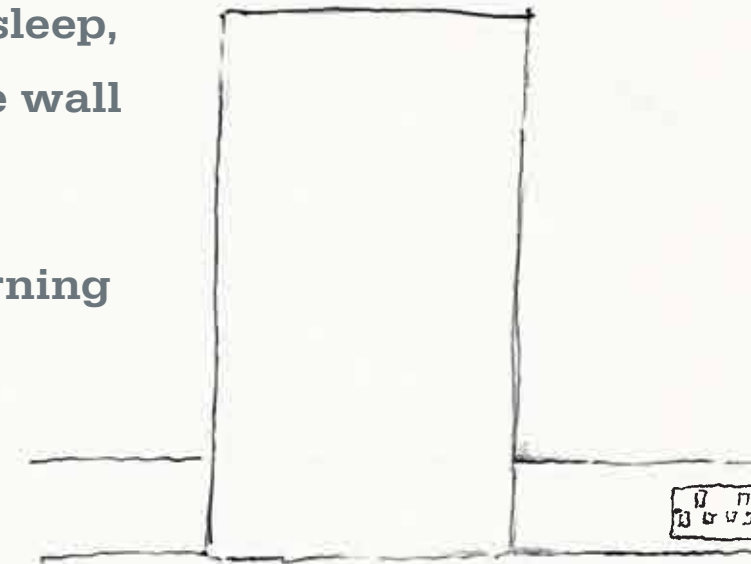

and forgot about the door until bedtime.**

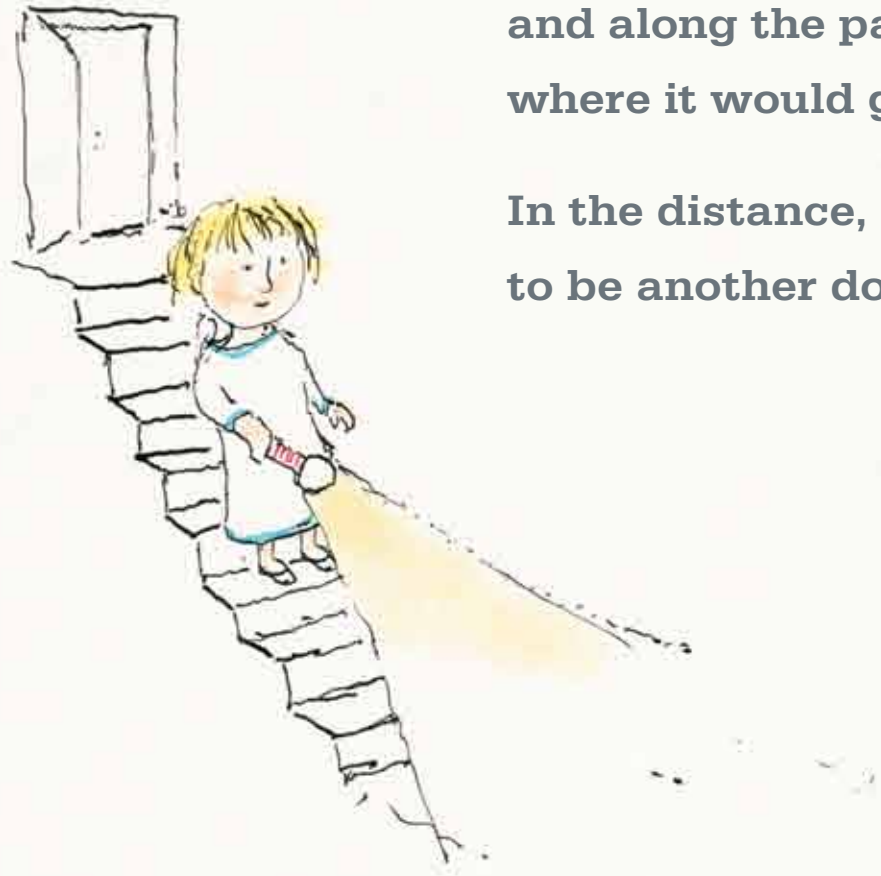


**When Sylvie was ready for bed

and beyond there was a passage.**



