NTRODUCTION

Lelcome to Steampunk - an artform that explores what the world might have been like if history had taken a slightly different turn. Taking its inspiration from a 19th-century view of the future, Steampunk shows us a world of high technology, but powered by steam and clockwork. It takes the fantastic ideas of writers such as Jules Verne and H. G. Wells, and updates them for the modern age. Futuristic equipment made of cast iron and brass, mahogany and leather, has a character that today's plastics and electronics can never achieve.

This book introduces you to some of the ingenious gentlemen and indomitable ladies who inhabit the world of Steampunk. Before you draw a character, take a moment to consider what kind of person they are and what kind of story they have to tell...



RAWING TOOLS

ou don't need a vast range of equipment for your Steampunk drawings - the pencil is your most versatile tool. But experiment with different ways of making marks, and find out what suits you. Here are some possibilities worth exploring.





Tone

Using tone (shading) makes your drawings look more realistic and three-dimensional. The darkest areas can be inked in solidly, leaving the lightest parts ink-free. Use hatching for midtones and cross-hatching for darker tones.



Cross-hatching Hatching

Felt-tips are great for filling in areas of flat tone.

Dramatic use of light and dark tones is called chiaroscuro - an Italian word for 'light-dark'.



Pencils come in different grades, ranging from fine greys to soft, deep blacks.

Hard pencils are usually graded from H to 6H (the hardest). Soft pencils are graded from B to 9B (the softest and blackest).

HB pencils are between H and B. They are ideal for general sketching, but experiment with different grades of pencils and explore the range of tones they can produce.

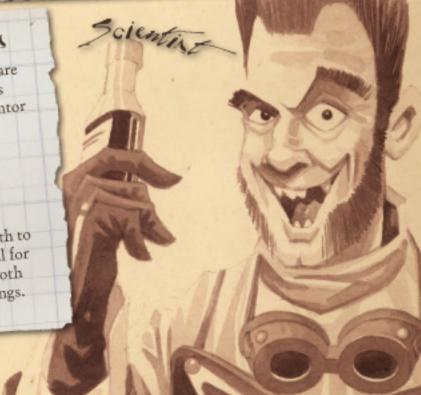
Draughtmen's pem

Draughtsmen's pens and art pens are ideal for creating fine, regular lines and surface texture, as in the Inventor portrait opposite. Pen nibs are available in a variety of widths.

Paper surfaces

Paper textures range from smooth to very rough. Rough paper is ideal for use with charcoal, whereas smooth paper is best for fine line drawings.

The Scientist portrait is constructed from washes of ink diluted to different shades.

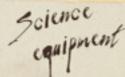

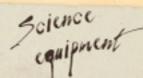

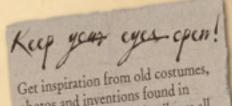
