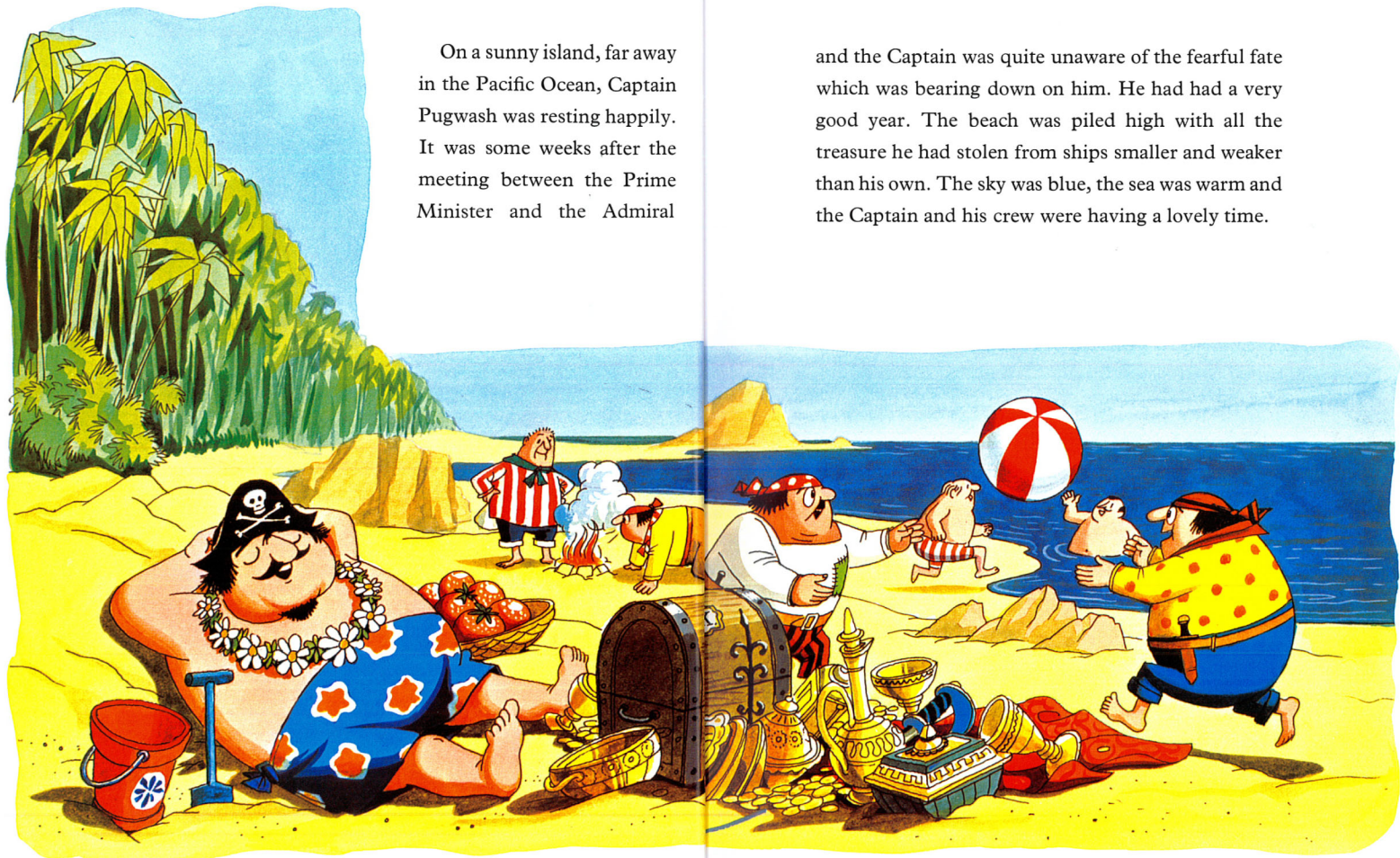
Admiral Sir Splycemeigh Maynebrace, Commander in Chief of the British Navy, stood to attention and saluted.
