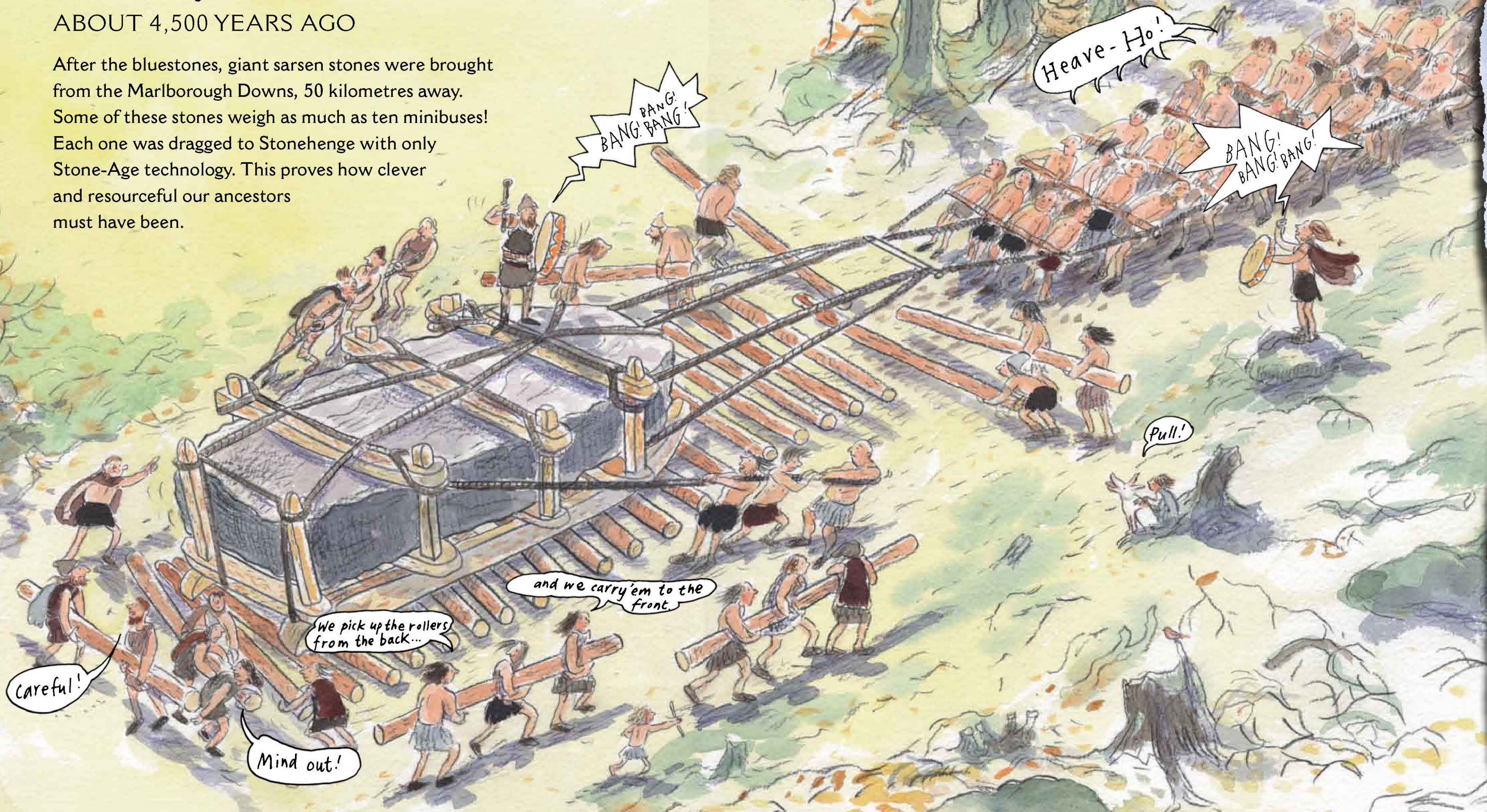




# Mighty Sarsen Stones

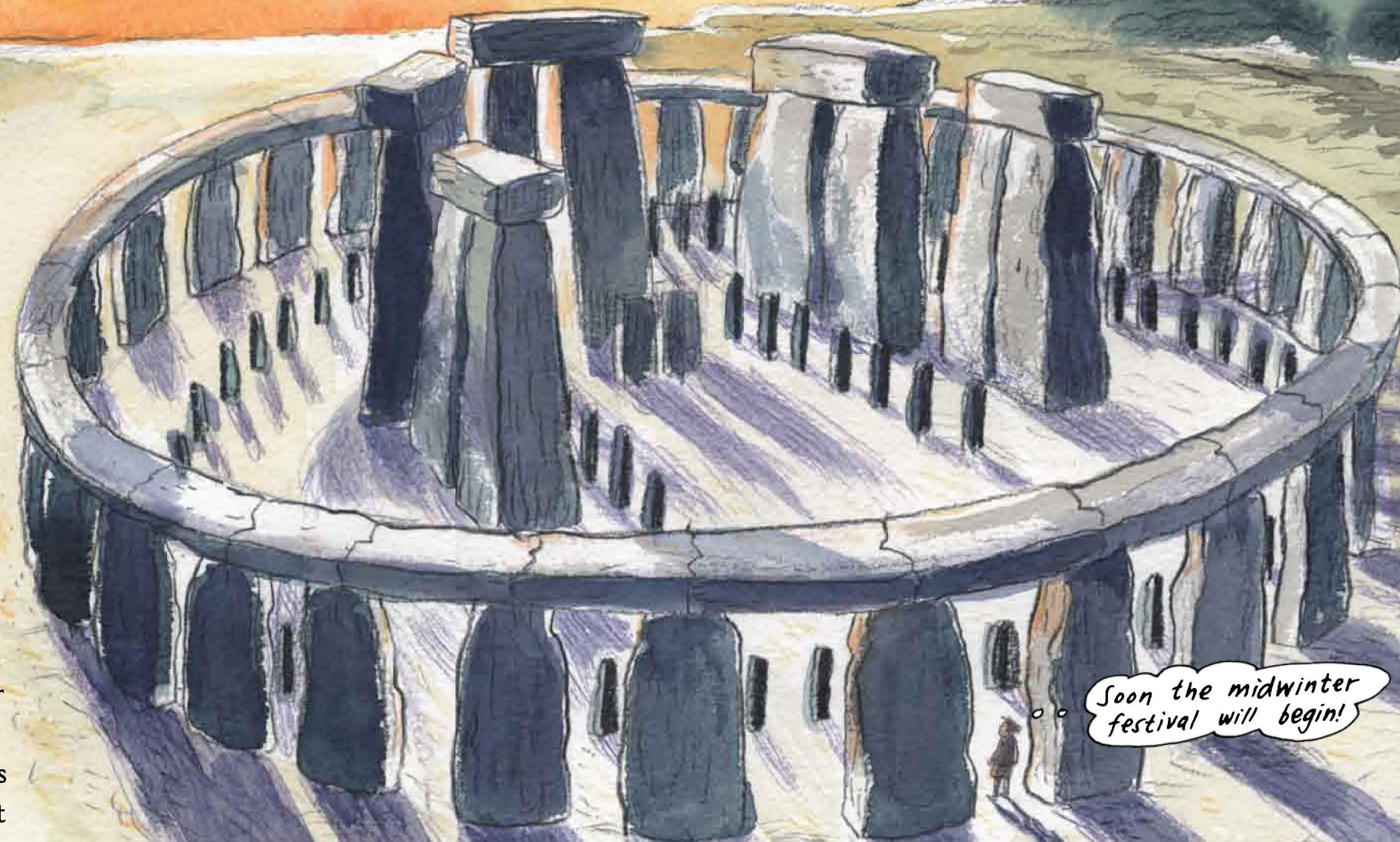

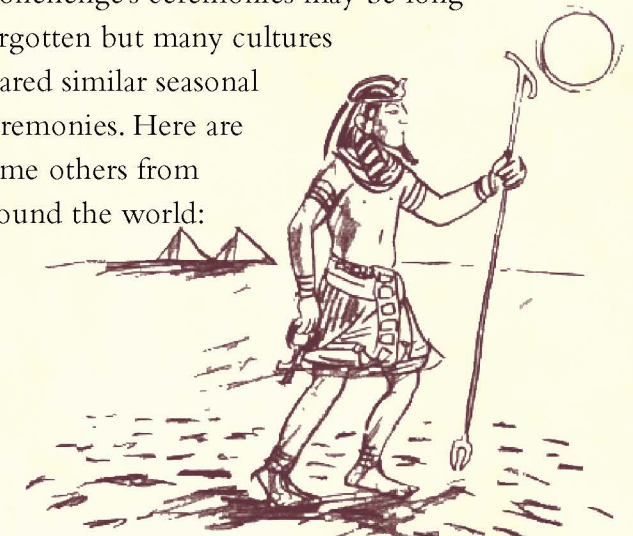
## What Sort of Ceremonies?

Such events were associated with the gods and also with practical things too, such as when to plant, harvest and slaughter. The first rays of light shining through the stones must have been a breathtaking sight back then, and it can still be seen today!

Stonehenge's ceremonies may be long forgotten but many cultures shared similar seasonal ceremonies. Here are some others from around the world:



The Ancient Egyptians held 'the ceremony of the sun's walking stick'. Native American tribes also had similar ceremonies.

The Ancient Egyptians also sacrificed pigs because they believed them to be enemies of the Sun God.



In many cultures around the world archers have fired burning arrows at the solstice sun to give it strength. Perhaps the skeletons found at Stonehenge played some part in solstice celebrations?