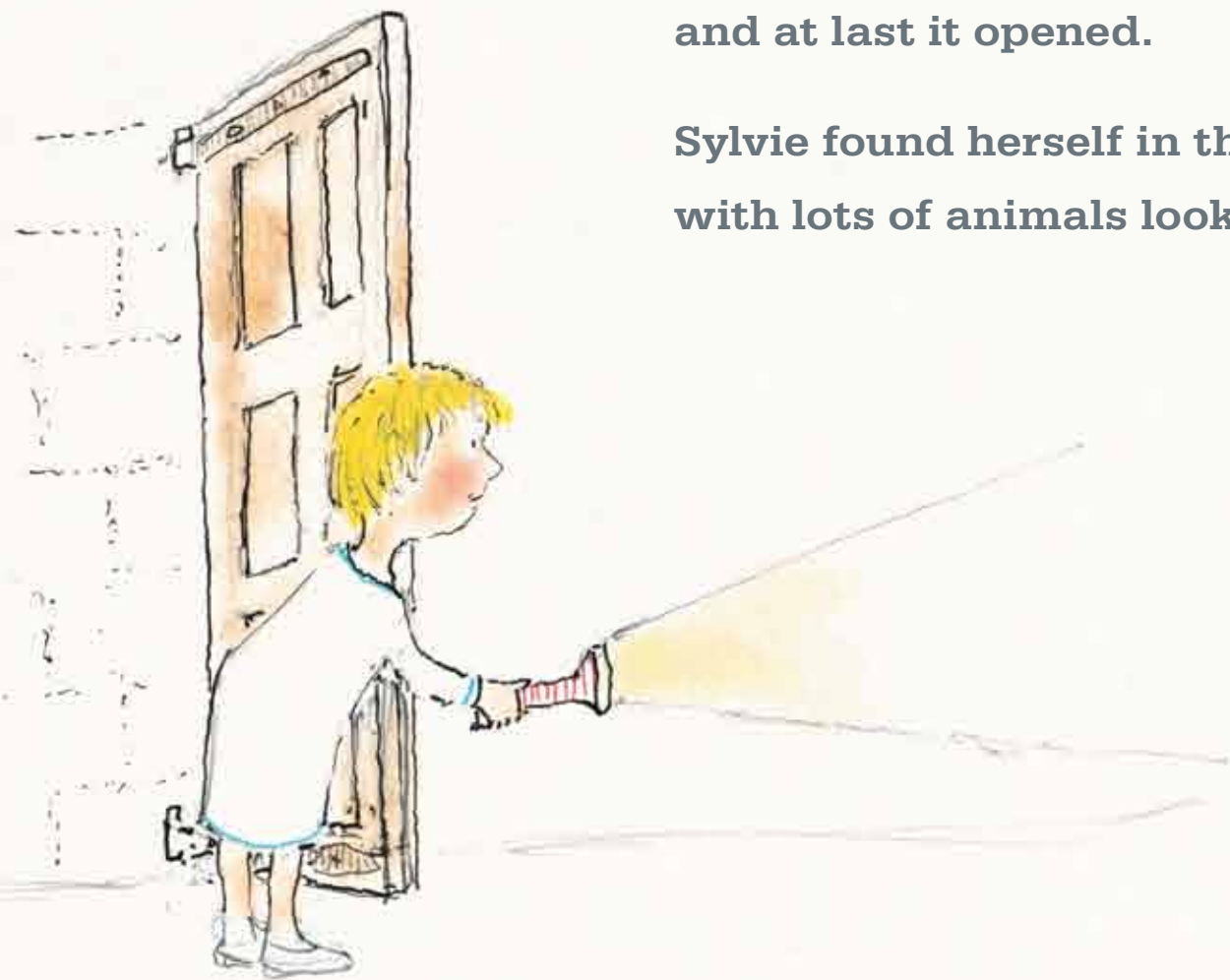
Sylvie found the torch and went down the steps and along the passage for a while, wondering where it would go to.
