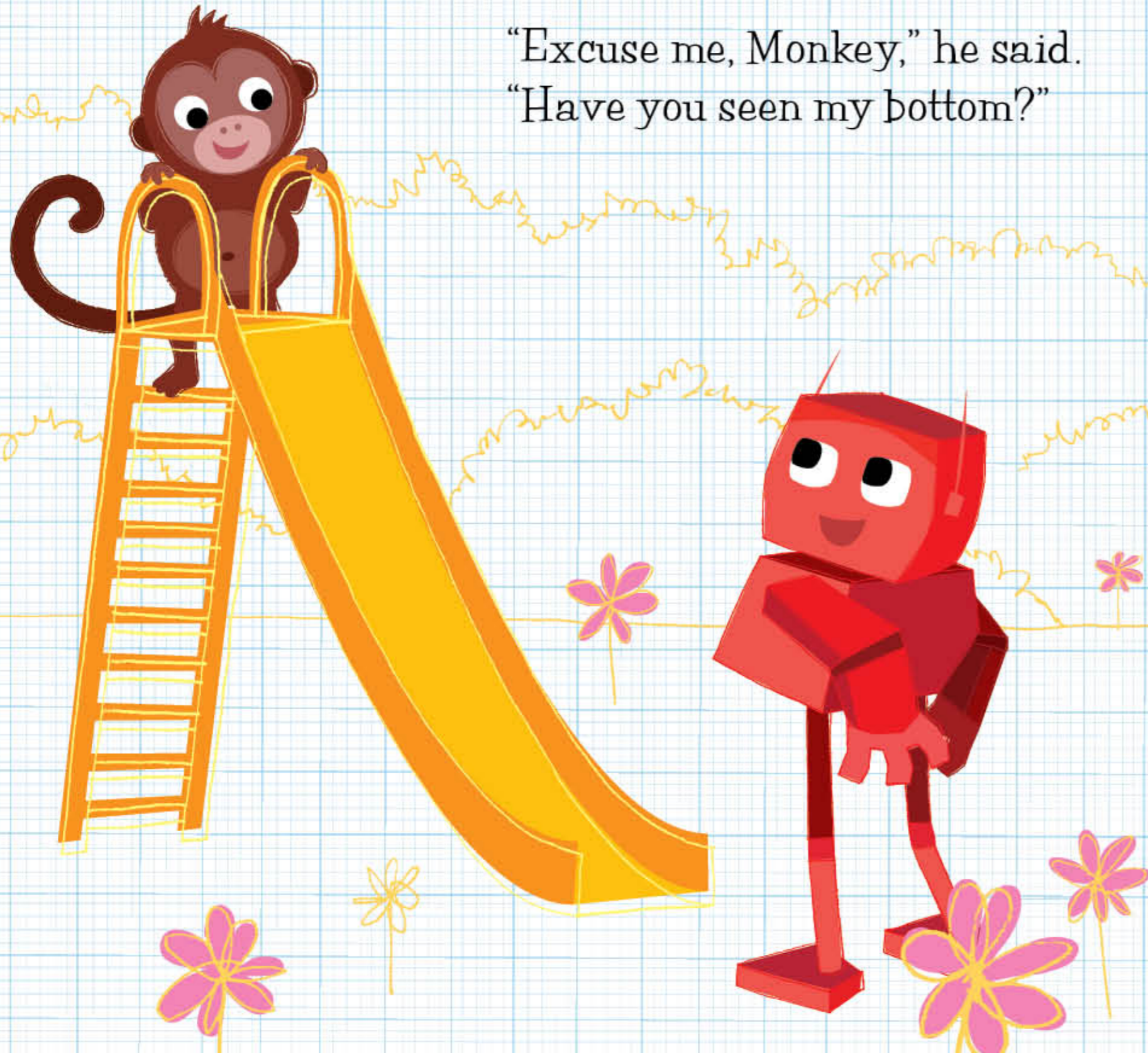
He'd only walked a little way, when . . .
