HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

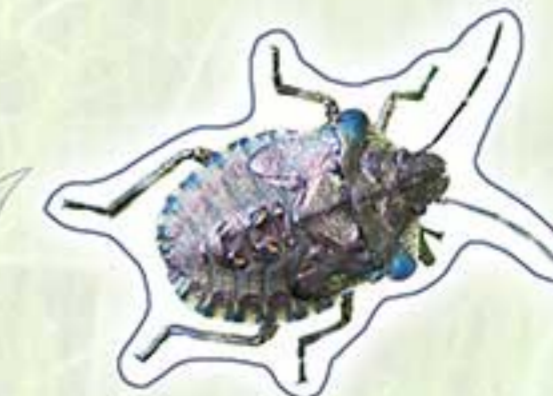
Gardens are busy places, full of animals looking for food and bringing up their families. Many of them are hard to see and some only come out at night. Use this guide to...
